ALIBI DEFIES ALL COMERS IN PATRON'S BOWL

allant entire **Alibi (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) is one step closer to history after he again showed he knew where the winning post was in the second Leg of the Singapore Four-Year-Old Challenge, the \$500,000 Patron's Bowl (1600m) on Sunday.

After taking out the first Leg, the Stewards' Cup (1400m), with his trademark fighting spirit three weeks ago, the bighearted son of Darci Brahma had to dig even deeper into his seemingly bottomless courage when he hit the front for jockey Glen Boss halfway up the Long Course, with a gaggle of swoopers descending thick and fast.

But Alibi thrives under pressure. Like he has proven on countless occasions, it is when he comes under siege that he conjures up that extra something up his sleeve - to still snag the thicker end of the prizemoney. Lim's Cruiser (Casino Prince) and Infantry (NZ) (Tavistock) don't shirk a good solid dogfight either. As expected, they came pouring the pressure on after Alibi – who jumped smartly but was eased back into a one-out one-back position - swept to the front shortly after Absolute Miracle (Strategic Maneuver) momentarily took over the baton from the weakening Preditor (NZ) (Savabeel) at the 200m, but their challenges were a little toothless.

On the other hand, right on the outside, the Cliff Brown pair of Debt Collector (NZ) (Thorn Park) and Elite Excalibur (Fastnet Rock) were not out of contention for a last-gasp blow as they unwound with their usual late flourish. Favourite Debt Collector, however, levelled out while Elite Excalibur kept motoring away to lunge at the line in a desperate bid to overhaul Alibi.

Upon pulling up, Duric instinctively raised his hand, thinking he had got the nod, while Boss on the far side also seemed confident the winning post had arrived on time for him. The photo print in the end proved Boss right with the verdict going to Alibi by a short head from Elite Excalibur with Infantry a neck away in third, and Lim's Cruiser four another head away.

Debt Collector ran sixth 1 ½ lengths off Alibi. The winning time was 1min 34.95secs for the 1600m on the Long Course.

With the third and final Leg, the Emirates Singapore Derby (2000m) set down for decision on July 9, Alibi has three weeks to regather himself for a clean sweep which has never been completed before.

Deputising for trainer Michael Clements who was away in Phuket, assistant-trainer Michael 'Chopsy' White said it would be contrary to the spirit of 'having a crack', especially if it meant a chance of rewriting the record books, if Alibi did not figure in the Derby line-up, even if going on that first test over the mile when he just fell in by a hair's breath, the 1 ¼ mile might on paper look a little far.

But savouring that Patron's Bowl win was the only thing that mattered to White at that very moment – as well as for the boisterous bunch of owners led by Mr Saeful Mawar, with any decision about the Derby to be taken in the cold light of day long after the last flutes of champagne had been glugged down.

"It's such a privilege to train a horse like Alibi," said an emotional White at the post-race interview.

"With Glen Boss as his regular rider, it gives you such a huge advantage and such a great confidence. It's just phenomenal what he's done to win the first two Legs, it makes my job easy.

"We'll see how he comes through that race, but you'd be unhappy not to go for the Derby. The distance is probably not his best, but he's a horse who gives 150% and if he pulls up good and is in the same condition as he was leading up to the first two Legs, then we should give it a go." Boss was a little more circumspect about the Derby trip, but would rather treasure the accomplishment of etching Alibi's name over two-thirds of the journey towards the Triple Crown, and praise his amazing ability to surpass himself when the chips are down.

"I really respect this horse. He has such a great determination to win," said the Australian Hall of Fame jockey.

"He had a lovely run in transit. From the get-go, everything was executed to plan.

"I held him up as long as I could. When the chasers came around, I counted and counted before I let him go.

"He reproduced the same acceleration he showed at his last start. I'm not sure about going to the Derby, but this horse has such a will to win."

Bred by Terry and Vicki Pascoe, Alibi is the third foal of their Galileo mare Bound To Impress (NZ) (Galileo) who is a daughter of the well performed racemare Honor Bound (NZ) (Honor Grades). He was a \$90,000 purchase at the 2014 NZB Ready To Run Sale for trainer Michael Clements from the Esker Lodge draft.

Alibi continues a remarkable record for New Zealand bred runners in the Patrons Bowl as he becomes the fifth runner in a row to carry the (NZ) suffix to victory.

BLATHWAYT HEADS TO SPELLING PADDOCK WITH WINNING FEELING

ardy campaigner **Blathwayt** (NZ) (Colombia) is heading to the spelling paddock on top of the world after scoring a comprehensive victory at Trentham on the weekend.

The ghostly grey bagged win number nine from 39 career starts as he gave weight and a beating to his rivals in the Nelson Pine Industries Handicap, the main flat race on the day's programme. In a muddling run race rider Jonathan Riddell seized the initiative approaching the home bend as he grabbed a lead that his mount refused to surrender in a slogging finish on the Heavy10 rated Trentham surface.

Trainer Alby MacGregor was pleased with the win as he looks forward to a spring campaign with the rising eight-year-old.

"As you know he's had a few problems in the last eighteen months

but I think he's finally over them now," he said.

"He spent plenty of time out on the hills at Polly MacDonald's place in Masterton and that seemed to bring him right. He is going to go for a break now and he will head up there again as he just loves it and really thrives on that hill work.

"We've never really thought he was a true winter horse as he doesn't

like the deep stuff. He handled it okay on Saturday as it wasn't a typical Trentham winter surface but I don't want him slogging around when he can be having a break before we get him ready for the spring."

MacGregor is keen to take another shot at the New Zealand Cup at Riccarton with Blathwayt after coming up short when favourite for the race back in 2015.

"We think he's still got it in him to win a race like the New Zealand Cup so that's where our thoughts have been lately," he admitted.

"Now he's gotten over his issues

we'd like to go back and have another go at it. He's been a pretty happy horse of late as we have varied his work and even done a little bit of schooling with him.

"He jumps very well and enjoys himself but we don't see him racing over the fences as they are more of an aid in giving him something different to do."

While Blathwayt is out spelling MacGregor will have his hands full with stablemate Finn (NZ) (Le Bec Fin) who finished a handy third in his first run of a new campaign on the weekend. "He's a tough bugger who is well suited when the tracks are a bog," he said.

"He went a beauty on Saturday and I expect him to get better as he gets fitter with a few more runs under his belt."

Ton up for Johnson at Waipa

National Jockey's Premiership leader Chris Johnson extended his margin on the chasing pack when he scored on **Combat Warrior (NZ)** (Duelled) in the opening race at Te Awamutu yesterday.

The victory brought up 100 winners for the season for the "magic man" as he produced a typically comprehensive performance to guide the Graeme and Debbie Rogerson trained runner to a comfortable win. Settled handy to the speed Johnson asked his mount for an effort approaching the home bend as they shot clear of the pack.

Combat Warrior maintained a solid run to the wire as she downed the fast finishing Pearlescence (NZ) (Bullbars) by a neat length with Frazzle (NZ) (Iffraaj) back in third.

Johnson was at it again later in the day when he guided another Rogerson runner in Commander (NZ) (Makfi) to a narrow victory in the 5th race on the programme.

Johnson now leads the premiership race by nine from Danielle Johnson with Alysha Collett another six wins astern as they head into the last five weeks of the season. – *NZ Racing Desk*

ALL SMILES AS MALACANTO MAKES UP FOR LAST START DISAPPOINTMENT

n unlucky run for third at her last start hinted that **Malacanto (NZ)** (Per Incanto) was ready to head back to the winner's enclosure at short notice and that proved the case when she prevailed in a driving finish to the Red Stag Timber Handicap at Trentham on the weekend.

The Per Incanto mare had looked to as though she could be a star winter performer when she won three of her first 5 starts, the last of those at Otaki in August. Since then the mare had endured a run of outs that finally came to an end on Saturday as she produced a powerful finishing burst to stride clear of her six rivals and notch win number four for

trainer, part owner and co-breeder lan Wyeth.

"I'm very happy with her as she got knocked over two starts ago," he explained after the race.

"She went well at Wanganui last time so we had our fingers crossed today that things would go alright.

"She's an honest horse who is a real toughie. I think we might be back here in two or three weeks' time with her."

Rider Robbie Hannam was at his cheeky best when questioned about the performance as he admitted he was at fault on the mare when beaten at her last run.

"I think you can come out and say I went too soon last time," he grinned.

"It's because I did as I got there too easy. Today she was always going to be hard to beat as she needed that last run and was ready to win. "She probably lacks a little bit of class but she tries so hard that it will take her a long way."

Runner-up That's Funny (NZ) (Road To Rock) also produced an eye-catching performance as she made ground well late in the piece while race favourite Finn (NZ) (Le Bec Fin) battled on well for third in his first run back in a new campaign.

rack specialist **Spider (NZ)** (Buffalo Man) reaffirmed his love for his home surroundings when he dealt out a beating to his rating 85 rivals at Ruakaka on Saturday.

The Buffalo Man four-year-old cruised home for his fourth career victory, all achieved on home turf, when he scored with plenty up his sleeve in the Marine Engineering Supplies 1400. Prepared by local horsewoman Kim Knight, the gelding had opened his account at the same meeting twelve months earlier and has proven a model of consistency in the interim having finished further back than fourth only three times in 15 starts to date.

Handled to perfection by rider Trudy Thornton, who has been aboard in all of his wins, the showy chestnut took up a handy position throughout the contest as race favourite De Niro (NZ) (O'Reilly) set up a breakneck speed out in front. Asked to set out after the pacemaker with 600 metres to run, Spider quickly reeled in the margin and shot two lengths clear with 150 metres to run.

Allowed to ease up in the shadows of the post by Thornton, Spider

cruised home by a length from the fast finishing pair of Wolff Spirit (NZ) (O'Reilly) and Creative Genius (Master Of Design) who filled the minor placings.

"Very good," was the succinct description from trainer Kim Knight when questioned about the performance.

"He's a trier and very honest, Trudy knows what she is doing as she knows what he has in the tank."

Knight admitted to some confidence before the race despite a jump in class for her charge who had finished runner-up in rating 75 company at his last run. "He was up in class but I do think he is up to it," she said.

"He is getting stronger but I haven't thought of anything more for him yet. I just wanted to get through this one and see what we had."




LOGAN PROVED CORRECT AS COMMAND ROYALE SHINES

Ruakaka trainer Donna Logan's judgment proved spot on when she labelled progressive intermediate galloper **Command Royale** (Court Command) as one of the best chances on the card at her local meeting on Saturday.

Logan and training partner Chris Gibbs produced three winners on the day with Command Royale's performance suggesting there is plenty more in store for the three-year-old. The well-deserved victory came off the back of a pair of eyecatching performances at Te Rapa which had punters quick to install him a hot favourite for the rating 75 1200 metre event.

His backers had little cause for concern as rider Cameron Lammas bounced him into a handy position from an inside barrier where he received the run of the race throughout. Angled to the inside rail for his finishing burst the Court Command gelding dashed through a yawning gap at the 200 metre mark to strike the front. From there he comfortably fended off all challenges including an eye-catching run out



wide from the Tony Pike trained runner-up Rose Imperial (NZ) (Pentire).

Logan had a twinkle in her eye as she answered questions after the race.

"It's always good to beat that Tony Pike who I know is on holiday over in Rarotonga at the moment," she laughed.

"He's a very promising horse and this is great for his owners over in Brisbane as they've just had a baby."

Logan admitted she had fielded several offers for the horse in recent weeks but his owners had rejected them for the time being.

"There have been some offers for him but they said let's keep him and race him today," she said.

"I like the horse as he's shown us a lot and I think he's got a bit of a future.

"He's not going to go on wet tracks so he will stick around here for the time being but I do think he will get a little further so it's very encouraging."

She was also quick to praise the performance of Lammas who produced a copybook display.

"It was a beautiful ride as we had asked him to see if he could get two or three back on the fence from the barrier," she explained.

"We knew there would be a lot of speed on and Cameron rode him a treat."

Earlier in the day the team had produced I See Red (NZ) (Redwood) to win the opening race on the card before Toorak Tower (Toorak Toff) made it a double in race 4 as he topped off stablemate Marquess Of (NZ) (Tavistock) to complete a stable quinella. – **NZ Racing Desk**

ance Noble is hoping his breakthrough Australian success with **Save The Date (NZ)** (Savabeel) will earn the filly a black type start.

The Karaka trainer celebrated his first winner across the Tasman when the daughter of Savabeel was successful over 1400 metres at the Sunshine Coast on Sunday.

"It was a big thrill and I've had a few placings before and success when I was with Roger (James), but that was my first one training on my own account," Noble said.

"Brendan and Jo Lindsay came over as well so it was a great result all

round."

Noble accepted the role last year as the Lindsay's private trainer after periods in partnership with Jim Gibbs and James before striking out on his own 17 years ago.

He now has an anxious wait to see if Save The Date's win will book her place in the Gr.3 Sunshine Coast Guineas on July 1.

"I'm not sure if she's got enough prize money to get in the Guineas, but at least she's given herself a chance now," Noble said.

"She's come through the race very well and ate everything up last night," Noble said. "Even if she didn't get in the Guineas there are other options over here for her. She was quite fresh before the race so she is still on an upward plane."

Save The Date returned from a break in the autumn to post runnerup finishes at Avondale and Pukekohe Park before her Queensland campaign.

"After her next run we'll probably leave her over here for a month before we bring her home," Noble said.

"This trip will be the making of her and she'll get over a bit more ground later on as well."

LEITH INNES SUSPENDED FOR STRADBROKE RIDE

ew Zealand jockey Leith Innes has been suspended after stewards completed an inquiry into interference in the Stradbroke Handicap.

Innes, who rode Counterattack in the Group One race at Doomben on June 10, was charged with causing interference to Patrick Moloney on Kaepernick in the straight.

Stewards said Innes had allowed Counterattack to shift out at the 300m which took Kaepernick on to Ulmann who was checked.

The inquiry was adjourned when Moloney left the course without

telling stewards and he was later fined \$400 for disobeying a direction to stay on the track.

Innes had asked that the inquiry be finalised via Skype as he did not expect to return to Queensland in the near future.

But he then elected to return to ride Save The Date who won at the Sunshine Coast on Sunday.

Stewards reopened the inquiry and after hearing a transcript of Moloney's evidence, Innes pleaded guilty and was suspended for 12 days.

At Ruakaka on Saturday Innes received a four-day suspension for careless riding on Jiayuguan, effective from today until next Sunday.
