OUTSTANDING MILER BEAUTY GENERATION DOES IT AGAIN IN ORIENTAL WATCH SHA TIN TROPHY



Beauty Generation is all class as he strides to victory in the Gr.2 Oriental Watch Sha Tin Trophy

Beauty Generation (NZ) (Road To Rock) has drawn his share of unwarranted knocks from the naysayers but at Sha Tin even the most ardent doubters had to hold their tongues and applaud.

"That was exciting!" trainer John Moore said as the appreciative crowd's cheers washed over Hong Kong's Horse of the Year following a brilliant victory in the Gr.2 Oriental Watch Sha Tin Trophy Handicap (1600m).

"He's carried 133lb there so what more has he got to do to silence the detractors that say, 'Well, he just gets his own way' – what more?" asked Moore.

The trainer, animated in raising memories of the debate that simmered around whether the crack miler or Pakistan

Star (Shamardal) should receive last season's Horse of the Year accolade, poured praise on his triple Group One winner. The six-year-old was rated the equal best active miler in the world in the most recent LONGINES World's Best Racehorse Rankings and Moore believes there is more success to be had.

"He's excelled at the mile," he said. "We've got one of the best milers in the world! This looks like it's going to be his year when he's going to be at his very best – he's really peaking at the moment. He's enjoying his racing and he knows exactly what he's got to do – be a miler!"

Beauty Generation delivered a masterclass this afternoon. As the sun dipped and the grandstand shadow crept to the lip of the turf track's famous home straight, the one-time stayer did what he has done so brilliantly for a year now.

Faced with the best rivals on the local circuit and conceding weight to all, Beauty Generation made all – again – raced clear down the straight, saw off Pakistan Star and held Singapore Sling's (Philanthropist) late drive by half a length.

Victory meant that the Patrick Kwok-owned galloper became the first horse to win the race back-to-back since it attained Pattern status in 1991. And today's success followed a similarly impressive weight-carrying effort first-up on 1 October, when the bay achieved consecutive wins in the Gr.3 Celebration Cup Handicap (1400m).

Moore confirmed that Beauty Generation will race next in the Gr.2 Jockey Club Mile on 18 November before attempting to repeat last season's victory in the Gr.1 LONGINES Hong Kong Mile on 9 December.

"He's tough, he'll take no harm from that race today; he just does so well in the stable. He's a big, sound boy and he looked so powerful again today, he looked so well in the coat, a real sheen, so we press on now and see if he can do it again," the handler said.

Beauty Generation was a graduate of Highden Park's 2014 Select Yearling draft at the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale. Purchased by Kylie Bax' Hermes Syndications for \$60,000 the son of Road To Rock initially raced in Australia under the name Montaigne where he won twice and was runner-up to Tarzino (NZ) (Tavistock) in the Gr.1 Rosehill Guineas (2000m).

The crack miler was bred by Greg Tomlinson's Nearco Stud and has now won a further nine times from 17 starts in Hong Kong, with three of those wins at Group One level.

DEBT COLLECTOR REIGNS SUPREME IN THE QE II CUP



Debt Collector romps home at Kranji

hampion galloper **Debt Collector (NZ)** (Thorn Park) left no doubt in anybody's mind who is currently the middle-distance kingpin in Singapore after he raced away to an emphatic win in the S\$1 million Queen Elizabeth II Cup (2000m) on Sunday.

While that 10th win and a fifth Group One success, not to mention more than \$2.7 million in stakes money pocketed, made for yet another resounding success for the Barree Stable-owned Thorn Park six-year-old, it was the manner of Sunday's win which was the talking point.

Debt Collector is the quintessential swooper who times his runs to a tee – storm home to get up at the eleventh hour. Watch all his ten wins and you will understand why a heart defibrillator is always on standby.

At his last win – his first since coming back from an Australian

holiday/rehab - in the first Leg of the Singapore Triple Crown series, the Raffles Cup (1600m) on September 23, he did not fail to serve up another cliffhanger, coming from last to pip Circuit Land (Mizzen Mast) by a head.

But the 2016 Singapore Horse of the Year went for a slightly less suspenseful run this time. For a change, he had the other 13 horses in his rear-view mirror by the 200m.

DEBT COLLECTOR REIGNS SUPREME IN THE QE II CUP

Even regular partner Michael Rodd said in his post-race victory interview he was a bit "embarrassed" he might have gone the early crow, but truth be told, when you are cut from the cloth of champions, good things don't always come to those who wait.

"The race panned out well for us. From a three-wide position, I was able to get into a one-off spot," said Rodd.

"He was tracking right behind the right horse, and when I took him three wide again at the 800m, he was still tracking behind the right horses.

"I didn't know he would get to the front so easy, though. I was almost embarrassed, I felt like a kid trying to keep him steady.

"It's almost like he's ripped us off.

I should have sat earlier and kept him tucked in, but by the 300m, he had rounded them up already, he had them covered.

"I'm glad it all came together. He's been a very special horse from day one."

Debt Collector ran the 1800m on the Long Course in a smart 1min 47.15secs. He also took home a bonus of \$50,000 for winning two legs of the Triple Crown. Should he rewrite history by becoming the first Triple Crown winner in the annals of Singapore racing on November 11, the bonus will treble up to \$150,000.

Debt Collector is a product of Windsor Park Stud and was purchased out of their draft at the 2014 National Yearling Sale before making his way to Brown's stable after the trainer outlaid \$120,000 for him at the New Zealand Bloodstock Ready To Run Sale later that year.

BISHARA LIVING THE DREAM

ick Bishara was comfortable with the reality of nursing a hangover all the way back to Auckland as he prepared to board a flight home from Melbourne on Sunday morning.

The Ardmore Lodge-based trainer had celebrated long and hard alongside his fellow owners after their filly **Verry Elleegant (NZ)** (Zed), who is now prepared by Darren Weir, scored a stunning victory in the Gr.3 New Zealand Bloodstock Ethereal Stakes (2000m) at Caulfield on Saturday afternoon. "I'm a bit dusty this morning as it was a big night," Bishara said.

"It was just an amazing day and to win a race like that with a little old New Zealand filly doesn't get any better.

"I'm just living the dream." That dream began at the New Zealand Bloodstock Autumn Mixed Sale in 2007 when Bishara outlaid \$5,000 for a Danroad yearling filly that he named Opulence (NZ).

"I was attracted to her bloodlines as she comes from the family of Eight Carat," he said.

"I couldn't believe I only had to pay

five grand although that may have been the Danroad factor as he hadn't done much as a sire then.

"She had a lot of ability but we didn't see the best of her through injury.

"Once she had finished on the track we sold her at Karaka to Don Goodwin."

Goodwin, a shareholder in the stallion Zed, had also been attracted by the Eight Carat factor in the mare's pedigree and believed a mating would sit well with the son of Zabeel.

"We first met Don when we bought Continued on page 7

Opulence's first foal which was a Towkay filly that we named Black Lace," Bishara said.

"We struck up a friendship with Don and when the mare produced her first Zed foal, which was a colt, Don kept him and we race him together."

Bishara was of the belief that the colt, named Verry Flash (NZ), would become his stable star until his little sister Verry Elleegant came along.

"I really rate Verry Flash and think he has the potential to become a top stayer," he said.

"He has done well but it does look like his little sister is going to get the better of that battle at the moment."

Bishara organised several friends to race Verry Elleegant on lease with Goodwin and expected the filly would take some time to reach her potential.

"The Aussies are saying she is a lightly framed filly but to me she is just a typical kiwi staying type," he said.

"When we first got her I thought she would take a bit of time to mature so we planned to give her one start as a late two-year-old and then turn her out and let her develop.

"I knew she had a motor but I didn't think she would show it until she strengthened up."

A flashing run for second in a maiden two-year-old event at Te Rapa in July convinced Bishara his opinion of the filly was justified but also that she might be capable of continuing her preparation without an immediate break.

It also set the phones ringing as bloodstock agents spotted the filly's potential as well.

"When she ran second we thought we'd give her another run as she came through that first one well," he said.

"There were quite a few phone calls but as she had a very high right of purchase they didn't come to much.

"After what she did at Ruakaka at her next start the phones started ringing off the hook."

Verry Elleegant had come from last to loop the field and effortlessly break her maiden over 1400m at Ruakaka, the type of performance that is seldom seen at the venue.

With the offers coming thick and fast, Bishara, Goodwin and their fellow

owners were faced with the task of deciding on what to do with the potential star.

"It all got a bit frustrating to be honest as there were plenty who were mucking us around," Bishara said.

"In the end she ran and won at Matamata and then we got serious on what to do. The offer that we accepted meant we could retain twenty-five percent ownership of her and transfer her to Darren and that led us to where we have got to today.

"We met most of the new owners at Caulfield yesterday and they are a great bunch. We celebrated long and hard but I did have time to reflect a little on it all and it is just an amazing feeling.

"What it does show you is that anyone can have success in this game, whether you are big or small."

Saturday's victory saw bookmakers install Verry Elleegant as the \$2.50 favourite for the Gr.1 Kennedy Oaks (2500m) at Flemington on November 8 with Bishara promising to top Saturday's celebrations if she can find the winners enclosure again.

WILLIAMS WALKING GUINEAS TIGHTROPE WITH MEDIA SENSATION

alented three-year-old **Media Sensation** (I Am Invincible) furthered her preparation for a tilt at the Gr.1 Gavelhouse.com New Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton next month when she downed her agegroup rivals over 1400m at Rotorua on Saturday.

The Peter and Dawn Williams prepared filly had been unbeaten in two starts as a two-year-old but an interrupted preparation saw her colours lowered for the first time when she opened her new campaign at Tauranga earlier in the month.

The defeat had cast some doubt on her Riccarton

aspirations however confidence was restored on the weekend after the filly came from well back in the field to claim race favourite Bocce (Foxwedge) in the shadows of the finishing post.

The performance gave Peter Williams cause for confidence in her chances of getting to the 1000 Guineas target.

"She was a bit fresh at Tauranga but her work had been very good this week," he said.

"We want to get her to a mile if we can, so that's why we rode her back.

"At this stage we're still a chance of the 1000 Guineas if we decide to go."

Williams had taken confidence from comments made by rider Michael Coleman after the filly's Tauranga effort that he was still on the right path with her.

"Michael was happy with her run at Tauranga," he said.

"He just said she was a victim of circumstances.

"I chose to come here to give her a go left handed as we never made it to Hastings the other day.

"She had one trial but we came here to see how she handled it."

Coleman was pleased with the effort of his mount after Media Sensation had been slow to find her feet at the start.

"We were just drawn awkwardly and there was always going to be speed on," he said.

"She jumped better but didn't really hit the ground running so the draw took things out of my hands and we had to go back.

"She hit the line hard and showed she has a bit of versatility. Getting back is going to help her see out the mile down there (Riccarton). The victory saw TAB bookmakers tighten Media Sensation from \$14 in to \$8 in their Fixed Odds market for the 1000 Guineas that will be run at Riccarton on November 17.

NEWS IN BRIEF

Otaki meeting abandoned

Sunday's Otaki race-meeting has been abandoned due to two horses slipping around the 800m point during Race 3. Stipendiary Steward Neil Goodwin made the announcement after a track inspection was conducted following the race.

"It is most unfortunate for the club as the track looked to be in perfect condition," he said.

"We have had a series of trials on it along with a couple of horses galloping on race morning with glowing reports.

"The first two races went without anything happening however, after the top had been taken off, there is a series of slip marks at the 900m.

"It does appear there is a hard pan underneath the top of the track and there were some serious slip-marks there.

"The stewards inspected it with the trainer's representative and senior riders and we had no hesitation in saying safety comes first and abandoned the meeting."

The meeting was the first to be held at the venue since early February after problems identified with the racing surface meant extensive drainage work, in addition to the annual track renovation programme, were undertaken to correct those issues.





TE RAPA FEATURE COULD DECIDE 2000 GUINEAS FAVOURITE

avouritism for next months Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton could be decided at Te Rapa this afternoon when several of the leading contenders clash in the Gr.2 James & Annie Sarten Memorial Stakes (1400m).

TAB bookmakers have installed impressive Hawke's Bay Guineas winner Madison County (NZ) (Pins) as a \$2.80 Fixed Odds favourite for the 2000 Guineas with the Wayne Hillis trained **Bit Lippy (NZ)** (Showcasing) on the second line of betting at \$6.

The pair will clash for the first time at Te Rapa with Hillis expecting his charge to be right in the firing line as he rounds off his preparation for the trip south to Riccarton.

"He's well and all good for today," he said.

"This will be his last run before the Guineas so we are expecting him to acquit himself well as he has been very consistent in all his starts so far.

"It's a nice field he's up against with Madison County looking pretty hard to beat so it will be a good measure of where we are at."

Hillis is pleased with how his charge came through his first-up effort for the season when winning stylishly over 1200m at Avondale in late September.

"He didn't grow much over the winter but he is a pretty nuggety little fellow," he said.

"He did the job at Avondale and came through the run well.

"He's got a good barrier draw in the Sarten so I'd expect to see him forward in running. He's very tractable and can take a position in his races.

"He also handles most track conditions so I'm not worried about what we will strike there."

The field for the Te Rapa event has eight of the runners holding nominations for the 2000 Guineas including last season's Gr.1 Sistema Stakes (1200m) winner Sword Of Osman (NZ) (Zabeel) along with Listed Wanganui Guineas (1340m) runner-up Notabadidea (NZ) (Highly Recommended).

The sole filly in the event is the Stephen Marsh trained Rip Em Up (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) who finished second to Bit Lippy at Avondale and looms as a major contender for the Gr.1 Gavelhouse.com New Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton on November 17.

BLACK-TYPE OPTION FOR SMART MAIDEN WINNER

ambridge trainer Shaune Ritchie doesn't know where maiden winner **Magic Condor** (Magic Albert) sits in the pecking order of three-year-old fillies but is happy to find out in Saturday's Gr.3 Partners Life Soliloquy Stakes (1400m) at Ellerslie.

"She's going to run in the Soliloquy and she's going to be competitive," Ritchie said.



"From what I'm reading through the press, Melt's not certain to run and with Xpression campaigning in the South Island, all of a sudden it looks like a race that's within the range of these types of fillies."

Magic Condor's victory at Ruakaka earlier in the month came on debut and despite getting an economical rails run, was a cosy winner on the line.

"She really has come on from that first-up win," Ritchie said.

"She's in that group of horses that when they come out of maidens you just don't know how good they are or aren't, there's only one way to find out and that's to throw them in.

"She still holds a nom for the One Thousand Guineas but she'd want to be highly competitive in the Soliloquy to justify a trip.

"We'll leave her in there till after Saturday and make a call from there. I believe she's up to black-type, whether she needs more practice or not I guess that's the question."

Meanwhile, Ritchie is pleased with his Group One winner Devise (NZ) (Darci Brahma) who is likely to trial at Te Aroha on Thursday.

"She's come up great and she looks stronger than she's ever been.

"We just want to stick to the fillies & mares weight-for-age races as much as possible.

The Gr.2 Dunstan Feeds Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1400m) at Pukekohe in late November and the Gr.2 Cal Isuzu Stakes (1600m) at Te Rapa in mid December are the initial targets.

"Her long-range aim will be the Herbie Dyke Stakes (Gr.1, 2000m), with the Rich Hill Mile (Gr.2, 1600m) and Thorndon Mile (Gr.1, 1600m) possible options along the way."

VORSTER WISHES COLLETT SPEEDY RECOVERY AFTER SAPPHIRE WIN

n a wonderful gesture which often comes forward among jockeys when a fallen comrade is sidelined, Barend Vorster did not fail to dedicate his latest win to injured jockey Alysha Collett on Sunday.

Shortly after guiding **Nadeem Sapphire (NZ)** (Nadeem) to his maiden success in the \$85,000 Laughing Gravy 2016 Stakes, a Restricted Maiden race over 1400m, the South African jockey acknowledged he might not have stood at the winner's circle if not for Collett's mishap.

Collett, who hurt her back and foot in a race fall last Sunday, and had surgery to her back on Thursday, was a frontrunner to take the ride on the Nadeem three-year-old on Sunday.

"This one's for Alysha. I hope she recovers quickly," said Vorster.

Winning trainer Leslie Khoo said the Kiwi lass would have most likely been the booking after she last rode Nadeem Sapphire to a promising third in a similar Restricted Maiden race over 1200m on August 10.

"There was a high chance Alysha would have ridden that horse today – as long as she can make the weight (52kgs)," said the Singaporean conditioner.

"She rode a nice race on him at his last start. Unfortunately, she injured herself, and I had to look for another jockey.

"There aren't many senior jockeys who can make that weight, but luckily,

we got Barend to take the ride."

While Vorster was gracious in his post-race salute to Collett, he certainly deserved praise himself for the way he bided his time, only testing Nadeem Sapphire when he was well-balanced and ready to unwind.

"Leslie has done a good job to get this horse right. He needed more time and more ground," he said.

"For the 1400m today, they've sharpened him up in his work. There was a nice pace on and he settled beautifully for me.

"He's still immature and looked around after the line, but I'm sure he'll keep improving."



With that first win out of the way, Khoo said he would now chart a racing programme geared towards longer assignments.
