## GILT COMPLEX SCORES THRILLER IN **DESTER SINGAPORE GOLD CUP**



Gilt Complex (inner) drives hard to snatch victory from Bahana

n a nail-biting drive to the wire, Gilt Complex (NZ) (Gold Centre) snuck up on the inside to poke his nose in front where it mattered in the S\$1.35 million Dester Singapore Gold Cup (2200m) on Sunday.

By landing the third and final Leg of the Singapore Triple Crown series, the Gold Centre six-year-old, who captured the second Leg, the Raffles Cup (1800m) three weeks earlier, also took home a bonus of \$\$50,000.

After coming close a few times, trainer Cliff Brown was savouring his first victory in the time-honoured race, which was incidentally the last of its kind being run over 2200m as it will be shortened to 2000m from next year onwards.

Long touted as a trainer of stayers, even back in Australia where he holds the record of most South Australian Derbies - three, Brown was his usual self-effacing self at the winner's circle, but did admit that winning the most coveted race at his new stomping ground in the last 10 years was a moment he would treasure forever.

"It means a great deal to win the Singapore Gold Cup,

especially after I've had a few placings in that race," said Brown whose closest placings include Deep Pockets' third and Tenzing's fourth in the 2012 renewal won by Better Life.

"The kids at home will be rapt. I was like a kid myself when they called for the photo, I was walking up and down, up and down, and I let out a big roar when No 2 went up."

Brown was actually plumping for another horse inside the last furlong of the staying test – Elite Excalibur (Fastnet Rock), the much-vaunted former Coolmore stayer from the Gai Waterhouse yard who was being the hailed the winner when he came locking horns with last year's winner Bahana (NZ) (Elusive City).

Just when gold was being tossed up between the two horses, Gilt Complex, who had bronze around his neck then, suddenly turned into a live contender as Rodd came up with the brilliant inspiration to steer back to the inside running rails.

Maybe it was the uninterrupted run that suddenly resurfaced for him, but Gilt Complex grew another leg when it mattered as he lunged at the line to make it a three-way photo right at the death.

The proverbial pimple split the pair in the end, with Elite Excalibur having to settle for third another short head away. Sent out as the second favourite, Gilt Complex completed the 2200m trip in 2min 14.37secs to bring up his eighth win at Kranji for New Zealand owners Graham Mackie and Trish Dunell for stakes earnings that have now edged past the \$1.5 million mark.

"Michael said he found a second wind at the 600m, I actually thought he wouldn't stay the trip," said Brown.

"Elite Excalibur was fantastic, but Bahana is such a natural stayer. It was a fantastic result."

Rodd, who is at his third season in Singapore and has already captured big races such as the Emirates Singapore Derby, the Panasonic Kranji Mile, the Raffles Cup, the Singapore Three-Year-Old Challenge Triple Crown, can now add the Dester Singapore Gold Cup to his glowing resume.

Usually the epitome of coolness at the winner's circle, the Australian jockey could barely keep his composure this time around as the enormity of having won the Singapore Gold Cup took a while to sink in.

"I thought he was gone at the 600m. I was just tacking up behind the horse in front and I thought I would run a nice fourth." said Rodd.

"But he found another gear when I took him to the fence, he was just pushing himself to get there and it's just so amazing to win the Gold Cup."

Gilt Complex was a \$10,000 purchase at the Festival session of the 2013 NZB National Yearling Sale from the Newmarket Lodge draft.

# NEXT 24 HOURS CRUCIAL FOR GINGERNUTS

CT scan this morning will determine the immediate future for popular kiwi galloper **Gingernuts** (NZ) (Iffraaj) who suffered a serious injury during his preliminary for the Gr. 1 Emirates Stakes (2000m) at Flemington on Saturday.

The four-year-old fractured a near front pastern as he was cantering to the start of the feature race and required immediate veterinary attention. The gelding was loaded onto the horse ambulance and taken to the University of Melbourne Veterinary Clinic in Werribee where the injury was diagnosed.

Co-trainer Jamie Richards was feeling a little more upbeat on Sunday morning after witnessing the event on television on Saturday afternoon where he was watching on in the aftermath of the triumph of stablemate Embellish (NZ) (Savabeel) in the Gr. 1 Al Basti Equiworld New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m).

"We were like everyone else at that stage in that we didn't really know what had happened and all we could see was the horse with people milling around him," he said.

"Once they got him to the clinic the picture became a little clearer and as of Sunday it looks a lot brighter for the horse than what was initially thought.

"He has fractured his near side pastern which he will have scanned on Monday to determine what surgery may or may not be required and the full extent of the injury.

"The reports on Sunday have been quite positive and once we get the scan results we will know whether or not he will be able to make it back to the track.

"He will have a long break ahead of him but there is certainly a possibility he could race again."

Richards was philosophical about the incident which could have been a lot worse had it occurred during the race.

"It's a bitter blow for his owners and the team at Te Akau

but we are very thankful it happened when it did and not during the race," he said.

"It's just one of those things that can happen in racing and you do have to take the bad with the good."

Richards admitted while it was difficult witnessing the scenes in Melbourne he was still on a high following the win by Embellish.

"David Ellis bought this horse to win the 2000 Guineas so when you can achieve a result like we did then it makes it a very special occasion," he said.

"He was bought with the intention of making a stallion career for him and a win like this will do nothing but enhance that opportunity for him as he is a very good galloper."

The McKee pair were caught up in heavy traffic congestion during their journey to Te Rapa with their transporter arriving on-course considerably later than planned. The delay had no ill-effects on either

runner with Neeson taking out the fifth event on the card with a gritty on speed performance before Shadows produced a last-to-first effort in the final event of the day.

McKee, who was in Christchurch with Gr. 1 Al Basti Equiworld New Zealand 2000 Guineas contender Star Treasure (NZ) (Lonhro), was blissfully unaware of the situation until told about it on Sunday afternoon.

"I'm glad I didn't know about it on the day or it may have had me worried," he said. "I just managed to watch both races on the television and it was exciting to see them both put up a good performance."

McKee, who has made a slow start to the season, was pleased to get a brace of wins on the scorecard.

"Neeson had gone well at his last start so I was expecting him to be thereabouts, but it was a very strong field for that grade of horse," he said.

"He had to be tough as he was wide early on and then did the donkey work

outside the speed. He was headed quite clearly in the run home but fought back nicely to grab a good win.

"He has started to relax well in his races and I think he could get up to a mile during this campaign, so we will take him along quietly and see if he can make it through the grades."

Neeson is raced by Auckland Racing Club Board member Daniel Nakhle and his father Elias who also raced the O'Reilly gelding's dam, Group Two winner Irish Colleen (NZ) (Shinko King).

Four-year-old Thewayyouare gelding Shadows put up one of the performances of the day when he rounded up a quality field of rating 75 gallopers from last in the final event on the card.

"His was a top run as well as it was only his second start in this campaign," said McKee.

"We've always fancied him as a handy stayer in the making but he was just too immature to really cope with a middle distance as a three-year-old.

"He's come back far stronger this time in and he showed that with the way he picked them up pretty quickly

### STARVOIA BACK BIGGER AND BETTER

o-trainer Karen Parsons was giving little away prior to the start of Saturday's Rating 75 1100m contest at Riccarton as she discussed the prospects for the return of injury plagued mare **Starvoia** (Starcraft).

The now four-year-old mare was making her return to the racetrack off an eight-month break that was necessitated due to some niggling issues she had experienced during her three-year-old campaign.

Parsons had been pleased with the mare's progress despite a few glitches and was expecting a tidy performance from her charge, but even she was nearly lost for words after the daughter

of Starcraft produced a devastating burst of speed that carried her past her rivals in the twinkling of an eye at the business end of the contest.

"That was unbelievable, absolutely unbelievable," she said as she waited for the mare to return to the Riccarton birdcage.

"We've had no pressure from her owners as they waited to see her back racing, so I'm thrilled for them."

Rider Chris Johnson was equally impressed by the performance.

"She's enormous and with this being her first run this prepit's just so good to see her come back like this," he said.

"She had the blinkers on for her last campaign, but we took them off for this one as she is such an honest horse and tries hard all the time.

"She was travelling sweetly all the way but she even surprised me with just how quickly she picked them up and she won easily."

Parsons revealed she and husband John hadn't made any further plans for the mare, preferring to see how she came through the race before contemplating their options during the summer months.

It was the mare's 4th victory from 10 career starts that also include four placings at stakes level that were achieved during her three-year-old campaign.

# OAKS PATH LIKELY FOR IMPRESSIVE RICCARTON WINNER

mpressive three-year-old filly **Savvy Coup (NZ)** (Savabeel) could be on the path towards a start in the Gr. 1 Al Basti Equiworld New Zealand Oaks (2400m) following her decisive maiden victory at Riccarton on Saturday.

Trainers Michael and Matthew Pitman have made no secret of the high regard they have for the Savabeel filly who delivered in style over 1400m in the hands of last season's champion jockey, Chris Johnson.

Johnson produced one of his trademark efforts to have the filly relaxed nicely behind the early speed before easing into the clear to issue a challenge shortly after entering the home straight. While his rivals were getting desperate at the 200m mark

Johnson had yet to release the brakes on his charge, who had travelled effortlessly to the front at that stage.

Johnson eased a tight grip on the reins at that point and the filly bounded away under a hands and heels ride to score by two and a quarter lengths, without being asked for a serious effort.

Co-trainer Matthew Pitman was a happy man when questioned immediately after the race.

"Chris has a great knack of getting horses to relax for him and that certainly showed today," he said.

"At the 300m mark she was travelling beautifully and he hadn't moved on her, so I had quite a big smile on my face then. "She's been lining up in stakes races all the way through and had been a tad unlucky, so we thought she was up to that grade.

"Dropping back to the maidens today she showed her class."

Pitman admitted the stable had big plans for the filly which could include a tilt at the Oaks in March.

"We hope that she can get up to an Oaks trip later on," he said.

"She will have to learn to relax a little better, but she recovers so well after her races that we think she is the type who could take on an Oaks prep."

Savvy Coup is the second foal of Pins mare Eudora (NZ) who is a sister to dual Group Three winner Legless Veuve (NZ) and 2010 Gr. 1 Telegraph Handicap runner-up Tootsie (NZ). Savvy Coup was a \$65,000 purchase from the Waikato Stud draft during the Premier session of the 2016 NZB National Yearling Sale at Karaka."

### MORE OFFERS LIKELY FOR AMANAAT

oowoomba trainer Ben Currie expects to get more offers for smart restricted class sprinter **Amanaat** (Per Incanto) after the gelding made it four straight wins for the stable.

Amanaat is looming as one of the best buys Currie has ever made on his regular trips to dispersal sales in NSW and Victoria.

The gelding was a winner at Pakenham at his first race start but then failed at Flemington and Mornington in two more starts in Victoria for Lindsay Park.

Currie was able to pick him up for just \$5000 at a dispersal sale earlier this year and he has won four of five starts for the stable including his victory at Doomben on Saturday.

"He hasn't got the best-looking legs, but he has been as sound as a bell for us up here," Currie said.

"If there is a problem with him he can get a stirred up in the barriers. It was the reason for his only defeat here when he was second at the Sunshine Coast at his first go for us.

"But we are working hard on him and he has now won four in a row."

Currie said after Amanaat won at Ipswich he had fielded offers for the gelding from "overseas".

"I think they will be back on the phone now, but the price has gone up," Currie said.

The victory of Amanaat continues a remarkable run of success for Little Avondale Stud based stallion Per Incanto who has produced 9 individual winners and 8 placings over an 8-day period.





# KINGSMAN PUTS IT TOGETHER FOR WALKER DOUBLE

hampion-elect trainer Mark Walker stretched his massive lead in the Singapore premiership by another two winners when he claimed the first two races on Singapore's biggest raceday on Sunday.

The New Zealander, who did not saddle a runner in the Dester Singapore Gold Cup, was still snaring his share of the limelight with a couple of winners on the undercard.

After **She's The One (NZ)** (Murtajill) stormed home late to claim the first race, the \$38,000 Causeway Bay Stakes, a Kranji Stakes D Division 2 race over 1400m, newcomer **Kingsman (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) doubled the dose for Walker in almost identical style – right at the eleventh hour.

Walker's unassailable lead on Shane Baertschiger has now been extended to 26 winners (84 winners versus 58 winners).

A four-year-old by Darci Brahma, Kingsman

is a horse who came to Walker with a bit of hype via Chris Rutten, a respected horseman in New Zealand.

"He's a horse who's run in Group races (including a third place in Group 3 company) back home. He was gelded before he came here," said Walker.

"Chris Rutten raced him there and has a high opinion of him. Chris used to pre-train horses and has a great eye for horses; he raced Our Touche with us before he went to Malaysia.

"He did all right in New Zealand, and I gave him a chance first-up as he was well prepared."

Whenever he gets a chance, Walker doesn't fail to plug the champion sire he used to train during his glory days in New Zealand – Darci Brahma.

"These Darci Brahma's just thrive here. They are quite relaxed and do very well here," said Walker who won the New Zealand premiership five times and Singapore once in 2015.

"The stakes money is not too flash for geldings back home, and that's why Chris decided to send this one up here."

Duric said Kingsman, who is now owned by the Te Akau Racing Stable, is destined for better things as he gets to settle in at his new home.

"He's a nice horse and he was fresh and fit for today. He was well prepared by Mark," said the leading jockey.

"He will improve from today's run and he's got a nice future here."

As for She's The One, a four-year-old mare by Murtajill, she was picking up her second win from 15 starts in Singapore for stakes earnings in excess of \$60,000 for the Synthetic Stable.
