LOGAN HOPING TO STRIKE GOLD AT ELLERSLIE

Trainer Samantha Logan is prepared to forgive the last start performance of stable star **Ngatira Gold (NZ)** (Gold Centre) as she sets her sights on a victory in the KS Browne Hurdle at Ellerslie today.

Last season's Great Northern Hurdles placegetter was one of the well fancied runners in the Waikato Hurdles last month but blotted his copybook with an indifferent performance that saw him finish a well beaten seventh in the event. Logan believes a tricky track surface that day

played against her charge and that the six-year-old gelding can turn that form around in a return to one of his favourite venues.

"He just didn't cop the shifty track at Te Rapa which was disappointing as we thought he was ready to go a bold race," she explained.

"We couldn't find anything wrong with him afterwards so that's really all I can put it down to. He had done something

similar there in his first season of jumping so I think it really comes down to the sand based nature of the track which he doesn't really like."

Logan has been pleased with the horse's progress since then and has him ready to fire at the venue where he scored his first victory over fences when taking out a maiden hurdle event on the same day last year.

"He really likes Ellerslie and tends to go his best races there," she said.

"He finally put it all together when he won there last year and went on to have a great season. He won the main hurdle on Pakuranga Hunt Day and then had it taken off him in the enquiry room before doing us proud in the Great Northern Hurdles.

"He's come up well again this year and we were confident before that Te Rapa race so I'm hoping coming back to Ellerslie can do the trick."

Logan also has the added bonus of securing the services

of Australian based kiwi rider Richard Cully who has returned to take the ride on both Ngatira Gold and Jack Romanov (NZ) (Ustinov), one of the pre-post favourites for the White Cliffs Timber McGregor Grant Steeplechase.

"Richard knows him well and did a great job on him last year so we're delighted he has come over and can take the ride again," she said.

"I am hoping for a shower or two of rain before the race as it looked pretty sticky there on Saturday and that won't suit us. If we can get some rain to loosen things up then I think we have a good chance."

Ngatira Gold will face a small but quality line-up in the race that includes Waikato Hurdles winner Thenamesbond (NZ) (China Cat), former Great Northern Hurdles winner Wee Biskit (NZ) (Zed) and sentimental favourite Raisafuasho (NZ) (Johar) who runs in the famous colours of owner and trainer Ann Browne, the wife of Ellerslie legend Ken Browne who the race is named after.

Pour Moi colt stuns in English Classic

Windsor Park shuttle stallion Pour Moi (Montjeu) enjoyed Group One success in England overnight when his son **Wings Of Eagles** tore off an upset victory in the time-honoured three-year-old classic, the English Derby at Epsom.

Sent out at odds of 40-1, Wings Of Eagles charged home late to nab the well favoured pair in Cliffs of Moher (Galileo) and Cracksman (Frankel) with the New Zealand owned Eminent (Frankel) close up in fourth. The victory provided trainer Aidan O'Brien with his fourth Derby win in the last six years and sixth overall while it was a first for jockey Pdraig Beggy who was having just his first ride in the race.

Wings of Eagles is from the second Northern Hemisphere crop of the Coolmore owned Pour Moi, who was successful himself in the 2011 Epsom Derby. Pour Moi shuttled to Windsor Park for the 2012 and 2013 breeding seasons and again in 2016 and is the sire of Gr. 1 JJ Atkins winner Sacred Elixir and recent Listed Great Northern Foal Stakes winner Haussmann.

STUNNING FINISH FOOLS MANY INCLUDING TRAINER

A stunning final charge carried promising winter galloper **Nina Arora (NZ)** (Don Eduardo) to a narrow victory in the last race at Ellerslie on Saturday in a finish that even had her trainer fooled.

Pukekohe mentor Nigel Tiley had given away the four-year-old mares chances in the closing stages as she battled in the testing ground after having her finishing run interrupted on several occasions. Most of the punters who had solidly supported the mare had done the same however rider Michael McNab was having none of that as he urged her for one final burst. To her credit Nina Arora found an extra effort and dashed the last few strides to nab a gallant Valante (NZ) (Tavistock) who had victory sewn up until that point.

"It wasn't until I heard George Simon say that she might have got there that I had any clue about what she had done," chuckled Tiley.

"With 100 metres to run I turned to one of the team and remarked that a placing would help us get a few more starts so it was a very pleasant surprise to get a win that I never even saw."

Tiley has plenty of time for the well-built daughter of Don Eduardo who has fought back from a broken bone in a hind leg to make her return to the track.

"She's a really good type who has plenty of ability but that injury cost her just when she was starting to put it all together last season," he noted.

"Being a Don Eduardo she is always going to be better with time and make into a pretty handy middle-distance horse.

"The problem we have had is getting a run for her as her rating is low so that's why I was happy when I thought she was going to run a place as the points she would get would make it easier to get another start.

"Now she has won I might have to reassess where we go

with her but she does like the wet tracks so I don't think she will be hard to place in the coming weeks."

Tiley also reported that stable star Megablast (NZ) (Shinko King) is in good shape as he prepares for a flight to Melbourne next Sunday where he will make his Australian debut later in the month.

"He's on a plane next Sunday and provided all goes well will have a start at Moonee Valley on the 17th," he said.

"Safely through that I'll run him at Flemington a week later then he can come home and have a month at the beach."

EMOTIONAL VICTORY FOR LORD ERNESTO AT WHANGANUI

Injury plagued galloper **Lord Ernesto (NZ)** (Patapan) had his trainer Sandie Cookson on the verge of tears after he completed an all-the-way victory at Whanganui on Saturday

Beautifully rated by rider Johnathan Parkes, the six-year-old gelding brought back memories of his debut season when he freewheeled his way to victory in the Dave Hoskins Carriers rating 85 sponsored event. Successful in his first two career starts back in 2015 Lord Ernesto had promised to set the winter racing scene alight however a series of bone chips and other niggling leg injuries have curtailed his raceday endeavours with Saturday's victory his first in 13 further runs since that heady start.

Cookson was full of praise for both Parkes and her charge when questioned after the race.

"Very emotional and so nice to see him back," she said.

"It's just so good to have Johnathan back on him as he's a great rider and a really good friend.

"He has been a bit of a problem horse but I'm just so proud of him. We were going to ride him back a little but he jumped so well that Johnathan let him stride and he has absolutely killed them."

Parkes was equally effusive in his praise for the Patapan gelding.

"He travelled really well after he flew the gates," he explained.

"It made it easy when I could put him the race as he got some nice sectionals and quickened up well when I asked him.

"He showed a great kick at the

top of the straight and won quite convincingly.

"He showed a lot earlier on before he had a couple of chips taken out of his knees. When they have those sorts of things go on you have to hope you have the right horse turn up on the day and he certainly did that."

IRISH MIST BOUNCES BACK AT ELLERSLIE

A six-week break has done the world of good for progressive three-year-old **Irish Mist (NZ)** (Guillotine) who returned to the top rung of the podium with a victory at Ellerslie on Saturday.

Trainer Michael Rogers, who prepares the Guillotine gelding with father Matt and younger brother Matthew, has always held a high opinion on his charge but immaturity and greenness had plagued him throughout his earlier campaigns. An untimely stone bruise suffered after a run at Ellerslie in April played in his favour with Rogers pleased to see the development in the horse that took place while he was on the easy list.

“We’ve known he could gallop from early on but he has been very weak and quite wayward up until now,” he explained.

“He has run a number of nice races but that weakness just told on several occasions. When we found he was suffering from a stone bruise we tipped him out which worked out well as he thrived during the time off.

“He still has plenty of maturing to do, both physically and mentally, but he is on the right path now and I hope he can live up to the promise he has shown us to date.”

Despite registering his maiden victory on a heavy surface at Rotorua last year Rogers was in some doubt about Irish Mist’s ability to handle the testing surface that prevailed on the weekend.

“We don’t think he is an out and out wet tracker as he ran second on a good track at Pukekohe one day,” he noted.

“When I saw how heavy it was on Saturday I thought he

might struggle but to his credit he displayed plenty of grit in the final stages and beat a couple of nice types in the process.

“I think he will be best on a track with some cut in it so that’s what we will try and place him during the winter. A track like Te Rapa should suit so I think we will take a look there this weekend and then maybe at some of those Ruakaka meetings after that.”

WINTERFELL FINALLY LORDS OVER AS FIRST PAST LINE DETHRONED

Scott Bailey was beaming after **Winterfell (NZ)** (Showcasing) finally opened his account at his 10th start on Sunday, never mind if the usual post-race celebrations had to be foregone.

The Showcasing grey won the \$35,000 Stepitup 2015 Stakes, a Maiden race over 1400m, in the Stewards' room.

He was second past the line with Lim's Sparkle (Stryker) a nose ahead first, the one who automatically walked into the winner's stall for the traditional photo-taking.

But when the objection sign was flashed, all parties had to hold their horses and punters their tickets. Winterfell's jockey John Powell had fired a protest for interference in the closing stages, and after a 10-minute

hearing, the objection was upheld – much to Bailey's great delight.

Bailey has led in many winners as trainer Shane Baertschiger's right-hand man over the years, but if there is one horse the former Adelaide jockey would have got an extra kick in posing for the camera at the winner's circle it had to be Winterfell.

After all the banter "spruiking" Winterfell as the next Kranji superstar, the Game Of Thrones fan was a little disappointed he missed out on that Instagram moment on Sunday, but was still chuffed the horse he named after the capital of the North in the popular TV series has finally shed his maiden status.

In nine previous runs, Winterfell had come close a few times, but the latest couple of performances

(eighth and fifth) had Bailey seriously wondering if the grey would ever have the same runaway success as the medieval drama.

"I thought he was ready to go up to Malaysia after his last run," he joked. "He's no world-beater but hey, I named him, and he's a pretty special horse to me.

"I was no fan of the Game Of Thrones, but someone told me how great it was. I bought the DVD's and I was hooked, I've watched all of them.

"I thought Winterfell would be a nice name for that little grey horse that walked into our yard one day. The owners liked the name, and we were all hoping he would be the King of the North, the King of Kranji!

"Not quite yet, but he's shown ability and today was his day, even if he won on objection, winners are grinners."

BIG MAN BACK TO WINNING WAYS

Trainer Shane Baertschiger had to wait for a long time before Winterfell (NZ) (Showcasing) was finally declared the winner in the Stewards' room in Race 2, but in stark contrast, he knew he was home from a long way out in the very next.

From one extreme of having to sit through a lengthy protest hearing defending his case why Winterfell should be promoted to first place, the Australian handler could have headed down to the winner's circle the moment **Big Man (NZ)** (Alamosa) overcame his outermost alley (13) to enjoy a soft lead in the \$60,000 Wild Geese 2014 Stakes, a Class 4 Division 2 race over 1200m.

After bowling along on the bridle for most of the way, Big Man (\$53) was off and gone the moment jockey John Powell stepped off the brakes.

The Alamosa four-year-old cleared out for a comprehensive three-length win from Copacabana (NZ)

(Showcasing) with Damon (NZ) (O'Reilly) in third place another nose away. The winning time was 1min 9.99secs for the 1200m on the Short Course.

Baertschiger said the Sabah-owned gelding is the sort who is hard to run down if he gets his own way in front.

"The moment he crossed over from the wide barrier, I knew he would be dangerous," said the Australian conditioner.

"JP rated him well and he got the right run through. I think dropping him back to Class 4 and putting the blinkers back on helped him.

"He's a horse who struggles in Class 3 but goes well in Class 4, especially today on the Short Course, and he gets to dictate."

With that fifth success, Big Man has now taken his stakes earnings past the \$180,000 mark for the Sabah Racing Stable.
