STAR PING'S TO GIVE RYAN MOORE A FIRST BMW HONG KONG DERBY



Ping Hai Star charges clear as he scores a handsome win in the BMW Hong Kong Derby

Ping Hai Star (NZ) (Nom Du Jeu) handed jockey Ryan Moore a first BMW Hong Kong Derby (2000m) victory with a stunning last-to-first drive at Sha Tin Racecourse.

"He's a very talented horse, I had great fun riding him today," Moore said after the New Zealand-bred had quickened a length and three quarters clear of runner-up Singapore Sling (Philanthropist) in the HK\$18 million classic.

The exciting bay clocked 2m 01.18s, the fastest time in 19 runnings since the four-year-old feature was upped to 2000 metres. After anchoring at the tail of the 14-runner field, 11 lengths astern of the pace-setting The Golden Age (My Risk), Ping Hai Star blitzed through the final 800m.

The only horse to break 23 seconds for the penultimate sectional (22.91s), the 5.2 chance backed that up with a

searing 21.99s for the final 400m. That was 0.27s faster than the next quickest closing split, that of third-placed Exultant (Teofilo).

"It wasn't really the plan, to be that far back, at all," Moore revealed. "I just felt I'd ride him with lots of confidence – I believed before the race that he was the one horse that could have more class than anything else in the race and I think that showed.

"He's just a high quality horse with a very good turn-of-foot; when you get on him he's a big, solid, strong horse, very powerful underneath you. Someone pointed him out to me back in January actually – said he's a good horse. He ran that trip no problem at all."

It was a third win in the race for trainer John Size, with Ping Hai Star following Fay Fay (NZ) (Falkirk) in 2012 and Luger (Choisir) in 2015.

“You can’t win a race any more dominantly than that. He was the class horse that came out of the pack, so he’s identified himself today,” Size said.

Ping Hai Star went into the third and final leg of the Four-Year-Old Classic Series as an intriguing untapped talent. While his main rivals battled for honours in the first two legs, Size masterminded an assault on the series finale with three consecutive handicap wins at 1400m. No Derby winner before had headed into the race without a win at a distance of a mile or more.

In fact, Size had indicated as recently as January that the galloper would likely stick to distances at a mile and under for the foreseeable future, thus sidestepping this year’s Derby. An impressive win two weeks ago prompted a change of plan.

“The last time he raced, I saw something that I liked about him as far as a Derby prospect was concerned,” Size said. “He came from the tail of the field, he settled quite nicely, he was very happy to reel off some quick sectionals at the end of the race. The only gamble was whether he was fit enough and had the stamina to run 2000 (metres) with his inexperience.

“I backed him up quickly into a (barrier) trial at Happy

Valley and I was very satisfied with all that, and then it was just a matter of coming to the races and hoping that the race unfolded and was run to suit him.”

The plan worked. The Hong Kong Classic Cup one-two Singapore Sling and Exultant had no answer for the Nom Du Jeu gelding’s sustained acceleration. Hong Kong Classic Mile victor Nothinglikemore (Husson) faded out to 11th, leaving Ping Hai Star as the undisputed king of the Four-Year-Old Classic Series.

Ping Hai Star is a son of Nom de Jeu (NZ) (Montjeu), who won the Australian Derby from the stable of Cambridge trainer Murray Baker for long-time stable supporter, Queensland owner Billie Morton.

Bred by Morton’s son Glenn and wife Lisa, Ping Hai Star was raised at Libby and Sam Bleakley’s Highden Park near Palmerston North. The boutique Manawatu nursery has enjoyed stunning success with its graduates which also include Hong Kong stars Werther (also a Hong Kong Derby winner) and Beauty Generation.

Offered for sale through the Highden Park draft at the 2015 New Zealand Bloodstock Select Yearling Sale, Ping Hai Star failed to meet his \$40,000 reserve and was retained by the Mortons as a racing prospect.

Ping Hai Star raced in Australia as Ted and won two of his three starts for Sunshine Coast trainer Stuart Kendrick in February last year before his sale to Hong Kong.

It is the fifth time in the past decade the Hong Kong Derby has been won by a New Zealand-bred galloper.

IRON ZED LANDS **SECOND VON DOUSSA**

Star jumper **Zed Em (NZ)** (Zed) produced his trademark grit at the end of Sunday's Thomas Foods International Von Doussa Steeplechase (3250m) at Oakbank to secure back-to-back wins in the \$100,000 feature for in-form trainer Patrick Payne.

In his seasonal jumping return, the seven-year-old made play for most of the race and, when asked to quicken by jockey Steven Pateman coming down the hill the second time, put most of his rivals to the sword with relative ease.

As was the case in last year's Brierly Steeplechase (3450m) at Warrnambool, Zed Em staved off the late challenge of Darren Weir's Now And Zen (Zenno Rob Roy), with the Simon Ryan-trained Dormello Mo (Conillon) staying on resolutely into third.

The win was Pateman's fourth Von Doussa crown after his wins in 2014 with Palmero (Hawk Wing), 2013 with Lord Of The Song (Song Of Tara) and 2006 with Bello Signor (Raami).

With the change in programming, Zed Em could now be

aimed at the Great Eastern Steeplechase (4950m) at Oakbank on Easter Saturday or be saved for a tilt at defending his Brierly Steeplechase (3450m) crown at Warrnambool during the May Racing Carnival.

Zed Em, who is prepared by jumps legend Kevin Myers when domiciled in New Zealand, has now won 13 of his 34 career starts including a remarkable eight from 12 over the steeplechase fences. His latest victory took his total prizemoney earnings to in excess of \$470,000.

SEVENTH UP READY TO DEFEND EASTER TITLE

Last year's Gr.2 Manco Easter (1600m) winner **Seventh Up (NZ)** (Shinko King) looks in fine fettle to defend his title next month judging by his comfortable first-up victory at Rotorua on Saturday.

The lightly raced seven-year-old was resuming after finishing well back at Ellerslie in early December and relished the cushion in the Rotorua surface that was officially rated as a Dead4 on the day. Despite being off the scene for over three months trainer Shelley Hale felt her charge could run a bold race based on his lead-up work.

"I just thought he might need a run as he hadn't had a trial but when I legged Grant (Cooksley) on I told him his work had been first-class," she said.

"He has been in work the whole time but since the firm ground can tickle him up you just have to look after him and wait until he tells you he's right.

"He's done that recently so we're back racing again."

Cooksley had Seventh Up lobbing along nicely towards the rear of the seven-horse field throughout the early stages of the open 1400m contest before moving him into a challenging position. Asked to sprint at the 300m mark Seventh Up lengthened nicely to quickly take control before easing to the line under a hands and heels ride

to score by a neat length from race favourite Cote D'Or (NZ) (Makfi).

Although Hale is keen to make it back to back victories in the time-honoured Easter mile she does harbour thoughts of a more immediate goal for her charge.

"The Easter is definitely a goal, but we'll just see how he does this week," she said.

"We might have a go at the Group Two race next weekend."

Hale was referring to the Gr.2 Windsor Park Stud Japan Trophy (1600m) that will be held at Matamata after Racing Tauranga had to transfer both of their back-to-back Saturday meetings due to issues with the surface at its traditional Gate Pa venue.

The Auckland Racing Club's Gr.2 Easter Handicap (1600m) will be run at Pukekohe on 21 April due to the track renovation programme that commenced at Ellerslie following the conclusion of their Auckland Cup Week carnival last week. – NZ Racing Desk

HINERANGI MAKES IT THREE ON END WITH TRENTHAM VICTORY

Progressive Cambridge mare **Hinerangi** (Fastnet Rock) enhanced her burgeoning reputation as she completed a winning treble when leading all the way over 1600 metres at Trentham on the weekend.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman trained four-year-old had tripped south to score at the venue in rating 65 company on Wellington Cup day in January after breaking her maiden status at Tauranga in December.

Despite rising in grade to rating 75 company and resuming from an eight week break from the track, the Fastnet Rock mare never looked in danger as rider Matt Cameron rated her nicely in front to score a comfortable three-quarters of a length victory.

Co-trainer Andrew Forsman admitted to some pre-race concerns over the gap between races for the mare, but those worries were quickly dismissed when she received an easy time of it in front.

"We were a little worried about the space between her races, especially if it turned into a bit of a slog," he said.

"It's not easy to lead all the way at Trentham but she ended up getting a pretty comfortable trip where she could dictate to them.

"Matt rated her nicely and she found a good kick when he asked her to go. He did say she would probably have been better if he could have taken a trail but the way the race panned out that wasn't really an option.

"I think as she gets into a better grade there is likely to be more speed on so the turn of foot she does have will certainly be an asset."

Forsman believes maturity has been the key to the mare's improved showings in this campaign with better things to come next season.

"She is a big boned mare who was quite weak early on," he said.

"She just needed time to mature into her frame and this time in she is showing the benefits as she has strengthened up nicely.

"We're in no hurry with her and will continue to take her through the grades but eventually you would think she could certainly get to stakes company based on what she has shown us.

"She is likely to have one or two more runs before we tip her out although that will depend on the tracks as she won't handle it when it gets really wet."

Hinerangi races in the familiar green and gold colours of her breeder and co-owner Christopher Grace who was on-course to celebrate the victory.

JOHNSON GETS THE JOB DONE ON FEISTY CUSTOMER

The experience and guile of leading rider Chris Johnson was on display for all to see as he guided enigmatic mare **Euphoria (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) to victory in the opening event at Trentham on Saturday.

The talented Rip Van Winkle mare has a reputation of being a real handful at times and she looked to be in that sort of mood when she started to over-race during the early stages of the Dixon and Dunlop Premier (1400m).

Johnson was having none of it as he calmly kept her on an even keel as she settled down during the mid-stages before easing her to the outside of the seven-horse field to make her

challenge. Balanced up at the 300m mark Euphoria produced a sustained burst of speed to snatch victory in the final few strides from The Bandito (NZ) (Pins), who fought gamely after making the pace throughout.

Johnson was his usual unassuming self as he discussed the ride after the race.

“She can go a little bit fierce which is just the way she is,” he said.

“After we had gone a couple of furlongs she was quite alright about it.

“I thought I might have been a bit handier in a small field, but she had a couple of lengths to make up which she did.

“I was always travelling well but I did wonder how much she would find when she got to the outside, but she found enough.”

Trainer Rachael Frost was succinct about the key to the mare’s ability as she discussed what was in store for her.

“She’s just an angry b%&ch,” she said.

“She didn’t relax as well as she needed to, but she’ll get

there.

“We generally give her three weeks between runs, but we might go to Awapuni in a fortnight or maybe wait another week.”

The victory was the first leg of a winning double for Johnson who took out the day’s main event, the Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand Oaks (2400m), on Savvy Coup (NZ) (Savabeel) later in the programme.

POP STAR PRINCESS IMPRESSES AT ROTORUA

Promising three-year-old **Pop Star Princess (NZ)** (Makfi) backed up her stunning debut performance at Matamata recently by breaking her maiden status with ease at Rotorua on the weekend.

The Makfi filly had impressed many when she fought on determinedly for second at Matamata behind the well performed Contessa Vanessa (NZ) (Bullbars) in an open three-year-old contest, in the process beating home Group One winner Age Of Fire (Fastnet Rock).

Trainer Fred Cornege didn't hesitate to tackle a similar event on Saturday and although once again facing a field of race winners, Pop Star Princess would not be denied as she dealt to her rivals with a bold front-running display.

Expertly handled by Lynsey Satherley, Pop Star Princess set up a moderate tempo in front before being asked to quicken approaching the home turn. Hotly challenged in the run home by Matamata filly Short Fuse (NZ) (Per Incanto), Pop Star Princess fought strongly to the line to score by half a length with Beauden (NZ) (Bullbars) running on nicely for third,

Satherley was full of praise for the performance and is predicting there is plenty more in store for the filly.

"She's still quite raw but she's a good filly," she said.

"We didn't go overly hard but turning for home I gave her a kick and

she just went boom.

"She's got that angry little tartiness thing going on and that makes them good."

The victory was mission accomplished for Cornege as he looks to step his charge up to stakes company next month.

"It was a good ride by Lynsey," he said.

"When jockeys of her calibre get on a good horse they can show their ability.

"This filly doesn't pull, she relaxes and can sprint off a solid pace which I think is the sign of a good horse.

"There is another similar three-year-old race in a couple of weeks but hopefully now we have enough points to get into the Cambridge Breeders Stakes."

The Gr.3 Cambridge Breeders Stakes (1200m) will be held at Te Rapa on 28 April.

Pop Star Princess is the second foal of stakes placed Pins mare, Queen Of Pop. The filly was a \$4,000 purchase from the Blandford Lodge draft at the 2015 New Zealand Bloodstock National Weanling Sale.

BLINKERS REMOVAL BRINGS OUT BEST REGARD

A change of gear proved to be a masterstroke for **Lim's Regard (NZ)** (Red Giant) in the \$80,000 Kranji Stakes C race over 1600m on Sunday.

With the Red Giant four-year-old a little headstrong when leading at recent starts, trainer Mark Walker, in consultation with connections, decided they would lose the blinkers this time around.

The upshot was a 13th win for the 2017 Singapore

champion trainer, who is steadily climbing his way back to the place where he dominated proceedings last year. He currently sits in fourth spot, three winners behind leader Steven Burridge.

"He was going a bit keen in his recent races. I spoke to Mick Dittman (racing manager) and we decided to take the blinkers off," said Walker.

"He's a horse who should get 2000m. I'll have a chat with Mr Lim (Siah Mong of Lim's Stable) and we will probably give him a freshen-up now."

Rider Vlad Duric said it was the pre-race battle plan to sit in a one-one position, and not leave his challenge too late.

"We were able to sit outside the leader, and he was relaxed throughout," said the leading jockey.

"He jumped fresh and was able to back off the leader. I knew I had to attack early as the pacemaker had a pretty soft lead."

Lim's Regard has now taken his record to three wins and two seconds from 12 starts for stakes earnings past the \$160,000 mark for the Lim's Stable.
