SAVABEEL SNARES ANOTHER AUSTRALIAN STAKES WINNER



Waikato Stud super sire Savabeel

mproving three-year-old filly **Samovare** (Savabeel) provided Waikato Stud sire Savabeel with another feather in his cap when she stormed clear to score in Saturday's Gr. 3 W.A. Champion Fillies Stakes (1600m) at Ascot in Perth.

The powerful filly took full advantage of a heady ride by jockey Brad Parnham as she dashed to the lead at the top of the Ascot straight before comfortably holding out the challenge of race favourite Ellicazoom (ridden by Parnham's brother Steven and trained by father Neville) by a length at the winning post. The victory was a tactical triumph for Parnham and trainer Daniel Morton who had cooked up the winning formula before the race.

"I thought the only way to beat my dad's horse was to put my one into the race early," explained Parnham.

"We had to give his horse something to chase which was a bit of a risk but it paid off in the end.

"I've got this filly down as an Oaks horse as she is a real big, nice type who will grow into an even better horse next prep."

Morton was full of praise for the ride after Parnham had followed their pre-race tactics perfectly.

"We discussed a fair few things before the race but in the end I just said to Brad to come out normal and then weigh up your options," noted Morton.

"We had an inkling there would be some good speed to follow which worked out well.

"I told him not to die wondering as she will run a good mile out, make them chase you.

"She's a classic filly. I wasn't joking when I said I haven't put a saddle on a nicer filly."

Samovare became Savabeel's 32nd Group winner and

54th individual stakes winner as his most successful New Zealand son, Kawi (NZ), looks to provide further Australian Group One success for his illustrious father when he tackles the Gr. 1 Railway Stakes (1600m) at Ascot this Saturday.

Saturday's Gr. 1 gavelhouse.com 1000 Guineas winner La Diosa

t was a confident plan with that confidence shared by the punters and, on a day when a couple of well favoured runners were rolled, glory belonged to **La Diosa (NZ)** (So You Think).

The South Island-trained filly gave her dual Cox Plate winning sire So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral) his first Group One winner when she fulfilled expectations in Saturday's gavelhouse. com 1000 Guineas at Riccarton.

Those expectations were formed many months earlier according to Gordon Calder, one of those who share in the ownership of the filly. They were set down at a roundtable discussion designed to establish just who would be entrusted with the filly's preparation with this very target in mind.

"She was always a gorgeous filly and the dream was always the 1000 Guineas," said Calder.

Matt and Mandy Brown and their Ngapuke property, with its private training track and "superb attention to detail" came highly recommended at the discussion with the group agreeing that in this case a South Island base

would be an advantage.

"It's great when a plan comes off, because we all know it isn't always the case in racing!" Calder joked on Sunday.

The man behind the plan was the filly's breeder, Whangarei-based Terry Archer, and it was a plan where the seed was planted many years earlier.

"I'd raced mainly colts and geldings," he explained. "I had a group one winner with Z'Oro who won the 1994 Thorndon Mile, but I realised there was no residual value at the end of their careers."

"I thought, someone must be making some money out of this - let's try and buy well-bred fillies."

First up came Showella (NZ) (Lord Ballina), where the appeal for Archer was the fact the daughter of Lord Ballina and Show Queen was a granddaughter of the mighty Show Gate (NZ) (Gate Keeper).

Showella went on to record six wins including Group One successes in the ARC New Zealand Stakes and the South Australian Derby. A foal share arrangement with Coolmore Stud saw Showella's first foal by Danehill purchased by Sheikh Mohammed Bin Khalifa Al Maktoum, racing as Safwa she went on to earn black type and notch up five wins.

"He must've liked what he saw because he came back and bought a colt out of Showella a few years later," Archer said.

The La Diosa story really began with Archer's \$55,000 purchase at the 2000 New Zealand Bloodstock Premier sale of a daughter of Star Way and stakes winning Grosvenor mare, The Grin (NZ).

"Wayne Peters and I bought Star Affair off the Dennis brothers," he said. "She was passed in and I think Frank (Ritchie) ended up signing for her," he recalls.

When quizzed about his apparent affection for South Island female families, Archer is happy to put his hand up as a big fan.

"Absolutely, there are some beautiful families in the South Island," he said.

Star Affair added to her family's record with four wins at 1600m, among them the Gr.2 Travis Stakes before retiring to stud.

After what Archer describes as a run of colts - one Rock of Gibraltar (Group Three winner and Gr. 1 Sydney Cup placegetter Solid Billing) and three Galileos (among them South African Group One placegetter and winner of 5 races Galileo's Galaxy) -Star Affair had an O'Reilly filly which was purchased by Waikato Stud for \$600,000 at the 2010 Premier sale.

"Star Affair got to about 14 and I realised I needed a filly from her to carry on breeding from," he said.

When Star Affair produced a filly by High Chaparral (La Dama), followed by another by So You Think, Archer decided he needed to get a group together to ensure that happened.

That syndicate - Calder Bloodstock Ltd, G L Currie, Bruce Honeybone & Deborah Martin, M L Gibson, P B C Sipos & T W Archer Trust - as listed in Saturday's racebook are retaining those two fillies - La Dama and La Diosa - and a subsequent yearling filly by O'Reilly which will head off to the breakers next March.

While La Diosa is currently leading the New Zealand Bloodstock Filly of the Year series the owners of other three year old fillies may be pleased to hear that is not her ultimate target. She will go for a spell now and probably have one race in New Zealand before heading to Australia in the autumn.

"You can't ignore the prize money on offer in Australia," he said. "Also, Australian black type means so much more when you are selling. The Australians are our biggest market so winning races over there really counts."

Archer is hopeful La Diosa's major target will be the ATC Oaks. "We have reason to believe she will go the distance, she has a half-sibling who was placed over 3200m, but you never know. She will tell us."

HERBERT PREDICTS BIG THINGS FOR TROJAN WARRIOR

espite being beaten by a veritable pencil line in last season's Gr. 1 Easter Stakes, Cambridge galloper **Trojan Warrior (NZ)** (Postponed) can probably lay claim to being the "forgotten" horse when discussions take place around the respective challengers for this year's summer riches.

He may have shed that title at Tauranga on Saturday, however, as he came from last on the home turn, under the steadier of 60 kilograms, to register an impressive victory over some quality opposition in the O'Connor Warren Insurance Brokers sponsored Open 1400 metre handicap.

Although she expected a good performance even trainer Anne Herbert was surprised at just how well her stable star performed.

"He has been a horse that has taken plenty of time but I do think this year could be when we see the best of him," she explained.

"I knew he had come on after his first-up run at Ellerslie but I wasn't quite sure if he was ready to win just yet.

"He had to carry top weight which I thought would make it tough but to his credit he handled them pretty well in the end.

"It was a lovely ride by Cameron (Lammas). He gets on really well with him so hopefully he can stick with us over the summer."

Herbert admitted she doesn't have a plan set in concrete for the gelding's current campaign, preferring to play things by ear as the summer progresses.

"We have deliberately left things fairly loose as I just want see how he comes through his races," she said.

"That said he came home on Saturday night and ate

everything in sight and was feeling pretty good about himself in the morning.

"Provided he does well over the next few days I am looking at the Group Three race at Ellerslie in a fortnight for his next run. The race is run at set weights and penalties so he should get in well under those conditions and his Easter Stakes run proved he can handle that level of opposition."

The Gr. 3 Eagle Technology Stakes is the feature event at Ellerslie on the 26th of November.

SINGAPORE APPRENTICE REPAYS TRAINER'S FAITH AT TAURANGA

rainer Stephen Marsh believes his apprentice Hairi Marzuki has all the attributes to reach the top in his chosen profession after the Singapore born and bred rider produced a copybook effort to guide former top juvenile **Rocanto (NZ**) (Per Incanto) to a brave fresh-up victory at Tauranga on Saturday. Marsh speaks in glowing terms about Marzuki who found his way to Cambridge courtesy of Marsh's Singapore based father, Bruce.

"Dad said to me one day that he had found a young fella who could really ride but just needed a break to go his way," he explained.

"He wasn't getting the rides in

Singapore so Dad asked whether we would be keen to give him a shot down here. He got everything organised and Hairi arrived about four months ago.

"He has fitted in at the stable exceptionally well. He is keen and eager and I definitely think he is

reaping the benefit of having riders like Danielle (Johnson) as part of our stable to learn off.

"He does all the right things and he has come a long way already with his riding."

That progress was evident in the way the apprentice handled Rocanto on Saturday, providing the four-yearold with a saloon passage in the trail behind pacemaker Rich Billie Marsh (NZ) (Viking Ruler) before issuing a powerful challenge early in the run home of the rating 85 1200 metre contest.

Marzuki didn't panic when race favourite Go Nicholas (NZ) (Danroad) loomed on his outer as he made good use of his four kilogram claim to drive the Per Incanto entire home by a bare nose before surviving a protest initiated by the runner-up after the race.

"That was a top ride as he had him in the perfect spot and really kept his head at the finish," said Marsh.

"He stayed nicely balanced and we got a good victory.

"It's a big call by the owners of these horses to put a four kilogram claimer on so I'm delighted to get a result like this."

The victory continued a successful run for Marsh who collected his second career New Zealand Group One win with Ugo Foscolo (NZ) (Zacinto) in the Sothys 2000 Guineas last weekend.

"The stable has been on a roll of late and that win at Riccarton has put a bigger spring in our step," he said.

"The horse has come through the race in good shape although he was a pretty tired boy for a few days afterwards. We gave him a couple of extra days down there but he is now home and enjoying a break in the paddock.

"At this stage we are looking at an autumn campaign in Australia with the Australian Guineas as a real possibility for him."

plucky front-running victory from **Batman** (NZ) (Falkirk) brought a deserved piece of joy to Neill Ridley's stable on Saturday after the Riccarton local had endured a tragic loss just seven days earlier.

Ridley had the misfortune to lose veteran galloper King Montrose (NZ) (King's Chapel) to a raceday incident on the first day of the New Zealand Cup Carnival but had his spirits lifted when his seven-year-old Falkirk gelding led all the way to capture the Mohua Premier Open (1400m).

Superbly rated by northern rider Mark Du Plessis, Batman repelled a serious of home straight challenges to score by half a length from Maybe

Miami (NZ) (Iffraaj) with Wednesday's Gr. 2 Coupland's Bakeries Mile third placegetter Nashville (NZ) (Darci Brahma) filling a similar position on the weekend.

Ridley was philosophical about his contrasting fortunes when interviewed after the victory.

"It was a sad day last week but that's racing and we will just put it behind us," he said.

"This guy is a pretty good galloper. He's not sound but he's pretty honest.

"I think the wee bit further made the difference today."

Batman had run a gallant third on Wednesday in the Gr. 3 Lindauer Steward's Stakes (1200m) with Du Plessis confident he had a fit horse under the saddle for Saturday's contest.

"He led easily over 1200m the other day and I got a very soft lead today," he said.

"There's not a lot of quickening with him as he gets to a

point and then stays at that speed but he did enough today.

"I was confident as I knew from the first day he was fit enough and he let down nicely."

The victory was the first of a double for Du Plessis who scored on former northerner Tiara Concerto (NZ) (Perfectly Ready) later in the programme.
