SPIETH READY FOR LONG-RANGE DARLEY PLAN



Victory in tomorrow's Gr. 1 Darley Sprint would see the culmination of an ambitious long range plan for exciting sprinter Spieth

rainer Bryce Heys has had his eye on the Darley Classic since before **Spieth (NZ)** (Thorn Park) had his first race start.

Spieth lines up in Saturday's Group One sprint coming off a last-start win at Randwick.

The Warwick Farm-based Heys kicked off Spieth's career in Melbourne last spring, but was already thinking 12 months ahead.

"For one reason or another things didn't work out," Heys said.

"Twelve months ago I had a lot of belief in the horse's ability.

"I had a frank discussion with everyone to say we could get into this race if you let me go back to the drawing board with him and teach him how to be a racehorse."

Spieth bumped into Secret Agenda (Not A Single Doubt)

at Sandown in September last year before an easy win at Pakenham.

He was then turned out for a spell after running seventh in the Caulfield Guineas Prelude.

Spieth returned in the autumn with a 10th behind Japonisme (Choisir) in the Arrowfield Sprint at Randwick before winning four consecutive races.

Included in that sequence was a straight-track victory over 1100 metres at Flemington that was part of the plan heading towards Saturday's race.

"The racing and the winning has helped his confidence in terms of maturity," Heys said.

"But I was never getting ahead of myself.

"I was just worried about putting him in the right races and doing the right thing by the horse."

Heys kept Spieth in Sydney for a first-up assault on the City Tattersalls Lightning Stakes at Randwick knowing there was improvement to come.

But Heys knows Saturday's Group One race is a tough assignment.

"Everyone in our camp has got their feet firmly on the ground," Heys said.

"It's been a long range plan that we were going to have to run against Chautauqua but even with him not there we know how hard it's going to be."

UGO FOSCOLO PRIMED FOR 2000 GUINEAS

ambridge trainer
Stephen Marsh
is flush with
excitement on the eve
of **Ugo Foscolo's (NZ)**(Zacinto) tilt at Saturday's
Gr.1 Sothys 44th New
Zealand 2000 Guineas at
Riccarton.

"I'm really happy with him. He hasn't missed a beat. I can't fault him at all." Marsh said.

Ugo Foscolo goes into the 1600m Classic as a winner of four of his five starts, his one defeat coming when sixth in the Gr.2 Hawke's Bay Guineas (1400m) at Hastings last month.

However, the Zacinto Ugo Foscol gelding bounced back from that defeat when he exacted revenge on Hawke's Bay Guineas winner Mongolian Falcon (Fastnet Rock) in winning the Gr.2 James & Annie Sarten Memorial Stakes (1400m) at Te Rapa on Labour Day.

Saturday's race will be Ugo Foscolo's first attempt at 1600m and it's that uncertainty that stops Marsh from declaring his horse in the feature.

"The only question mark you can put on Ugo Foscolo is whether he will run out a strong 1600m - and that's my only concern," Marsh said.

"But he knows how to win. He

knows where the finishing line is and that will hold him in pretty good stead. If that's the only concern with him, I still wouldn't swap him with any other horse in the race."

Ugo Foscolo flew to Christchurch on Wednesday and had settled in well, Marsh reported.

"He had a bit of a trot and canter this morning and he's thriving," Marsh said, adding that he felt for rival northern connections who had their travel plans disrupted when the scheduled flight to Christchurch on Thursday had to be cancelled due to fog at the destination.

"Thank God we didn't travel down today. It's not ideal for those horses and we do have some empathy for them too because that's what happened to us last year with No More Tears in the 1000 Guineas."

Marsh said Ugo Foscolo would spell after the 2000 Guineas ahead of autumn racing which could see him campaigned in Australia.

"He'll definitely go to the paddock straight after this one. We'll bring him back when he tells us he's ready and then we'll hopefully look at tackling some good races in the autumn."

Turn Me Loose (NZ) (Iffraaj)

Darley tilt for Turn Me Loose

Cambridge trainer Murray Baker believes Saturday's Gr.1 Darley Classic (1200m) might be too short for multiple Group One winner **Turn Me Loose (NZ)**, but says the Iffraaj stallion deserves his chance.

A Group One winner of the Futurity Stakes at Caulfield over 1400m and the 2000 Guineas at Riccarton and the Emirates Stakes at Flemington, both over 1600m, Turn Me Loose was eighth resuming over 1100m in the Schillaci Stakes at Caulfield last month.

It was the first time he had contested a race at a distance shorter than 1400m since just his third start in August 2014.

"He's absolutely thriving, but the race is probably too short for him. We're giving him his chance and he is really going well," Baker said.

Group One test of Cameron's opinion

Matt Cameron will be in the hot seat at Riccarton where his judgement will face a classic test.

The top jockey has opted to ride **Hall Of Fame (NZ)** (Savabeel) over stablemate **Heroic Valour** (Fastnet Rock) in Saturday's
Gr.1 Sothys NZ 2000 Guineas.

"I'm damned if I do and damned if I don't, but I had to make a decision," Cameron said.

Cameron, who won the Guineas on Xtravagant (NZ) (Pentire) last year, rode Hall Of Fame and Heroic Valour in work at Riccarton on Tuesday morning for trainers Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards before making his mind up.

"They both worked really well and it probably came down to ringcraft," he said. "Hall Of Fame can race on the pace and take bad luck out of the equation. Full story here.

Smart colt to relish classic trip

Improving colt **Cha Siu Bao** (Smart Missile) won't be taking any backward steps when he steps up to a mile for the first time at Riccarton on Saturday.

There is a sense of timing about the well-related three-year-old, who will make

his stakes debut in the Gr.1 Sothys NZ 2000 Guineas.

"Both of his wins have been encouraging and he is a bit of the unknown horse in the race, but he warrants his position in the field and one thing we do know is that he will stay the 1600 metres," said Andrew Scott, who prepares Cha Siu Bao with Lance O'Sullivan.

"Certainly on his dam's side it suggests that the trip will be no problem."

By Smart Missile, he is out of the Stravinsky mare Ballet Society, a Group Two winner up to a mile in Australia and a half-sister to the Gr.1 Kelt Capital Stakes (2000m) winner Cent Home (NZ) (Lord Ballina). Full

Marathon trip doesn't bother Kawi

The long haul to Perth hasn't fazed the multiple Group One winner **Kawi (NZ)** (Savabeel).

The star New Zealand galloper was flown to Australia last Saturday and after an overnight stay in Melbourne he continued on to Western Australia.

Kawi has settled in well in his new surroundings and trainer Allan Sharrock said the Savabeel six-year-old was taking everything in his stride ahead of Saturday's Gr.2 Lee Steere Stakes at Ascot.

"He's done terrifically well and I just couldn't be any happier with him. He had a gallop, not at high speed, here on Wednesday morning and he went very, very well."

Sharrock has Kawi boarding at the stables of Daniel Morton, who has the former Gai Waterhouse-trained entire Pornichet (Vespone), last year's Gr.1 Doomben Cup winner and fourth in the first of Winx's two Gr.1 Cox Plates, in the Lee Steere.

"Everybody has bent over backwards to help us out and everything is going well," Sharrock said.

Even though he expects Kawi to prove ultra-competitive in his opening run, he said the gelding will improve with the outing.

"I did all the work with him at home and he's right where I would want him to be. They'll know he's there on Saturday."

Safely through the weekend, Kawi will take aim at Ascot's two major prizes - the \$A1 million Gr.1 Railway Stakes on November 19 and the \$A1 million Gr.1 Kingston Town Classic on December 3.

He will be ridden by Michael Walker, who served his apprenticeship with Sharrock and is now based in Victoria.

Nymph Monte thriving in the south

Danielle Johnson takes the ride on **Nymph Monte (NZ)** (Tavistock) in Saturday's Listed Gold Club Metropolitan Trophy Handicap (2500m) at Riccarton as the five-year-old plots a course to the Gr.3 Christchurch Casino New Zealand Cup.

Trainer Grant Nicholson is confident the last start Listed Spring Classic (2000m) winner will be effective up in distance.

"We just want to see him drop the bit and do the same as last time. He's improved out of his run last time because there was a month between races. He's loving it down here. It's like he's on a road trip with the boys."

Barbaric defends sprint title

Barbaric (NZ) (Pins) goes into Saturday's Listed Legacy Lodge Sprint at Te Rapa without a run since July, but Cambridge trainer Stephen Marsh well remembers his fresh-up win in the same race last year.

"It was a top win in this race last year. He broke the track record with Lee Magorrian up," Marsh said.

Barbaric tackles a strong field in the 1400m feature that has attracted Group One performers Ryan Mark (NZ) (Thorn Park) and Natuzzi (NZ) (Coats Choice) as well as the likes of Mosse (NZ) (O'Reilly), Start Wondering (NZ) (Eighth Wonder), Bonniegirl (NZ) (Darci Brahma), Close Up (NZ) (Shinko King) and Southern Icon (Big Brown).

"He races well fresh and he's in well at the weights with 55 kilos. He trialled well the other day," Marsh said.



Gerald Mosse

Top rider Mosse books himself for Te Rapa

Internationally successful jockey Gerald Mosse has jumped at the opportunity to partner his namesake at Te Rapa on Saturday.

The 49-year-old Frenchman is a long-time friend of Cambridge trainer John Bell and a phone call between the pair earlier this week has resulted in the champion rider partnering **Mosse (NZ)** (O'Reilly) in the Listed Legacy Lodge Sprint.

"Gerald and I have been mates for 20-odd years," Bell said. "I used to sell horse feed all

around Asia for about 18 years and through that I got to know Gerald and I used to stay with him in Hong Kong a lot.

"We've been buddies for a long time and I was talking to Gerald a few nights ago when he was in Singapore and he asked me what Mosse was doing and I told him he was running on Saturday and he said he would come down and ride him." Full story here.



Rageese (Street Cry)

Windsor Park celebrate Flemington success

Part-owned by New Zealand based Windsor Park Stud, blue-blooded Street Cry stallion **Rageese** returned to top form at Flemington on Thursday with a strong finishing win in the Gr.3 VRC L'Oreal Paris Stakes (1400m).

Second in the Gr.1 ATC Sires Produce Stakes at two behind Pride of Dubai (Street Cry), Rageese was also fourth in the Gr.1 Golden Rose and fifth in the Gr.1 Caulfield Guineas at three.

A homebred for Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum, Rageese was transferred to the care of Darren Weir earlier this year and has made good progress for his new trainer.

Ridden by Damian Lane, Rageese powered to the line to win the 1400 metre sprint going away, by a length taking his overall record to four wins from 17 starts with prizemoney topping \$550,000.

"It was an important win for his career after racing," said Darren Weir.

"We targeted this race and now hopefully he can go on to Perth for the Railway Stakes."

Rageese is out of Rabsha, a Dehere half-sister to Listed UAE Oaks winner Raihana from the family of champion mare Emancipation.

Winds or Park Stud will also be represented by future stallion **Vanbrugh** (Encosta De Lago) in the Gr.1 Emirates Stakes (2000m) on Saturday, with the entire also in line for a trip to Perth.

Anaheim Bags Derby Consolation

Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young broke new ground in their adopted home city in

Melbourne on Thursday, getting their first city winner since moving to Australia on Oaks Day, no less, with **Anaheim** (Fastnet Rock).

The NZB graduate missed a run in the AAMI Victoria Derby as second emergency, but picked up a handy consolation prize in the Listed TCL QUHD TV Stakes (1800m) for the Cranbourne training partnership.

"He won at Benalla, and only had \$22,500 stake money, which usually gets in, but this year it didn't unfortunately. We were balloted two, and didn't get a run," cotrainer Young explained.

Anaheim was purchased for \$160,000 from the draft of Wellfield Lodge at the 2015 NZB Premier Sale and will be targeted towards Derbys in Adelaide, Sydney and Brisbane next year.

The Busuttin-Young team will be out for further carnival rewards, with **Ceylon (NZ)** (Cape Blanco) a leading chance in the Listed Hilton Stakes (1400m) at Flemington on Saturday.

A habitual winner, the hard as nails frontrunner was never headed on his way to victory in the Gr.3 OMF Stakes.

"He got it all his own way and we

"He is a professional little horse and very smart. He will have a little break now and then go on the Karaka Million if we can qualify."

Bred by Christopher Grace, Hard Merchandize was purchased by Vile for \$38,000 from the Little Avondale draft at the 2016 NZ Bloodstock Select sale.

Top Kiwi mare retired

A leg injury has forced the retirement of

Raced by Wellingtonian Lib Petagna, the daughter of Savabeel won the Vinery Stud Stakes and the Turnbull Stakes in 2014 and earlier this year she also claimed the Queen Elizabeth Stakes for trainer Kris Lees.

Lucia Valentina won her first two races, including the Gr.3 Wellington Stakes, from Stephen Marsh's stable before she crossed the Tasman.



Euphoria (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle)

Trainer's focus on 1000 Guineas

In-form three-year-old **Euphoria (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) will make just one classic appearance at the New Zealand Cup carnival.

Trainer Rachael Frost had designs on both this Saturday's Gr.1 Sothys NZ 2000 Guineas and the Gr.1 gavelhouse.com NZ 1000 Guineas a week later with the filly, but a missed run at Wellington last month due to a heavy track changed those plans.

"I would have liked to have gone to Trentham because that would have left open the option of going to the 2000 Guineas, but she'll be saved for the 1000 Guineas only now," the Otaki horsewoman said.

He has been booked to ride Imperium (NZ) (Encosta de Lago) in the Gr.3 Christchurch Casino New Zealand Cup, provided the Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards-trained stayer runs up to expectation in Saturday's Listed Gold Club Metropolitan Trophy.



Remembering our Hall Of Fame Heroes

Horlicks- record breaking champion mare and producer

Horlicks, by Three Legs out of Malt, won 17 of her 40 starts, chalking up six Group One victories in three countries. She won both the million-dollar DB Draught Classic and the New Zealand Stakes twice.

In the spring of 1989 she won the

weight-for-age Mackinnon
(Emirates) Stakes at Flemington
and followed it up three weeks
later with a win in the \$3 million
Japan Cup (2400m) in world record
time for trainers Dave and Paul
O'Sullivan.

She was retired from racing the following year, with career earnings of \$A3.2 million.

A super mare on the track, Horlicks later became a very successful broodmare. At stud she left 13 foals with Brew (NZ) (Sir Tristram), the winner of the Melbourne Cup in 2000, the most notable. One of her daughters, Latte (NZ) (Maroof), produced the 2007 AJC Australian Derby winner

Fiumicino (NZ) (Zabeel).

Horlicks died peacefully at Cambridge stud in August 2011 and is buried at her owner breeder Graham de Gruchy's Hawke's Bay property.
