"And Ferrando, if he runs really well, hopefully he'll get an invitation to Hong Kong (for the Gr.1 Chairman's Sprint Prize over 1200m on April 28)."

Ferrando went within a whisker of claiming his first Group One win when run down late by Enzo's Lad (Testa Rossa) in

the Telegraph (1200m) at Trentham, run in a sizzling 1:06.95.

"It was a sensational run and the watered track didn't help but it was still touch and go whether he might have actually won the race," Rogerson said.

"He's drawn another bad alley this weekend but he's a proven horse. With a dry track and if he gets the run to suit, he'll be very competitive.

"He's worked really well this week. Bailey is really happy with him and she told me they'll know he's there."

TAB bookmakers installed Ferrando a \$6 third favourite for the set-weights and penalties sprint behind Spring Heat (More Than Ready) and Princess Kereru (NZ) (Pins) at \$5.

A winner of eight of his 23 starts, seven of those at 1200m, Ferrando will head to Trentham next start to defend his Listed Lightning Handicap (1200m) crown on March 16 before heading overseas.

"He won the Lightning last year and then went to Adelaide and it rained. He needs a rock-hard track," Rogerson said.

Rogerson has high hopes for More Wonder in Saturday's Derby, despite the Mossman gelding never racing past 1600m.

A winner of three of his 16 starts, More Wonder ran a luckless fourth in the Gr.1 Levin Classic (1600m) at Trentham before meritorious runs for fifth in the Gr.1 Thorndon Mile (1600m) at Trentham and fourth in last week's Gr.1 Haunui Farm WFA Classic (1600m) at Otaki against the older horses.

"He's shown he's up to running against the very best horses. A few things have gone wrong, otherwise he should probably have been a Group One winner already," Rogerson said.

"I know it's a Derby but he's a really good horse. Horses don't work like he's been working at home. He's just got to put it all together. He struck a wet track last week and he'd done a few things wrong in the run beforehand but with the right run this weekend, he's in this Derby up to his eyeballs.

"He's working like a Derby winner and he'll be very competitive if he does everything right. He doesn't pull or anything at home but he's such a strong horse. I think that much of him I paid \$280,000 for his half-brother at Karaka."

TAB bookmakers have More Wonder as a \$13 fifth favourite for the Derby behind Surely Sacred (NZ) (Rock 'n' Pop) at \$3.50, Vernanme (NZ) (O'Reilly) at \$6, In A Twinkling (Fastnet Rock) at \$7.50 and Platinum Invador (NZ) (Redwood) at \$10.

More Wonder holds nominations in Australia for the Gr.1 Rosehill Guineas (2000m) on March 23, the Gr.1 Australian Derby (2400m) at Randwick on April 6 and the Gr.1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes (2000m) at Randwick on April 13, a race slated as potentially the last for champion mare Winx (Street Cry).

FROM DUBAI TO THE DERBY

aulfield Cup-winning jockey Pat Cosgrave will make a flying visit to Auckland this weekend to partner the Chris Waller-trained Nobu (NZ) (Reliable Man) in the Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby (2400m).

The 36-year-old Northern Irishman shot to prominence in this part of the world after partnering Benbatl (Dubawi) to win the Gr.1 Caulfield Stakes (2000m) last October before adding the Gr.1 Caulfield Cup (2400m) on Best Solution (Kodiac) a week later.

Cosgrave, who is currently based

in Dubai, won't arrive in Auckland until Saturday morning but is looking forward to the challenge and linking up with the Waller stable once again.

"I rode Comin'Through for Chris Waller in Dubai a couple of times earlier in the year and I know his Racing Manager Charlie Duckworth well, so the ride has come through that," Cosgrave said.

"Chris asked if I would be interested in going down and riding Nobu and I had never been there (New Zealand) before. Chris is a world-class trainer, so I have taken the opportunity to go down and see how it goes.

"If Chris is sending it there he must think it has a live chance in the big race."

Cosgrave said he had already watched some videos of past New Zealand Derbys to get an idea of what awaits and he would be doing more homework before making the journey.

"Between now and Saturday I'll be going through all his races and looking through some of the opposition as well and hopefully see how the race is going to pan out," Cosgrave said.

"I want to learn as much as possible, there is not much point in going all the way down to ride this horse and not have my homework done.

"I'll be there early and I'll walk the track a couple of times and Charlie has helped me pick up another ride beforehand."

Cosgrave was impressed with Nobu's last-start fourth in Rating 65 company at Ellerslie over 2100m, closing late after going back to last.

"Charlie said his closing sectionals were very good and that he should improve with the step up in distance, so he looks a nice ride," he said.

The seven-time Group One winning



rider is embracing the challenge of riding in another jurisdiction, having clocked a few air points throughout his career.

"I rode in the UK all summer last vear and then went to Melbourne for three or four weeks to ride for Godolphin," Cosgrave said. "Then I came back here to Dubai in the second week of November and I've been here since.

"I'm really looking forward to getting to New Zealand, it is going to be interesting and something new and hopefully the horse will run a big race.

"I've ridden in Ireland, UK, France, Germany, Italy, Turkey, South Africa, Dubai, Australia and now New

Zealand. There's not many places left, probably the only place I haven't been is the US."

Cosgrave has four rides at Meydan in Dubai on Thursday night before boarding a plane to Auckland and is hoping to amass some nice rides ahead of the world's richest raceday, the Dubai World Cup meeting on March 30.

With six Group One races on the program and three Group Two races, the total purse for the World Cup meeting is a mind-boggling US\$35 million.

Cosgrave said the Super Saturday meeting on March 9 would provide a clearer indication as to which horses might figure on World Cup night, but he already has some irons in the fire.

"I'm hoping to ride a horse in the UAE Derby (Gr.2, 1900m) for (American trainer) Kenny McPeek, a horse called Grecko, but things are more finalised after the ninth of March.

"That confirms what is going to get in and what is going to run but I'm also hoping to pick up a ride for Saeed (bin Suroor).

"Something might pop up between now and then, fingers-crossed.

"Between myself and Christophe Soumillon we ride the horses for Saeed bin Suroor and freelance after that.

"Saeed is first and after that we pick up what we can. It is tough racing during the carnival but it is good."

Cosgrave reported that last year's Gr.1 Dubai World Cup (2000m) winner was on-track for another tilt at the carnival's feature.

"I galloped Thunder Snow on Tuesday morning, he is in good form and he is going to run on Super Saturday and crack on to World Cup night," he said.

Meanwhile, the jockey said he would love to return to Australia at some stage following his success in spring.

"I really enjoyed coming down to Australia and obviously, I did pretty well winning the two Group Ones," Cosgrave said.

"I'd love to come back but have nothing planned yet, but you never know what could come from riding for powerful owners and a good trainer like Chris Waller."

TRANS-TASMAN FOCUS FOR PIKE

hile Cambridge trainer Tony Pike has plenty to focus on in his homeland, with **Surely Sacred (NZ)** (Rock'n' Pop) the favourite for the Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby (2400m), he will also have an eye across the Tasman shortly after the blue-riband event.

Progressive galloper **Ever Loyal** (Sebring) will contest the Gr.3 Liverpool City Cup (1300m) at Randwick just ten minutes after the Derby and Pike believes he is a good chance of snaring the thick end of the prize in both races.

Ever Loyal has the services of Kerrin McEvoy and will jump from barrier eight in the competitive nine-horse field and is rated a \$7.50 chance.

"His racing manners last season weren't quite there," Pike said. "He was a little bit aggressive and just did a few things wrong and he probably struggled to get 1600m.

"He had an injury enforced layoff and he has probably come back better than ever.

"His two runs resuming off a 12-month break have been exceptional. His sectionals have been very good, so I think it is time to step up in class and have a crack in Sydney on Saturday.

"He was probably a touch unlucky first-up in the Concorde

Queensland during the Winter Carnival."

Pike couldn't be happier with Surely Sacred, the \$3.80 favourite for the New Zealand Derby on the back of a strong win in the Gr.2 Avondale Guineas (2100m) last start.

"He's had the perfect preparation," Pike said. "He has won three out of five races and was possibly a little unlucky not to have run closer in the other two.

"He got shuffled up at a bad time in the Karaka Million 3YO race. It was a very slow tempo that day and he still closed well for fifth and was a dominant winner last start and probably off a pretty tough run.

"I don't think the 2400m is going to be an issue. He is in good form and he is a very progressive horse, so I am looking forward to Saturday."

Pike will once again join forces with jockey Vinnie Colgan who has been engaged to ride Surely Sacred. Colgan will be looking to add an incredible seventh New Zealand Derby to his record, with his most recent success in the race coming when riding Rangipo (Stryker) to victory in the 2016 Derby for Pike.

"I think he is definitely up to the Sydney class of horses in the lower grades at this stage and the long-range plan is to get some prizemoney in the bank and hopefully get his rating up to possibly have a go at a race like the Stradbroke (Gr.1, 1400m) in

WALLER PLEASED WITH SYDNEY **CUP-BOUND PATRICK ERIN**

ydney trainer Chris Waller is expecting a solid showing from his New Zealand-bred stayer **Patrick Erin (NZ)** (Gallant Guru) in the Gr.1 Chipping Norton Stakes (1600m) at Randwick on Saturday.

The seven-year-old gelding finished fourth when first-up against stablemate Winx (Street Cry) in the Gr.2 The Star Apollo Stakes (1400m) at Randwick earlier this month and Waller was pleased with his run.

"His first-up run was excellent and he has improved in terms of his fitness since then," Waller said.

"He showed first-up when over 1400m that he can hold a position through having some good barrier speed, so whilst I wouldn't expect him to lead, he won't be too far away."

The Group One-winning son of Gallant Guru is on a path towards the Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) in April, which will include a number of black-type assignments.

"He is tracking nicely towards a Sydney Cup and he will be going via the Gr.3 Sky High Stakes (2000m) third-up and fourthup into the BMW (Gr.1, 2400m) and then the Grand Final for the preparation will be the Sydney Cup," Waller said.

He will also line-up New Zealand Bloodstock Sales graduate Unforgotten (Fastnet Rock) in the Chipping Norton and believes she will improve off her fifth-placed run in The Apollo.

"She just got left a little flat footed through there being no pressure in the race first-up, so if that is the case on Saturday we would get rolling a little earlier on her to ensure that she is put into the race and she will certainly improve in terms of fitness," Waller said.

"I think Unforgotten should be starting to improve secondup and up to the mile and not just be a walkover, obviously we have got a lot of respect for Happy Clapper as well."

Meanwhile, earlier in the card Waller will line-up New Zealand-bred gallopers Melt (NZ) (Iffraaj) and Zalatte (NZ) (Medaglia D'oro) in the Gr.1 Surround Stakes (1400m).

Melt finished sixth last start in the Gr.2 Light Fingers Stakes (1200m) and Waller believes she has taken a lot of improvement from that race.

"She has taken improvement from her first-up run but she is another one that has drawn wide (barrier 14)," Waller said.

"She wanted to do things upside down first-up, so hopefully we can just get her to switch off and get her to come back and relax. Providing that is the case she will finish off well."

Waller is excited about undefeated filly Zalatte's potential heading into Saturday.

"I am very excited by this horse, she follows a similar profile to Unforgotten through winning off season three-year-old

> races and now she is racing against the better horses and is obviously first up," Waller said.


"I wouldn't expect her to win against these sharper three-year-old fillies, but I would expect her to show that she is going to be competitive in races going forward over a bit further.

"From her good draw (barrier four) she is going to at least get a nice run and hopefully runs close to the first three. She will then progress through to the Vinery Stakes (Gr.1, 2000m) third-up."



Quality three-year-old filly **Queen of Diamonds (NZ)** (Savabeel) picked up the second stakes win of her career when victorious in the Gr.2 Little Avondale Lowland Stakes (2100m) at Hastings on Wednesday.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsmantrained filly was sent forward early from her outside gate (barrier 11) by jockey Matthew Cameron to settle outside pacemaker Miss Labasa (NZ) (Swiss Ace).

The daughter of Savabeel remained prominent throughout before Cameron presented his charge perfectly at the home turn where she was able to account for her opposition with ease, winning by 1-1/2 lengths over Shezathinka (So You Think) with Imelda Mary (NZ) (Ferlax) running home late for third. "Sponge Bob galloped on the course proper at Ellerslie this morning (Monday) and he went up and followed a couple around but he worked by himself," Richardson, who trains in partnership with Gavin Parker, said.

"Without being a disaster, he's had suspensory issues," Busuttin said.

"We now work him out the back on the sand dunes at Cranbourne and on the treadmill.

"It's the soundest he's ever been and it sounds funny, but he's fully mature now."

"He's a six-year-old that's had 14 starts and he's a gelding," Busuttin said.

"If we can keep him sound, there's plenty of races for him."

Grunt (NZ) (O'Reilly) is set to step out in the colours of Zhang Yuesheng when he makes his return to racing at Flemington.

The Mick Price-trained four-year-old runs in the Gr.3 Shaftesbury Avenue (1400m) on Saturday on his way to a start in the A\$5million All-Star Mile (1600m) at Flemington on March 16.

Yulong Investments has taken a controlling interest in last year's Australian Guineas winner, who will become the first stallion for the group when he is retired from racing.

Chief operating officer Sam Fairgray said the four-year-old, who also won the Makybe Diva in the spring, would race on with the possibility of a Sydney campaign to follow the All-Star Mile.

Fairgray said Grunt appealed as a prospective stallion as a good-looking son of O'Reilly.

"He was a Group One winning three-

year-old and a weight-for-age winner as a four-year-old and as a racehorse he's the real deal," Fairgray said.

"We saw the opportunity and a lot of upside with him on the racing side and then with our breeding operation.

"He's a stallion that will sit well for us in Victoria and the O'Reilly's work well here in Australia.

"We're happy to have him and support him and if he goes to stud this year or the following year I'm sure he'll be well supported."

James overjoyed with filly's progress

Cambridge trainer Roger James believes **Elate (NZ)** (Savabeel) is shaping up as well as any horse he has prepared for the Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand Oaks (2400m).

James and co-trainer Robert Wellwood will produce the Savabeel filly in Saturday's Gr.3 McKee Family Sunline Vase (2100m) at Ellerslie, her final leadup for the Oaks at Trentham on March 16.

"She just never saw daylight, it was a good effort," he said. "She probably would have run second if she got clear earlier over

Wellington Guineas beckons Langkawi

Group Two performer **Langkawi (NZ)** (Helmet) is back in winning form after taking out the Time Test 1400 at Hastings on Wednesday.

The Peter McKay-trained runner was on a path towards the Gr.1 Vodafone New Zealand Derby (2400m), however, disappointing performances in the Karaka Million 3YO Classic (1600m) and Gr.2 Waikato Guineas (2000m) put paid to those aspirations.

With victory on Wednesday, the son of Helmet now boasts a record of two wins and three seconds at the Hawke's Bay track.

"He does love racing here (at Hastings)," McKay said. "It was a bit of a drop back in distance, we were trying to go to the Derby.

"The last couple of runs have been a bit indifferent. Last start we tried to ride him back because he drew the widest and they walked and sprinted home.

"I think he may be more of a 1400m to a mile horse. I'm really pleased to get back in to winning form."

Langkawi will now head to Trentham next month to contest the Gr.2 Norwood Family Wellington Guineas (1400m).

"There's the Wellington Guineas over 1400m, that was the main aim if he happened to win here today," McKay said.

"We may have one more go at getting him over ground. He's had a long enough season, but he's enjoyed himself."

Enjoying The Show at Counties

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsmantrained **Enjoy The Show (NZ)** (Showcasing) made a winning start to his race career, taking out the Splice Construction 1200 on debut at Counties on Thursday.

The two-year-old son of Showcasing jumped away well from the ace barrier to take the early lead for jockey Matthew Cameron, before handing up to the Peter

and Dawn Williams-trained Well Chosen (NZ) (Reliable Man).

To the urges of Cameron, Enjoy The Show accelerated down the straight to regain the lead at the 150m mark and was able to hold out a fast-finishing Folk Dress (Pierro) to win by a long head.

Co-trainer Murray Baker was pleased with the win and said the colt is showing a lot of early promise.

"He's a promising colt," he said. "He's a Showcasing, they go well.

"He's a half to a Rosehill Guineas winner and he has got a bit of pedigree, so I think he is a chance going on."

Cameron was pleased with the debutants run and believes he will be competitive in further juvenile races in autumn.

"He's a lovely little horse and he's probably the natural two-year-old out of the three of Murray's and Andrew's," Cameron said, referring to Custom Cruiser (Toronado) and Holy Mongolemperor (NZ) (More Than Ready), who finished fourth and fifth respectively.

"He jumped well, I didn't want to lead. He hasn't been around this way much. It was good to get a bit of a lead in to it. It was a bit daunting down the straight, but he got the job done."

Enjoy The Show is now on a black-type path, with his connections eyeing a tilt at the Gr.1 Courtesy Ford Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (1400m) at Awapuni next month

"We have got him nominated for the Sires' and we'll see from there," Baker said.

No All Star Mile for Melody Belle

Melody Belle (NZ) (Commands) is coming off the back of her fifth Group One victory, but her connections are resisting the urge to accept a wildcard for the A\$5million All Star Mile (1600m) at Flemington next month.

Raced by Fortuna Syndications, Melody Belle was on the radar of Racing Victoria chief handicapper Greg Carpenter after her win in the Gr.1 Haunui Farm WFA Group One Classic (1600m) at Otaki on Saturday, but Syndicate manager John Galvin said they have elected to bypass the race.

"I fielded a call from Greg Carpenter who

advised that Melody Belle was in contention for a wildcard entry," Galvin said.

"Trainer Jamie Richards and I had previously discussed our position and we had decided that the All Star Mile, attractive as it was, was not the right race for our mare at this time.

"To travel to Australia to take on their best milers in this event, when already deep into a campaign that commenced last August, was not in the best interests of Melody Belle we had decided."

The daughter of Commands will now potentially line-up at Ellerslie next month in an attempt to add a sixth Group One win to her record in the Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes (2000m).

"She has yet to contest a race over the 2000m distance," Galvin said.

"Given her performance in the Haunui, trainer Jamie Richards and rider Opie Bosson hold the view that 2000m will hold no fear for her.

"This race presents as an ideal opportunity for her final race of the 2018/19 season."

Sydney still the aim for Ladies First

Last season's Gr.1 Auckland Cup (3200m) winner **Ladies First (NZ)** (Dylan Thomas) will continue on a path towards the Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) despite finishing tenth in the Gr.1 Haunui Farm WFA Group One Classic (1600m) at Otaki on Saturday.

"It was a pass mark (the run)," trainer Allan Sharrock said.

"We are happy the way we are tracking. She looks really well. She went super first up (when sixth in the Listed Wairarapa Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m)) and they often throw in one like that, so I'm not too worried at this stage.

Ladies First will have one further start in New Zealand, the Gr.1 Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes (2000m), before heading across the Tasman to contest the Gr.2 Chairman's Quality (2600m) at Randwick.

"She'll now go to the 2000m race at Ellerslie at weight-for-age, through that into the Chairman's and then a week later the Sydney Cup," Sharrock said.

Former Haunui Farm stallion Showcasing continued his success with two-year-olds in New Zealand with winner number 10 at Counties on Thursday, Enjoy The Show (NZ).

Showcasing has been prominent in the two-year-old Sires Table since his first crop hit the tracks in the 2014/2015 season, landing the title as Champion Two-Year-Old and First Season Sire, and he has headed

the table by number of winners since the 2015/2016 season.

"It's been a long time since a New Zealand stallion has had that many two-year-old winners," Haunui Farm's Mark Chitty said.

"We went back to the 2006/2007 season as that's as far back as we could go on Arion and the next closest is 8 and that was Showcasing last year and Iffraaj in the 2013/2014 season.

"The benchmark for two-year-old racing is obviously Australia and I Am Invincible leads that charge with 12 winners but he's had 40 starters, Showcasing has only had 15."

Showcasing's two-year-old roll of honour in NZ this season includes the stakes performers Appellant (NZ) who was in the Karaka Million and Listed Wellesley Stakes, Last Sight (NZ) and Rainbow Dash (NZ) who, like She's A Thief (NZ) last season, was beaten a nose in the Gr.2 Matamata Breeders' Stakes.

Since his first Southern Hemisphere crop hit the tracks, Showcasing has sired 16 two-year-old stakes performers in New Zealand from 40 starters, including six stakes winners. Amongst them are Karaka Million winner Hardline (NZ) and, G2 Wakefield Challenge Stakes winners Showboy (NZ) and Xpression (NZ).


