PITMAN READY TO FACE HIS GREATEST CHALLENGE

hile many may consider the task of beating Winx (Street Cry) in the Gr.1 Cox Plate (2040m) in three weeks to be a monumental challenge, for Michael Pitman, trainer of rival Savvy Coup (NZ) (Savabeel), it is nowhere near as daunting as the personal battle he is about to undertake.

Pitman will go under the surgeon's knife today in a bid to beat bowel cancer.

The 63-year-old was diagnosed back in February and has endured bouts of chemotherapy and radiation treatment over the ensuing eight months.

The champion South Island trainer has remained upbeat throughout and has been overwhelmed with the support he has received from the tight-knit racing community.

However, emotions spilled over at Hastings on Saturday as Pitman's New Zealand Oaks winner Savvy Coup notched her

second Group One victory when winning the Livamol Classic (2040m) in effortless fashion.

"My emotions did come out a little after the race yesterday but it was as much about winning with this wonderful mare as it was about what's going on in my life at present," Pitman said.

"We were just so confident about her chances and then for her to go out and deliver like that was just amazing.

"What made it even more special was that I could share it with my wife Diane and a number of people who have been so supportive of me.

"Actually, my phone went dead for a while and when I turned it back on I had more than a hundred messages of congratulations, so that was very humbling.

"I think with all the backstory to this, it could well be one of the best wins I've had as a trainer."

Pitman, who prepares the mare in partnership with his son Matthew, had been bullish about Savvy Coup's prospects for the race ever since she produced an eye-catching fresh-up performance for fifth behind Melody Belle (NZ) (Commands) in the Gr.1 Tarzino Trophy (1400m) on the first day of the Hawke's Bay carnival.

"When she ran fifth that day with no room in the run home I said to Chris Johnson (jockey) then that I thought she would be very hard to beat in the Livamol," he said.

"I thought she had really matured from three to four and was over a few little niggles she had last season.

"She had a few problems with corns in her feet last

season but so far this prep she has been as good as gold and everything had gone so well.

"When I saw the run she was getting, I was pretty confident she was the winner as far as 600m out."

All going to plan, Pitman will be at Moonee Valley in three weeks' time to saddle his bonny mare.

"I'm going for keyhole surgery, where they will remove a section of my bowel to take out the cancerous growth and surrounding tissue," he said.

"As long as it all goes well the doctors have said it will mean a 7-10 day stint in hospital before I can get home.

"There are 19 days to the Cox Plate, so I'm confident I will be on course to watch a South Islander take on the best in the world."

Pitman is realistic about his mare's chances but is adamant they are not going there to just make up the numbers.

"We know who we are up against but you never know in this game," he said.

"The way I look at it is there are still some pretty juicy plums if we can run into the placings along with some very realistic opportunities later on in the carnival.

"I think a race like the Matriarch Stakes over 2000m on the last day at Flemington is an ideal race for Savvy Coup so the Cox Plate could make an ideal lead-up run, as strange as that may sound."

Win, lose or draw, just being trackside at Moonee Valley on October 27 will be a victory for Pitman in itself.

LONG LEAF TO BYPASS CAULFIELD GUINEAS



Classy colt Long Leaf will miss the upcoming Caulfield Guineas (Darryl Sherer)

indsay Park will keep **Long Leaf** (Fastnet Rock) to sprinting during the spring, deciding to bypass the Gr.1 Caulfield Guineas (1600m).

Senior trainer David Hayes says the colt will instead be freshened for the Gr.1 Coolmore Stud Stakes (1200m) at Flemington on November 3 before being aimed at Guineas races in the autumn.

Hayes said it was a difficult decision to bypass next Saturday's \$2 million race for three-year-olds over 1600m after Long Leaf's third-placed finish in the Prelude (1400m) on September 30.

Long Leaf, a \$750,000 graduate from the Curraghmore draft at the 2017 National Yearling Sale at Karaka, sits on the fourth line of betting at \$13 for the Guineas behind The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice) at \$2.30 and Darren Weir stablemates pair of Leonardo Da Hinchi (Hinchinbrook) (\$6) and Native Soldier (Sepoy) (\$8).

"It was a good run in the Prelude but I just thought his last 50 metres, even though he ran the best last sectional, he wasn't rushing the line," Hayes said. "So I thought, I'll keep him fresh, give him an easy time and if he wins it (Coolmore) with his pedigree it will be a good result.

"I've got the feeling the speed of a 1200-metre race will allow him to join in and I reckon he'll run really well."

Long Leaf sports the navy blue colours of Coolmore Stud which were carried to victory at Royal Ascot this year by Merchant Navy (Fastnet Rock) who won the 2017 Group One sprint for the three-year-olds.





JOHNSON SHOWS HIS CLASS ON DARK PRINCESS

masterclass from rider Chris Johnson paved the way for progressive galloper **Dark Princess (NZ)** (Cape Blanco) to secure victory over a talented line-up in Saturday's Hastings Heart Of The Hawke's Bay Mile (1600m).

The Jeff Lynds trained five-year-old came in to the race off the back of a short spell following a tidy run for fourth in the Interprovincial Challenge (1600m) at New Plymouth in August.

The lightly raced Cape Blanco mare had won twice on heavy tracks during the winter, with some expecting the Dead4 footing at Hastings to be a touch too good for her liking.

That theory was quickly dispelled as Johnson saved every inch of ground throughout before weaving a path inside runners in the home straight to issue a strong challenge that carried Dark Princess to a length and a half victory over race favourite, Mongolian Marshal (NZ) (High Chaparral).

"I got back as they wanted her ridden back beyond midfield," Johnson said.

"I was lucky I was following one of the best jockeys and found a nice path through where she finished it off well.

"She's a very nice horse who feels like she will get more than a mile, so she could be a very good stayer in the making."

Lynds echoed those sentiments when discussing the future prospects of his charge.

"It was a good effort and very pleasing," he said.

"She's on the way up and might get a trip over the ditch one day. She hasn't got up to her forte yet, which will be over ground, so we're just making her as a horse.

"It's pleasing to come out on a track like this and see what she can do."

Lynds indicated the mare, who was a \$46,000 purchase from the Cambridge Stud draft at Karaka in 2015, would be set for the Gr.3 Thompson Handicap (1600m) at Trentham on October 27 as her next assignment.

The victory provided Johnson with the first leg of a

raceday double as he guided hot favourite Savvy Coup (NZ) (Savabeel) to victory in the Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) one race later.

Te Awamutu race-meeting abandoned

The Sunday race-meeting at Te Awamutu was abandoned after problems with horses slipping were identified following the completion of the second event.

In a situation eerily similar to the one that caused the abandonment of racing at Riccarton Park on Saturday, a greasy patch of turf and inconsistent surface between the 800m and 600m mark, as well as on the home bend, has caused the issues.

"Several riders from race two had come and reported their mounts had shifted rounding the bends," Stipendiary Steward Brady Jones said.

"Particularly between the 800m and 600m but also the bend turning for home.

"We went out and had a look but couldn't find any real slip marks of note but it was more the inconsistencies in the track that was the main concern.

"After we had inspected the track the general consensus amongst the riders was that there was no confidence in the track surface and that they wouldn't be able to ride competitively around those bends."

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing are not looking to reschedule the meeting, but will consider options including adding a race or races to other programmes going forward including the possibility of rescheduling the Te Awamutu Cup. – NZ Racing Desk

McKAY HARBOURS CLASSIC AMBITIONS FOR HASTINGS WINNER

oyally bred three-year-old
Langkawi (NZ) (Helmet) took
the first step on a path towards
some of the feature age group events
later in the summer when he landed
his first victory at Hastings on the
weekend.

The Helmet gelding is out of handy broodmare Shortblackmini (NZ), who has produced the well performed Amarula (NZ) (Thorn Park) and Little Wonder (NZ) (Volksraad) from her first four foals. The Black Minnaloushe mare is a half sister to six-time Group One winner Sir Slick (NZ) (Volksraad) and 2014 Gr.1 New Zealand Derby winner, Puccini (NZ) (Encosta De Lago).

The Peter McKay trained runner looks to have inherited plenty of the family ability. He ended a frustrating run of runner-up finishes with victory over 1400m in a special conditions maiden event at his fifth raceday start.

There was plenty of merit in the

performance of Langkawi as he outtoughed the Lisa Latta trained Lincoln Falls (Dundeel), who is touted as a serious contender for the Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton next month.

McKay cut a satisfied figure as he outlined his plans over the next six months for the gelding.

"He's still a green horse who will

be better after Christmas but that's a pretty good horse he's chased down today," he said.

"He's a bit like Puccini, same family, as he's taken time to mature. At the moment he's just playing games but when he really knows what he is doing he could be a good staying horse."

McKay, who co-owns the horse with his wife Kim and Steve Gudsell, had thought of starting Langkawi in the Gr.2 Sacred Falls Hawkes Bay Guineas (1400m) but opted for what he thought might be a softer option.

"I thought this was going to be a wee bit weaker but when I saw Lincoln Falls I thought if he beats him he could be placed in the Guineas," he said.

"Steve was happy with my decision as I said we're not quite ready to be taking on the Guineas horses.

"There's plenty for him later on in the season, as I have ear-marked the Derby for him so we don't want to be pressuring him too much at the moment.

"Now we can back off him slightly and hopefully he can mature and become a proper horse."

Lincoln Falls lost no admirers in finishing second and currently sits at an \$18 quote on the Fixed Odds market for the 2000 Guineas while the third-placed Out Of The Park (NZ) (Ocean Park) caught the eye with a barn-storming finish for co-owner Brendon McCullum and his Vermair Out Of The Park II syndicate.

The Opera House filly to trial at Cranbourne

Stunning all white filly **Utzon (NZ)** (Charm Spirit) will grace the trialling track at Cranbourne today for her trainers Ciaron Maher and David Eustace.

The well-named Utzon, after the Sydney Opera House's Danish architect Jorn Utzon, is down to trial in the seventh heat of the morning at 10am.

Utzon is raced by Yulong Investments and will carry their familiar green silks with white checked sleeves and white cap. By Windsor Park shuttle stallion Charm Spirit out of The Opera House, the filly was a \$120,000 purchase for Yulong from Windsor Park's 2018 Book 1 draft at the National Yearling Sale at Karaka.

She has a familiar-looking stablemate, with half-brother and fellow white horse Grand Bernini (NZ) (Shamexpress) - who will race in the China Horse Club silks - yet to hit the race-track, but the Shamexpress colt did have a Caulfield jump-out in July.





MERTENS HITS TARGET AT SPECIAL SINGAPORE MISSION WITH FIRST WINNER

fter a first look around on Friday night, Australian jockey Beau Mertens didn't take long to get aboard his first winner in Singapore with the well-backed **Molineux (NZ)** (Savabeel) at Sunday's meeting.

At his first visit at Kranji, the 21-year-old Melbourne rider is licensed for only those two days to make up for a shortage of jockeys due to suspensions.

Booked for seven rides on Sunday, Mertens did not waste any time by getting right on the money at his very first assignment in the \$45,000 Class 4 Non Premier race over 1600m.

Dropping the Savabeel four-year-old in the rear bunch, Mertens only got busy before cornering, angling his mount to the outside for his launch. With daylight ahead, Molineux produced the fastest sectionals inside the last 200m to head home towards his first win from six starts that had thus far produced a second place as his best result.

"I'm pretty rapt I got my first winner in Singapore today. A big thanks to Matty Hyland who gave me the call-up," said Mertens, a winner of 250 races back home and who finished a close runner-up to multiple-champion jockey Craig Williams in the Melbourne premiership in 2016/2017 when still an apprentice jockey.

"Today, the horse (Molineux) presented himself very well. I was told not to ride this horse (Molineux) too close to the speed early, even if I was maybe a couple of pairs further back.

"He had every chance, and once I got stuck into him when he got into the clear, he finished off very well."

With winning trainer Stephen Gray away at the Gold Coast Magic Millions 2YO's in Training Sale, it was left to racing manager Craig Geehman to do the honours at the winner's circle.

"It's terrific for Beau. He rode the horse patiently and it's terrific for the horse and the St George Stable as well, as Paul Hickman has been such a great supporter of the stable for so

long," said Geehman who mainly looks after the social media aspect and horse owner relations at the stable.

"The boss is at the Gold Coast looking for the next champion. In the last six or seven weeks, we've had winners every week, even doubles.

"Horses have turned the corner and they are going great guns."

With that maiden success, Molineux has now brought up close to \$50,000 in stakes earnings for the St George Stable.

rench jockey Olivier Placais
admitted his winning ride on
favourite **Nowyousee (NZ)**(O'Reilly) was not pretty, but he will
still take it with both hands.

Placais had been in white-hot form for around four months, racking up winners week-in week-out, the zenith being his Emirates Singapore Derby win in July, but his season recently

hit the skids with suspensions for careless riding, as well as a slight drop in winners.

To earn a riding double courtesy of trainer Lee Freedman (also prepares his earlier winner My Big Boss) in such times was a leg-up Placais would not sneeze at for sure, especially as most of the suspended jockeys on the outer would be back from next week.

Placais was making hay while the sun shines, but he was still a touch sheepish and self-critical of his ride at the weigh-in.

"Actually, I'm very lucky to win because the horse is good. That's one ride you should not show at the apprentice school," he said. "It wasn't my best ride. Horse No 4 (Marine Treasure) was tired early and I had to pass him right on the outside.

"But luckily, I have a strong horse who can still go ahead. This horse is still improving race after race.

"I feel sorry for Daniel (Moor), but that's the sport we're in."

The Australian jockey is one of six riders missing from the roster at this weekend's action through suspension. He would have on paper been the booking for both My Big Boss (Smart Missile) and Nowyousee.

Freedman said he might pencil in the Garden City Trophy (1200m) on October 21 as Nowyousee's next target.

> "He did a good job to win today. He was up in weights and he's not a very big horse," said the Australian handler.

"I told Jeffrey (Soh of Titanium Racing Stable) he has been training very well and he would be hard to beat today.

"He will go up in grade and I may run him in the Garden City Trophy as he will get a drop in weight, but we'll see how he pulls up first."

A four-year-old by O'Reilly, Nowyousee has now achieved a handy record of five wins and four placings from 10 starts for prizemoney hitting around the \$270,000 mark for the Titanium Racing Stable.
