DEBT COLLECTOR WINS THRILLING KRANJI MILE



Debt Collector (No 8) holds Well Done at bay to land the SIN G1 Kranji Mile

It was billed as Singapore's race of the year, the clash between the old guard and the rising stars, and the \$700,000 SIN G1 Panasonic Kranji Mile (1600m) did not disappoint with the two "young pretenders" **Debt Collector (NZ)** (Thorn Park) and **Well Done (NZ)** (Falkirk) running 1-2 on Sunday.

Regarded as the future of Singapore racing, Debt Collector (Michael Rodd) and Well Done (Glen Boss) showed

in no uncertain terms they could hold their own against Kranji's crème de la crème when they were the ones who came up with the best turns of foot inside the last 300m to fight out the finish of the first Leg of the Singapore Triple Crown series.

Debt Collector won with a neck to spare from Well Done in a winning time of 1 min 34.43secs for the 1600m on the Short Course.

Winning trainer Cliff Brown was speechless yet again, unable to process the way his horse seems to always find the line even when things look against him. With that sixth win, Debt Collector has now hit the \$1 million for his owners, the Victorian-based Barree Stable.

"I thought he would be in trouble today. He was struggling at the 700m, at least it looked that way, I'll have to have another look at the replay," said the Australian handler.

"To be honest, I thought he was handier than usual today. But I had left it to Michael and I trusted he knew what he was doing.

"I've been nervous since Tuesday. I have confidence in his ability, but this was his biggest test by far.

"He's just a remarkable horse who just knows where the post is. It's onwards to the Raffles Cup now, but he won't be going for the Gold Cup.

"Then he will go for a break and we will set him for the Derby next year."

The Group 1 Raffles Cup (1800m) is the second Leg of the series and will be run on October 30.

Both Debt Collector and Well Done were bred by Windsor Park Stud and notably both are graduates of New Zealand Bloodstock's Ready to Run Sale which has attracted a bumper catalogue of 552 lots with the sale to take place on November 16 and 17.

ONCE IN A LIFETIME HORSE PROVIDES GREATEST THRILL FOR KIWI PAIR



He's Our Rokkii wins the Gr. 1 Toorak Handicap at Caulfield

An association with thoroughbred racing and breeding that started over sixteen years ago hit its highest peak to date on Saturday afternoon when **He's Our Rokkii (NZ)** (Roc De Cambes) dashed to Group One glory in the Toorak Handicap at Caulfield.

On course to cheer home the four-year-old was New Zealand businessman Costa Feneridis, who along with friend and business associate John Collinson, bred and then raced the gelding in his first three

New Zealand outings.

The pair, who have been in business together for over thirty years, accepted an offer by Australian agent Mark Pilkington after the Roc De Cambes gelding had finished an unlucky fourth in the 2015 Gr. 1 Manawatu Sires Produce Stakes. The deal saw them retain shares in the horse who was transferred to the Hayes & Dabernig stable in Victoria for his future racing.

Feneridis, who admitted he was making a slow start to his Sunday

morning after a night of celebrations, recalled how he and Collinson started their involvement in racing with a bang that saw them thinking the game was a simple one.

"John and I have been in business together for more than thirty years and we both had a passion for racing so it was only natural we would get involved in ownership at some stage," he said.

"The first horse we bought was Shinnecock who was trained by Bruce

Marsh and won his first two starts including the Wellesley Stakes. We thought the racing game was pretty easy at that stage."

Shinnecock (NZ) (Woodborough) proved a tidy investment for the pair after he finished second in the \$1million Mercedes Super Bonus Classique (now Karaka Million) as a juvenile before being narrowly beaten in the Gr. 1 Bayer Classic as a three-year-old before he was sold to Hong Kong.

"The next year we bought five more horses at the sales and it all started from there," recalled Feneridis.

"Of course we learnt pretty quickly that it wasn't all as easy as it had seemed and we've had plenty of low points along the way but just as many memorable highs as well."

An association developed with Paul Moroney that paved the way for Feneridis and Collinson to purchase British mare Clerihew (Lomitas), the dam of He's Our Rokkii, who set them on their way to their current good fortune.

"We were racing a few from the Moroney stable and Paul had bought the mare from England as a racing and breeding prospect," said Feneridis.

"As it turned out she got injured

and never raced so we sent her to stud with her first foal being a filly we named Aluminium Bikerack who won seven races from Michael Pitman's stable.

"She had a few issues after that with a foal dying and then another one going amiss when being broken in. John does the work with the matings and he decided she should go to Roc De Cambes where we got Rokkii who is the first colt we have had to race from her."

Although unsuccessful in his three juvenile starts, Feneridis was convinced the horse was the real deal.

"He didn't have any luck in those races and after he ran second at New Plymouth where he was eight wide in an eight horse field we started to field some pretty big offers for him," he said.

"One of those who contacted us was Mark Pilkington and after the horse ran fourth in the Sires Produce at Awapuni things started to get serious.

"John and I were keen to give the horse the best opportunity possible and the deal Mark was offering meant he would go to a top stable and we could keep an interest in him where as the others all wanted to buy the horse outright.

"One of the main reasons we love

racing is the people you meet along the way so to be involved with a great bunch who are now in the horse is just marvelous. He is a once-in-a lifetime horse and we have got to share in that which is very satisfying."

While Feneridis was on-course at Caulfield on Saturday Collinson had to make do with watching the victory on an internet replay from Europe where he is currently helping out his daughter in her equestrian pursuits.

"John's daughter is developing a very promising equestrian career so he heads over to the Netherlands where she is based to help out from time to time," he advised.

"He caught a replay of the race pretty much just after it was run so I'm picking he was just as excited as we were. We have shared a number of texts since then so I'm looking forward to catching up when he gets back."

Feneridis and the rest of the large ownership group involved with the horse will now set their sights on the Melbourne Cup Carnival where the horse is liable to tackle the Gr. 1 Longines Mile on the first of the four-day Flemington extravaganza.

JUMPS SESSIONS TO SWITCH ON PREFERMENT

Chris Waller has dived into his bag of tricks in an effort to bring out the best from **Preferment (NZ)** (Zabeel) in the Caulfield Cup.

Preferment will carry top weight of 57kg in Saturday's 2400m-handicap and is at \$21 with the Ciaran Maher-trained Jameka (Myboycharlie) the \$3.70 market leader.

Waller said the Caulfield Cup was not his preferred option but he has given the five-year-old schooling sessions at Flemington to sharpen his mind.

Preferment goes into the Caulfield Cup off a last-start fourth to Hartnell (Authorized) in the Turnbull Stakes at Flemington, finishing just under seven lengths from the winner.

"I was keen to keep him at 2000 metres but it looks like he is looking for 2400 metres now," Waller said.

"His run in the Turnbull was OK without being flattering but if he had 52 kilos you would say wow, he's the horse to

back.

"He's got a bit of ground to make up, but we'll do our best, so he's been doing a bit of jumping in an effort to try and mentally switch him on."

Waller said Preferment was likely to have another couple of jump sessions during the week ahead of Saturday's race.

While there are schooling facilities at Rosehill, Waller says it's not something he usually uses.

"I think that's the beauty of Darren Weir's operation. There's something different for the horses all the time," Waller said.

"We do the best we can. Sometimes it's dressage, we put them on the treadmill, go swimming, or go to the beach.

"There's lots of things you can do regardless of where you train.

"Horses are like people, they thrive on change."

Hugh Bowman, who guided Winx (Street Cry) to victory

in the Caulfield Stakes for Waller on Saturday, rides Preferment in the Caulfield Cup.

Waller has not made a final decision on his other Caulfield Cup entries and is considering the Geelong Cup for Who Shot Thebarman (NZ) (Yamanin Vital) and the Moonee Valley Cup for Grand Marshal (Dansili).

Antonio Giuseppe (NZ) (Shocking) and Sacred Master (NZ) (Mastercraftsman), second and fourth respectively in the Group One Metropolitan Handicap, are also in the Caulfield Cup mix.

DOUBLE FOR SHARROCK AT HAWERA

New Plymouth trainer Allan Sharrock produced a race-to-race winning double at Hawera on the weekend with the ultra impressive **Whispering (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) looking likely to make her name in better company later this summer.

Sharrock's Hong Kong apprentice Alfred Chan did the honours as he guided consistent galloper **Darci Mac (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) to a deserved win over 1400 metres in rating 85 company before Whispering demolished her rating 75 rivals over 1200 metres thirty minutes later.

Sharrock was delighted with the winning brace and is predicting big things from the well bred Whispering who is a daughter of Darci Brahma and six race winner Instant Divorce (NZ) (Fiesta Star).

"I think she has all the potential to be a group winner but I've waited for her as she's needed time," he explained.

"There's not a lot of her but she's out of a nice family and is strengthening all the time. The big thing with her is to be patient."

Chan was thrilled with the win which was achieved in seemingly effortless fashion.

"She was drawn a little bit wide which was lucky as the inside is slow," he advised after the race.

"She handled the track well although she laid in a little bit when I had the whip in my right hand. When I switched to the left and corrected her she was very good."

Sharrock was quick to praise both his apprentice and Darci Brahma gelding Darci Mac after they had combined for victory in the third race of the day.

"He rode him patiently and sat like a mouse with the 52kgs on board," he said.

"The horse was goofing around when he got to the front but Alfie did a good job.

"He's the type of galloper who could win one of those nice handicap miles later in the year as he's a pretty good horse who'll reach full maturity in the autumn."

TED STRIKES A BLOW ON HOME TRACK FOR PASCOE

There aren't many meetings that go by on the Hawera track without the locals tasting victory and that honour was upheld by the Paul Pascoe trained **Nitro Ted (NZ)** (Citi Habit) on the weekend when he produced a dashing display in the Egmont Tyres sponsored 2100 metre contest.

The six-year-old Citi Habit gelding had his supporters cheering a long way from home when in form apprentice Tim Johnson set him alight from the rear of the thirteen horse field to swoop on the leaders as they approached the home turn.

Maintaining a strong gallop the gelding put the issue beyond doubt as he dashed two lengths clear as they straightened and maintained the advantage to the winning post despite some wayward movements in the closing stages.

Pascoe was thrilled with the home track victory and admitted his confidence in his charge had him contemplating a start in the main staying race on the program, the Egmont Cup, earlier in the week.

"His run last time in a higher grade was big," he said after the race.

"If you ride him in behind he panics

so you've got to go wide and ride him like it's the worst you've ever seen.

"That's the way he goes best as he's not very big but he's tough.

"I was umming and aahing about whether to start in the Cup but he'll keep so next year we might."

The victory kicked off a winning double for Johnson who took out the feature event, the Gr. 3 Rich Hill Stud Taranaki Breeders Stakes, on Underthemoonlight (NZ) (El Hermano) later in the day. The young rider, who has sprung to prominence in recent months, was full of praise for his charge.

"He's a horse who doesn't like being in behind the others and just needs room," he said.

"I didn't panic when I got back as I knew he could come wide so I let him rip and he just dashed around them.

"He ducked in a bit but that's just him, it was a nice win."

WEATHER TO DICTATE CAMPAIGN OPENER FOR FULLY FUNDED

An end to the “big wet” being experienced across New Zealand will determine the starting point for the summer campaign of promising sprinter **Fully Fledged (NZ)** (Fully Fledged).

Trainer Joanne Surgenor has ambitious plans for the five-year-old who made his first racetrack appearance for the season last week with an impressive win over 800 metres at the Ruakaka trials. The moody gelding did everything right as he sat outside the pace in his open grade heat before lengthening stylishly in the concluding stages to register a comfortable one and a half length victory.

The gallop was just what Surgenor was looking for as she plots a path to a possible tilt at the Gr. 1 Sistema Railway Stakes on New Year’s Day at Ellerslie.

“I was hoping he’d get a good hit-out and that’s exactly what we got,” she noted.

“I asked Sam (Collett) to put him outside the speed and let him run to the line which he did very nicely. He is a late maturing type, both mentally and physically, but he looks like he has really grown up during his break which is very exciting.

“He used to do a few things wrong around home and on raceday but he was very calm this time so hopefully he has got that out of his system now.”

A model of consistency during his last campaign where he won three times

and was placed on a further six occasions from his eleven starts, the Fully Fledged gelding will most likely start his new campaign in Listed company at Te Rapa on the 5th of November.

“As long as the rain stops sometime soon I’m looking at the Legacy Lodge Sprint at Te Rapa early next month for his first run,” Surgenor advised.

“That’s a big if though as it just can’t seem to stop raining at the moment. He’s hopeless on anything worse than dead so we’ll just play it by ear as we get closer to that date.

“Ideally he would run at Te Rapa then onto the Counties Bowl and then both the Concorde and Railway after that but that is if everything goes to plan which we all know is not always the case with horses.

“I think he is good enough to tackle those sorts of races and at this stage that is where we will aim with him.”

GRAY AIMS HIGHER FOR BAHANA

Trainer Stephen Gray said it was still a long shot, but he may well have a fourth Singapore Gold Cup contender in **Bahana (NZ)** (Elusive City) following his gutsy win

in the \$100,000 Panasonic Solutions Stakes, an Open Benchmark 89 race over 2000m on Sunday.

The Kiwi handler already has three confirmed runners in the mix for the time-honoured race over 2200m on November 20, but can now add Bahana although, if he qualified, would have to run well in the Group 3 El Dorado Classic (2200m) on October 30 to show he was really deserving of a shot.

"He had a light weight today. There was no speed and I thought he might get this," said Gray.

"Amirul (Ismadi) rode him very well. He's got a bright future here this kid.

"I will run him in the El Dorado next. It'll be a big test but I think he should get the 2200m.

"He's bred to stay and he's done

nothing wrong. If he goes well, then we may look at the Gold Cup."

The Elusive City five-year-old certainly enjoyed a ground-saving run on the rails for Amirul. But with the moderate tempo set by Time Odyssey (Jet Master), it was a fairly bunched-up field that attacked the line upon straightening.

Whilst the favoured runners were battling Bahana in a workman like manner slowly gained the ascendancy between runners to gain the verdict by a neck from Time Odyssey. Cooptado (Equal Stripes), who looked like he could bounce back to a first win since his Gold Cup heroics last November, eventually ran third another short head away.

"I did the handicap and I thought he would be in second or third spot in the running and that is exactly how it worked out," said Amirul.

"The tempo suited him and turning for home he was travelling really well, but for a while I was worried I might not be able to get out, especially as he doesn't have a brilliant turn of foot.

"But when I got the split, he was very game and fought all the way to the line."

Bahana has now taken his handy record to five wins and four placings from 11 starts for stakes earnings close to the \$240,000 mark for the Dago Stable.
