## NEW ZEALANDER FRONT AND CENTRE IN TRIPLE CROWN GLORY

Cambridge bloodstock agent Michael Wallace has played a prominent role in American racing history with the win of **Justify** (Scat Daddy) in Sunday's (NZ time) Gr.1 Belmont Stakes (2400m).

The unbeaten three-year-old son of the ill-fated US sire Scat Daddy became just the 13th winner of America's famed Triple Crown, having won the Gr.1 Kentucky Derby (2000m) on 5 May and backed that victory up in the Gr.1 Preakness Stakes (1900m) later in the month.

Trained by the legendary Bob Baffert and ridden by Mike Smith, Justify was purchased at the 2016 Keeneland September Yearling Sale for the China Horse Club & Maverick Racing for \$500,000 by their buying team that consists of Wallace, the China Horse Club's racing and bloodstock manager, along with Mick Flanagan and Tom Ryan of SF Bloodstock.

Owned by WinStar Farm, China Horse Club, Starlight Racing and Head of Plains Partners, Justify led from wire-to-wire in the Belmont to defeat Gronkowski (Lonhro) by just on two lengths with Hofburg (Tapit) back in third.

It was the second Triple Crown for Baffert who broke a 37-year hoodoo with American Pharoah (Pioneer Of The Nile) in 2015 who became the first horse since Affirmed (Exclusive Native) in 1978 to take out the Triple Crown.

"I wanted to see that horse's name up there because we know he was brilliant from Day 1," Baffert said. "And I am so happy for Mike Smith. There is no more deserving (jockey) than him."

Wallace was still pinching himself hours after the race as the team around Justify set out to celebrate the unique achievement.

"It is such a surreal feeling and one that I'm still trying to take in," he said.

"The crowd was in excess of 100,000 so the noise was unbelievable and when they started to roar as he got near the finish it just got even louder.

"After the race so many people wanted to shake your hand

and congratulate you. It's an experience I will never forget and will be hard to top in the future.

"To become just the 13th winner of the Triple Crown is amazing and even more special is the fact that he is only the second Triple Crown winner to be bought at public auction after Seattle Slew in 1977."

Justify is one of only two horses to have won the Triple Crown while having been undefeated in any previous race; the other is Seattle Slew (Bold Reasoning) who features in the pedigree of Justify through his dam Stage Magic (Ghostzapper).

Justify has won all six of his career starts, four at Grade One level. Remarkably, Justify did not have his first start until February 18th this year and has quickly become the pin-up horse of American racing.

# THREE FOR INJURED PIKE AT SUNSHINE COAST



Capable three-year-old *(The) Bostonian* returned to winning from at the Sunshine Coast on Sunday

Cambridge trainer Tony Pike enjoyed a red-letter day at the Sunshine Coast on Sunday with a winning treble that included victory in the feature race, the Listed Kirin Daybreak Lover (1200m), with **The Bostonian (NZ)** (Jimmy Choux).

Pike was delighted with the performance of his team although disappointed he couldn't be on-course to take in the action after opting to stay

in New Zealand to get an issue with his wrist fixed.

"I busted my wrist a couple of weeks ago and it needs a plate to be inserted in it," he explained.

"They had me scheduled for surgery on Saturday so I decided I'd better get it done and cancelled my flight to Australia.

"As it turned out I went into hospital and had to come home again as there

was an issue that meant my surgery was cancelled and will have to be rescheduled.

"All I could do was head home and watch the racing on TV."

What Pike saw pleased him immensely as *The Bostonian* overcame a frustrating few weeks to score a narrow victory, his second at stakes level after taking out a Listed event

at Hastings last September before finishing second in the Gr.2 Hawkes Bay Guineas (1400m).

"It's fairly well documented we've had some issues with him over there with wide draws and the like," he said.

"I'm just delighted for his connections as we all know he has plenty of ability and he deserved to be able to show that.

"Now he's got that run under his belt we can press on with him to the Sunshine Coast Guineas at the end of the month."

Also headed down a similar path is fellow three-year-old Sacred Rebel (Sepoy) who scored in a low-grade 1200m earlier in the day.

"Sacred Rebel had been trialling brilliantly of late but with his aversion to wet tracks there was nothing for him

here at home," said Pike.

"We decided to roll the dice and head to Brisbane and as luck would have it he struck a wet track again. Luckily it wasn't a great field and he has done enough to get a win.

"He will have another run at Doomben in a fortnight and then will tackle the Sunshine Coast Guineas as well as long as he can get a decent track."

Pike was also left ruing a missed opportunity with staying filly Terra Sancta (NZ) (Pierro) who won over 1800m after missing a start in Saturday's Gr.1 Queensland Derby (2200m).

"She is thriving on her trip and was very unlucky not to finish closer than sixth in the Queensland Oaks at her last start," he said.

"I was hoping she might sneak into the Derby on Saturday as she would have been a great chance with a little luck. As it was she couldn't make the field but got a consolation prize today.

"We're going to have to look around and see what else is coming up as the way she is going I think she can snatch another win at short notice."

# UNDERTHEMOONLIGHT TO TAKE WELL-WORN PATH TO GROUP ONE TARGET

An aborted attempt at a Brisbane Group One feature will play in the favour of local race fans when classy mare **Underthemoonlight (NZ)** (El Hermano) heads to Tauranga in a fortnight to defend her Listed Woburn Farm Classic (1400m) crown.

The underrated El Hermano mare overcame topweight of 60kgs and a handy field to score a courageous win over 1400m at Te Rapa on Saturday. The victory has part-owner Hamish McQuade looking forward to the Tauranga challenge although thinking about what might have been with slightly better timing.

"That was a top win on Saturday as we thought she still might have been a run short and she had to give the rest of them weight as well," he said.

"I guess her affinity with Te Rapa played in her favour and the fact is that she is a pretty classy mare. She can be underrated at times and people do want to pigeon hole her as a wet-tracker, but she really goes best when there is just some cut in the ground.

"Saturday's track was perfect for her and she showed her class although she got tired in the last 100m.

"We had wanted her to run a week earlier as we did have plans to take her to Brisbane for the Tatts Tiara, but the timing just didn't work out, so she will stay here now and focus on a local campaign,"

Central in McQuade and wife

Karyn's plans for the mare include a return to Hastings for another shot at Group One glory after she finished an unlucky third in the 2017 edition of the Tarzino Trophy (1400m) last September.

"She will go to Tauranga in a fortnight for the fillies and mares race that she won last year and then have a wee break," said McQuade.

"We will bring her back for the Foxbridge Plate at Te Rapa, a race she also won last year, and then on

to the Tarzino Trophy at Hastings.

"It was a pretty rough affair in the Tarzino last year and we copped some flak over the interference in the race.

"Personally, I thought she and Cameron (rider Cameron Lammas) were a victim of circumstances and she was unlucky not to win it, so it would be nice to go back and get a win in the race this time around.

"While she is a rising seven-year-old she is lightly raced and didn't start until she was four. We think she still has plenty left in her so a

Group One win would be a great result and one she might just deserve."

# ZANYETTA CAPS BIG DAY FOR BAKER-FORSMAN TEAM

A well-deserved victory for progressive mare **Zanyetta (NZ)** (Tavistock) was one of the highlights for co-trainer Andrew Forsman on the weekend as he and senior partner Murray Baker added a further four victories to their already record-breaking season.

Although Forsman was at Doomben on Saturday with talented three-year-old Karisto (Written Tycoon), he managed to keep tabs on the New Zealand team's performance which saw them take out the feature sprint at Trentham with New York Minute (NZ) (Iffraaj) along with three races at Te Rapa

including the Listed Ssanyong Auckland Futurity Stakes (1400m) with Peaceful (NZ) (Savabeel).

The victory of Zanyetta was one that grabbed his attention though as the Tavistock four-year-old dashed away from a handy field of rating 85 stayers over 2100m to register her fourth career victory.

"I was really taken by the performance of Zanyetta as it was a just reward for the consistency she has displayed in this campaign," he said.

"Leading into the race I did think her stablemate Rodrico could have been a slightly better prospect but she put him and the rest of them away fairly comprehensively in the end.

"She has really developed this time in so hopefully there is more to come with her.

"She doesn't really cope with the deep tracks so Murray and I will have a talk when I get back from Brisbane, but I would think she might have one more run before we put her away for the spring."

Forsman was also pleased with the effort of Karisto who fought on doggedly for fourth in his hit and run mission at Doomben.

"He was only here for the one run so he will head back to New Zealand for a spell now," he said.

"He went a top race as he probably didn't cope with the wet track as well as we thought he might.

"They took him on in front and he stumbled a couple of times which didn't help so all in all you would have to be pleased with how he went.

"He has finally come of age in his last couple of runs so I think with a good break under his belt he will be a very nice four-year-old in his next prep."

Karisto races in the colours of his part-owners, the China Horse Club, who enjoyed a rare piece of history on Sunday (NZ time) when unbeaten colt Justify (Scat Daddy), whom they also share in the ownership of, completed the 13th Triple Crown in American racing history with a wire-to-wire victory in the Gr.1 Belmont Stakes (2400m). – NZ Racing Desk

# TUTTA LA CLASSE ON TARGET FOR RYDER STAKES BID

Promising filly **Tutta La Classe (NZ)** (Per Incanto) opened her winning account with a comprehensive victory at Trentham on the weekend which now has her in line for a shot at the Listed Courtesy Ford Ryder Stakes (1200m) in late July.

The Allan Sharrock trainer Per Incanto two-year-old was sent out a hot favourite for Saturday's 1000m dash after pushing talented stablemate London Express (NZ) (Shamexpress) hard when runner-up at her most recent start.

That raceday experience told in the testing Trentham track conditions as rider Lisa Allpress drove the filly clear early in the run home before holding off all challenges in the closing stages to register her maiden victory.

"She's still got a bit to learn as she ducked and dived a little in the run home, but I think her talent was pretty evident as she held them comfortably in the end," said Sharrock.

"She pushed London Express close last time and it was probably only the 4kg allowance that London Express had with Wiremu Pinn riding her that was the difference that day.

"London Express then came out and won the Castletown Stakes so that puts in to perspective the ability this filly has.

"They are both high class individuals so we're going to keep them apart for as long as we can."

That decision will see Tutta La Classe head to Otaki for the season's final stakes race while London Express enjoys some time in the paddock before chasing an early season three-year-old feature.

"We'll give Tutta La Classe one more run

before the Ryder Stakes which could be at either Te Rapa or Awapuni on the 7th of July," said Sharrock.

"That will give her three weeks before Otaki which will be ideal for her.

"London Express is taking a quick break at present before we bring her back for the Listed race at Wanganui in early September."

London Express will contest the Listed O'Leary Fillies Stakes (1200m) which is one of the feature events at Wanganui on 6 September.

# RICHARDSON DELIGHTED FOR OWNERS OF PROMISING STAYER

The only disappointing aspect of promising stayer **Suliman's (NZ)** (Redwood) win at Te Rapa on Saturday was co-trainer Graham Richardson couldn't be on-course to share in the victory celebrations with the horse's large group of owners.

Richardson was in Brisbane with stablemate The Wildflower (NZ) (Keeper), who was engaged in the Gr.2 Brisbane Cup (2200m), but managed to watch Suliman produce a stirring home straight rally in the Phelan Racing Stables 2100 to snare his second career victory.

The win was greeted in boisterous fashion by the four-year-old's large group of owners who produced plenty of noise in the closing stages as they cheered him home.

"They tell me they nearly lifted the grandstand roof with the cheering which must have been a pretty cool thing to witness," said Richardson.

"That's what racing is all about, so I'm just thrilled for them as I think they might have a pretty good one on their hands when he fully matures.

"He has been a very hard horse as he gets agitated over little things and

likes to throw his weight around at home. He's not for the faint-hearted but as he's gotten older he has started to calm down a little and is more manageable these days."

While the Redwood gelding has shown a real ability to handle winter tracks, Richardson believes he will also cope with the better surfaces available in the spring.

"He's not just a mudder and now he's getting older I think you will see that in the next six months," he said.

"I firmly believe he will go through the grades and can pick up a nice race

or two along the way. We will keep him to his grade for the time being but later on I would like to target some of the Cup races with him."

Richardson had been hoping for a big performance from The Wildflower but was left a little flat after her midfield finish in the Brisbane Cup.

"She didn't really perform up to expectations as I thought she was primed for a big run," he said.

"She just couldn't sprint with them when the pace went on and although she ground away well in the run home she never really threatened the placegetters.

"She is going for a spell so will have

two or three weeks in the sun over here before she heads back to New Zealand."

Richardson will now turn his attention to stable star Volpe Veloce (Foxwedge) as she prepares for the Gr.1 Tattersall's Club Tiara (1350m) at Doomben on 23 June.

"Volpe Veloce looks a picture and has come through her run at Doomben a week ago in good shape," he said.

"I couldn't be happier with her so now it's just a matter of keeping her ticking over as we countdown to the Tatts Tiara."

# HEARTLIGHT LIVES UP TO NZ WINNING FORM

Unbeaten New Zealand newcomer **Heartlight (NZ)** (Any Suggestion) kept up the same winning trend even after moving to a new country with an impressive victory on debut at Kranji on Sunday.

When racing as Crossedem for trainer Stephen Marsh, the Any Suggestion three-year-old won at his only start in New Zealand, in a 1200m race at Avondale on November 10, before he was sold to Singapore.

Now known as Heartlight and prepared by Singapore champion trainer Mark Walker, the grey gelding showed he

had not lost any of that precocious potential at his new base when he quickened through the Class 4 Non Premier field in the opening race over 1200m and worth \$45,000.

Ridden by Vlad Duric and settled in an ideal fifth spot behind the speed, Heartlight, who was backed down to \$15 favouritism, was clearly a cut above when he was peeled to the outside at the top of the straight. Showing great balance, he easily pulled away to a one-and-a-half length win from longshot Paragon Star (So You Think) with the well-backed Gain Eclipse (NZ) (Iffraaj) in third place another short head away.

The winning time was 1min 10.31secs for the 1200m on the Short Course.

“He did everything right today and he got a gun ride from Vlad,” said Walker.

“I think he was in a weaker Class 4 race, but still, it is always hard to win first-up. He’s got a nice future here.”

Heartlight has already hit the ground running for his new connections, the Better Times Stable, with a first winning cheque of around \$25,000.

“He’s a lazy horse in the morning, very shuffly. It’s hard to get a good gauge on him,” said Duric.

“But Mark told me he won his race in New Zealand very impressively. He gave me a beautiful ride right through.

“He got a bit tired at the finish, but that was his first run and he will get even better after that.”

# DURIC MAKES IT WIN NO 400 ON MR HANKS

Singapore champion jockey Vlad Duric hit win No 400 with the James Peters-trained **Mr Hanks (NZ)** (Showcasing) on Sunday.

Beginning the weekend on the 398-win mark, the Victorian jockey knew the new mark would be unlikely on Friday night given his booking of only two rides, who were not exactly certainties in their respective races.

With a solid book of eight rides on Sunday on the other hand, including many top picks, Duric was more confident that would be his day - and he duly got the landmark out of the way after only three rides.

After favourite Heartlight (NZ) (Any Suggestion) inched him closer in the opener, Mr Hanks' well-timed neck-win

in the \$60,000 War Affair 2015 Stakes, a Class 4 Premier race over 1200m turned provider.

Duric was taking it all in at the winner's circle after jumping off Mr Hanks, thanking the support he has enjoyed since his comeback, while also adding the competition is getting tougher at Kranji, even if he currently sits on top on 37 winners, seven clear of Michael Rodd.

"It's great. 400, that's a lot of winners," he said.

"I'm really chuffed it's come for Oscar Racing Stable, a great supporter of mine and also for James who is a good mate.

"I love racing here, but this year has been tougher. I'm struggling with my

weight, but I just have to keep chipping away."

Peters said the early blistering pace set by tearaway leader Elise (NZ) (Faltaat) played into the hands of his charge, who was dropping in class after struggling in the Singapore Three-Year-Old Challenge.

"This horse was a very good two-year-old but was disappointing in the 3YO series," said the English conditioner.

"He also drew wide barriers, but today he was in a perfect race and got a perfect barrier (two). There was a lot of speed to the race and he tried very hard to the line."

Mr Hanks still spotted Elise around four lengths at the top of the straight, but the margin dwindled steadily with Duric no doubt riding with renewed vigour with that win No 400 in his sights.

The winning time was 1min 9.79secs for the 1200m on the Short Course.
