PARKER TIPS HAT TO TRAINING PARTNER

Gavin Parker is keeping shop while his training partner Graham Richardson is away in Hong Kong and would love to ring up a stakes win for the stable at Ellerslie on Saturday.

Already while Richardson has been away, Parker has ushered in a stable milestone with Paisley Park's (NZ) (Azamour) win at Rotorua on Wednesday registering Richardson's 700th New Zealand winner.

"That's a great achievement for him. That's 699 winners more he's trained than what he rode," Parker quipped in reference to Richardson's solitary winner as a jockey back in 1986.

"Richie plays it down quite a bit but I know how proud he is of what he has done."

Richardson and Parker will seek to add to their memorable week at Ellerslie on Saturday with runners in both stakes races.

Smart Missile filly **Rocket Fuel** takes top billing as the \$3.50 favourite for the Listed Trevor Eagle Memorial (1500m), having run subsequent Gr.1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m) winner Media Sensation (I Am Invincible) to three-quarters of a length when second in the Gr.3 Soliloquy Stakes (1400m) at the same track last month.

"She's still a bit green and while she wouldn't have beaten that filly of Peter's (Williams, co-trainer), she might have run her a bit closer if she'd been a bit more professional. But she's learning all the time and she's going well," Parker said.

"She worked exceptionally on Tuesday morning on the course proper. She cruised through it. We couldn't label her or anything but we'd like to see her carry on the way she's going and we're confident she's in the right condition to be doing that."

Safely through Saturday's race, Rocket Fuel could follow a path through the summer's three-year-old fillies features,

tackling races like the Gr.3 Eulogy Stakes (1600m) at Awapuni on December 14 and the Gr.2 Eight Carat Classic (1600m) at Ellerslie on Boxing Day.

Showcasing filly **Ambitious Showgirl (NZ)** could yet give the stable a second runner in the Trevor Eagle Memorial, though Parker wasn't sure she would start.

In the Gr.3 Eagle Technology Stakes (1600m), Parker is expecting an improved run from **Tiptronic (NZ)** (O'Reilly), who ran second to Ocean Emperor (NZ) (Zabeel) in last season's Gr.2 Japan-New Zealand International Trophy (1600m) at Matamata.

"He's going okay but the concern is the weather. He's not at his best on rain-affected tracks," Parker said.

"At the moment he's a hard horse to place as a Rating 87 horse and finding the right open handicaps for him because there aren't that many around. We needed to give him another run at a mile before we get him over more ground.

"We've always thought he would go over ground, but we haven't got him up to a middle distance yet. He had two trips away in his first two runs back and he hadn't quite turned the

corner with his coat, so we'd like to think he's an improver this weekend.

"He looks good now and his work on Tuesday morning was first-class."

TAB bookmakers have Tiptronic at \$11 for the Eagle Technology Stakes in a market headed by Love Affair (NZ) (Savabeel) at \$2.80.

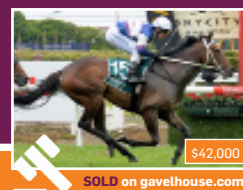
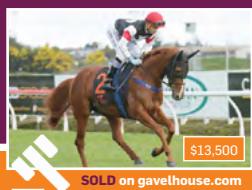
Other runners for the stable at Ellerslie are last-start winner **Suspense (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) in the Dunstan Feeds Stayers Championship Qualifier (2100m) and Bays Foundations 1400 candidate **La Mia Stella (NZ)** (Per Incanto), who needs good ground to show her best, according to Parker.

ANNIE OKAY SHOOTS FOR STAKES SUCCESS

Shaun Clotworthy was quick to recognise **Annie Okay's (NZ)** (Battle Paint) potential - now he's hoping she's swift enough to claim a stakes win at Ellerslie on Saturday.

The Byerley Park trainer will produce Battle Paint filly Annie Okay as one of the leading contenders for Saturday's Listed Trevor Eagle Memorial (1500m) at Ellerslie, her last-start third placing to subsequent Gr.1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m) winner Media Sensation (I Am Invincible) a guide to her credentials.

"She's always shown reasonable ability and taken the right steps forward on raceday," Clotworthy said.

"I've been rapt with both her races so far. She won her maiden well and then stepped up for her stakes placing last start. She's performed admirably and the form looks good out of it too."

TAB bookmakers opened Annie Okay as a \$5.50 third favourite for the Trevor Eagle Memorial behind Rocket Fuel (Smart Missile) at \$3.50 and Jip Jip Rock (High Chaparral) at

\$4.50 as Clotworthy and his wife Emma shoot for their first stakes win as trainers.

Annie Okay was less than half a length from Rocket Fuel when the pair placed in the Gr.3 Soliloquy Stakes (1600m) at Ellerslie behind Media Sensation and Clotworthy was pleased with her progress since that race.

"We gave her a good break between races and she's done well. She's an easy horse around the stable," he said.

"She's got to deal with a bit of an awkward draw on Saturday, but she's been hitting the line well so we'll probably ride her back. Shaun McKay got off her last time and said a mile would be up her alley so the extra distance

should suit her too."

Clotworthy, who ranked Annie Okay as one of the most promising horses he has trained, was hoping for another encouraging performance as he looked ahead to summer three-year-old fillies targets.

"There are some unexposed horses in there so it's a difficult race to assess but we think she can go another good race," he said.

"She's bright and happy and we're looking forward to seeing how she steps up. We'll see how she goes on Saturday but we'd like to have a look at some of those fillies' races coming up. We'll see how she operates here but, as I said, I don't think the mile will be any problem for her."

The Clotworthys will send Diesel (NZ) (Electronic Zone), a runner-up at last Saturday's Counties Cup meeting, to Otaki on Friday and will also produce Florence Ivy (NZ) (Nom Du Jeu), Model Aye (NZ) (Shocking) and Nopele (NZ) (Bullbars) at Ellerslie on Saturday's undercard.

THURLOWS ENJOYING **GLORY DAYS**

Waverley farmer and part-time horse trainer Bill Thurlow thinks **Glory Days (NZ)** (Red Giant) might be the best horse he's trained.

The six-year-old Red Giant mare earned favouritism for Saturday's Listed Wanganui Cup (2040m), with a hat-trick of wins culminating in a home town victory in the Waverley Cup (2200m) last start.

"We haven't raced a huge amount of horses because we sell a lot of the young ones, she's still got to go and do

it but at this stage I'd say potentially she's the best we've had," Thurlow said.

"We've had a couple of other handy stayers, Referred ran second in the New Zealand Oaks (Gr.1, 2400m) and Yours won eight races and ran fourth in a New Zealand Cup (Gr.3, 3200m), but he wasn't quite top-class."

Glory Days is on a path towards the Gr.3 City of Auckland Cup (2400m) at Ellerslie on New Year's Day and after weighing up his options Thurlow has opted to use Saturday's race as her lead-in rather than the Gr.3 Skycity

Hamilton Waikato Cup (2400m) on December 15.

"She's a horse that doesn't need a lot of work and she's better with her races spaced, so I would be happier to give her three weeks between runs after this run," he said.

"There's no lead-up race going the Ellerslie way around at all, so going to Waikato wouldn't make a difference because we would be going the same way around as here."

Glory Days has been patiently

handled by Thurlow, she had her first start as a four-year-old and has only raced 18 times since, for eight wins and six placings.

“She’s a mare that’s taken a long time to mature,” Thurlow said. “There’s not a lot of her and in her younger days she probably wasn’t 100 percent right mentally either.

“She did a good job earlier on over 1400m and a mile and we’ve always been mindful of her wanting to get over ground but she just wasn’t strong enough.

“We let her develop and tell us when she was ready to go further and she was sort of telling us that after her second start this season.

“She’s a bit quirky, every time you get on her back she wants to go and do it and there’s no half measures so we have to be a bit careful of that or she will over-do herself.

“She doesn’t take a lot of work, she

just sort of keeps herself fit, she’s not too hard to train to be honest.”

Glory Days is one of twelve horses in training at the Thurlow family’s Stanley Park which they operate alongside their farming business.

“Only three of them are at racing stage and the rest of them are young unraced horses,” said Thurlow, who pinhooked three-time Group One winner Gingernuts (NZ) (Iffraaj).

“There’s a couple for clients that we won’t be trading but with our own horses we race what’s left if we don’t sell them, that’s what we have to do really to pay the bills.

“Two thirds of our business is still farming. We’ve got a dairy farm which I have some guys on and we run a couple of sheep and beef grazing blocks and the home block.

“Once we’ve finished the horses in the morning we have breakfast and then head out to the farm. My

daughter Emma and the boys look after the horses in the afternoon which is good, but it still takes up a lot of our time.”

Glory Days is raced by Bill’s brother Grant, his wife Patricia, and his neighbours and fellow farmers Brent and Sue McAree.

“Grant used to be a farmer but he’s into Kiwifruit now and living the life at The Mount (Maunganui), while we’re out on the farm doing all the work,” Thurlow said.

“He had bought a couple of horses and had a bad run for a number of years, everything he put his hands on was no good.

“I was talking to Gloria Kenny one day and she said I’ve got three in the paddock here if you’re interested in leasing them and I took two of them and they’ve since exercised their right of purchase on her and they’re very happy.”

Petrabella impresses on debut

Pukekohe trainers Moira and Kieran Murdoch unearthed a promising three-year-old filly at Avondale on Thursday when **Petrabella (NZ)** (Pierro) scored an impressive debut win in the Westbrook 'Crackling Rose' 2017 (1400m).

Sporting the silks of prominent owners Brendon and Jo Lindsay, the home-bred daughter of Pierro came from just off the speed in the hands of Leith Innes to chase down the well-fancied Massachusetts (NZ) (Ferlax) and looks a filly with upside.

Sent out a \$24 chance, Petrabella had trialed on three occasions, finishing unplaced in her first two trials prior to a solid second.

"Her first trial up at Ruakaka was actually very impressive," Moira Murdoch said. "She missed the jump by a mile.

"Her next two trials were on rain-affected ground and we just thought she needed a firm track.

"She had a lovely draw and a lovely trip today.

"She's got a great temperament and I'd say she is quite talented."

Peard impressed with debut win

Byerley Park trainer Allan Peard believes he has another handy filly on his hands after **One Kotukustreet's (NZ)** (Ego) debut win in the AJC On Facebook 1200 at Avondale on Thursday.

The three-year-old daughter of Ego was pushed forward from barrier seven by jockey Sam Spratt to take the early lead. The duo were able to dictate terms throughout with One Kotukustreet distancing her rivals

to win by two and a quarter lengths.

Peard, who trains the three-year-old in partnership with Bruce Wallace, was pleased with the win and believes she is capable of reaching stakes company.

"It was a very nice win first up," he said. "Her trial form was really good. She was never asked to do much at the trials, but today she went straight to the front and is very similar to her full-sister One Bakerstreet, so it's good for the team involved.

"(The only difference is) she is so relaxed and laidback where One Bakerstreet is a bit more fierce, but it's a good win today.

"She's certainly up to stakes level."

Hawke's Bay spring carnival star **Melody Belle (NZ)** (Commands) enjoyed a winning outing at the trials on her home track at Matamata on Tuesday and looks set to add to her Group One haul.

The Jamie Richards-trained mare is unbeaten in three races this season having won the Gr.2 Foxbridge Plate (1200m) at Te Rapa before taking out a Group One double at Hastings with victories in the Tarzino Trophy (1400m) and Windsor Park Plate (1600m).

Melt Sydney bound

Multiple stakes-winning filly **Melt (NZ)** (Iffraaj) will continue her immediate racing future with expat Kiwi trainer Chris Waller in

Sydney.

The daughter of Iffraaj is currently spelling in Christchurch after a successful spring campaign that resulted in two wins and a placing from four starts, including victory in the Gr.3 Cambridge Stud Northland Breeders' Stakes (1200m) at Ruakaka.

"She is still down in Christchurch having a bit of a spell and she's heading to Chris Waller's on Friday, this week," former trainer Nigel Tiley said.

"If she managed to get a bit of black-type over there that's fantastic for her future as a broodmare, but if she doesn't come up, she can always come back and we'll find another path for her."

Melt has won four of her eight starts and finished second to Avantage (Fastnet Rock) in the Gr.1 Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (1400m) as a juvenile.



Starrybeel (NZ) (Savabeel)

Budding stars emerging for Marsh

Starrybeel (NZ) (Savabeel) and **King's Cross (NZ)** (Shinko King) emerged on Saturday as exciting replacements to help fill the void in Stephen Marsh's stable with the loss of his top-rated horses.

The stable's Group One winner Thee Auld Floozie (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) has been retired to stud, Gr.2 Brisbane Cup (2400m) winner Chocante (NZ) (Shocking) is off the scene with a tendon problem and War Affair (NZ) (O'Reilly) is set to return to Singapore, leaving Marsh to rely on a young team to work through the grades.

"They were my top-rated horses so you miss them, but I've got a really good young team and some exciting horses," the Cambridge trainer said. [Full story here](#)

War Affair returning to Singapore

Stephen Marsh is disappointed he won't get an opportunity to test **War Affair (NZ)** (O'Reilly) again this season.

The former Singapore topliner has had two starts since joining Marsh's Cambridge stable and performed creditably.

He finished seventh on an unsuitable slow9 track in the Gr.2 Foxbridge Plate (1200m) at Te Rapa then, after winning a trial, he ran fourth to the highly acclaimed Te Akau Shark (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) in the Gr.3 Red Badge Spring Sprint (1400m) at Hastings last month.

"I thought he went a top race at Hastings," Marsh said. "He had 61 kilos and Te Akau Shark had only 53 kilos.

"I was looking forward to giving him a crack at some of the other big races, but his owner has decided he wants him back in Singapore.

"He's just waiting around for the next available flight, but that won't be for a while.

"It's a shame to see him go. I'd have loved to have a crack at a few good ones with him."

War Affair, the winner of 15 races and more than \$3.4 million in prizemoney, will be returning to the Singapore stable of Marsh's father, Bruce, who took over his training after he finished second in the 2015 Singapore Derby (2000m). He prepared him to win two races including the Saas Fee Stakes (1400m).

War Affair was initially prepared by another former Kiwi trainer, Mark Walker, and won six races in succession and was runner-up in the 2013 Raffles Cup (1800m).

Before joining Bruce Marsh's stable, his wins included the Patron's Bowl (1600m) and the 2014 Raffles Cup.

"He's looking great and I'm sure he can win more," Marsh said.

Exuberant thriving

Exuberant (NZ) (Savabeel), a debut winner of the Listed Wellesley Stakes (1000m) at Trentham last month, is back

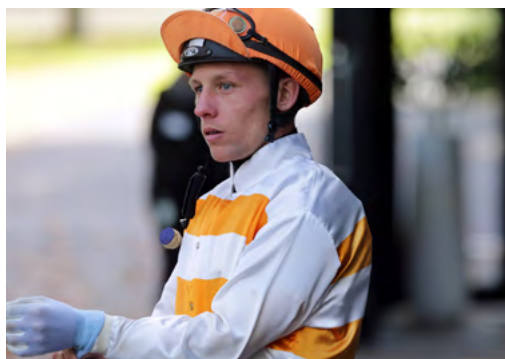

in work with Cambridge trainer Stephen Marsh.

"He's been back a week and will go straight to the Eclipse Stakes (1200m) at Ellerslie," Marsh said.

"He'll have a jumpout and maybe an exhibition gallop between races before then, depending on what he needs.

"He's looking very good and his big aim is the Karaka Million."

Marsh is also pleased with Appellant (NZ), a Showcasing filly who finished third to Exuberant and is also on track for the Gr.3 Barneswood Farm Eclipse Stakes (1200m) on New Year's Day.

"She went a top race in the Wellesley after being three-wide," Marsh said.

"She'll run at Te Rapa on December 15 then go to the Eclipse Stakes."



Ole Ole (NZ) (Makfi)

Ole Ole to Hong Kong

Talented three-year-old **Ole Ole (NZ)** (Makfi) has been sold and will do his future racing in Hong Kong.

The son of Makfi is the winner of two races with a further three placings from just seven starts.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained gelding has been placed at stakes level on two occasions and will join the stable of Manfred Man.

Group One-winning jockey heading back to NZ

Senior riding ranks in the north will be bolstered with the impending return of Group One-winning jockey Michael McNab next month.

McNab, who guided Melody Belle (NZ) (Commands) to success in the Gr.1 Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (1400m) at Awapuni last year, has been riding in Queensland since June.

While he was sitting inside the top 20 on the Brisbane metropolitan jockeys' premiership, McNab has decided to return to New Zealand for "family reasons" and has slated the Counties meeting on December 5 for his first raceday back in New Zealand.

"I've found Brisbane really good and while it hasn't been a raging success, I feel my riding has improved going up against Ryan Maloney, Jeff Lloyd, Jimmy Orman and Jim Byrne, to name but a few," McNab said.

"I have a goal to win another Group One race back home. Hopefully I can establish myself again and I'd love to chase a premiership, maybe next season. I'm absolutely fizzing to get back riding at home and can't wait to catch-up with my good mates in the jockeys' room."

Despite not finishing last season in New Zealand, McNab rode a career-best 51 winners, seven of those at stakes level. Among the highlights were Magic Chai's (Magic Albert) Gr.2 Wellington Cup (3200m) win at Trentham, Savvy Coup's (NZ) (Savabeel) Gr.3 Eulogy Stakes (1600m) success at Awapuni and Melt's (NZ) (Iffraaj) Gr.3 Eclipse Stakes (1200m) at Ellerslie.

Date set for revamped home-turn return

The reconstructed home-turn at Awapuni racecourse in Palmerston North will make a race day return on March 1 next year, however, it is reliant on a satisfactory trial day in January.

Trials were held on the reconstructed section on Tuesday, but a small section of the track did raise a slight concern for RACE Group tracks manager Kim Treweek

"The majority of the new section raced really well (at the trials) but there was a 50m inside section, around the 600m, which was a bit softer and this created some inconsistencies," Treweek said.

"Horses had been working around the turn for a number of weeks but we had 32mls of rain in the 48 hours before the trials and that showed that it needed a bit more time. We want everything to be 100 percent before we commit to racing on it"

As a result, the 2100m races scheduled for the Christmas meeting at Awapuni, including the Gr.3 Manawatu Cup, will be extended to 2200m.
