DALE DOES **JOB IN SALE**

Moss 'N' Dale (NZ) (Castledale) took out the \$200,000 Listed Ladbrokes Sale Cup (1600m), on the back-up after placing in last week's Seymour Cup.

The Peter Gelagotis-trained galloper has now won 10 of his 21 starts, but his Sale success is his most lucrative after he rode the speed behind pacesetter Jungle Edge (Dubawi) - and held out the fast-finishing, and wayward running, Fastnet Tempest (Fastnet Rock).

Gelagotis suggested he might give the horse a well-earned break after a long, successful prep.

"We made the decision to back him up today after we got him home from Seymour last week," he said.

"We got him off the float and I rang my brother and told him this horse has pulled up enormous.

"It was a great run in the Seymour Cup as he had to do all the work outside them and gave the horses behind him a cart-up. They just got him late there while the track was

probably a little firm for what we wanted."

Gelagotis was confident leading into the race after finding conditions in favour of his charge.

"He just profiled so well for today and when we saw the forecast going forward I said to the guys we should roll the dice," he said.

"A massive congratulations to Anthony (Darmanin) for a great ride and also to Lenny Russo who bred the horse and put the syndicate together who own him.

"Quite simply he is my favourite in the stable as you can do anything with him and every day of the week he gives you the same effort.

"To be quite honest I think he deserves a break now so we can look after him and reward him for his efforts."

The five-year-old son of Castledale, bred in New Zealand, took his career prizemoney north of \$400,000 with the stakes success.

SON OF MAHER SET FOR COUPLAND'S MILE FOLLOWING PRELUDE VICTORY

Leading local candidate **Son Of Maher** (Al Maher) booked his place in the upcoming Coupland's Bakeries Mile at Riccarton when he strode to a comprehensive victory on his home patch on the weekend.

Trainers Michael and Matthew Pitman targeted Saturday's open 1400 metre contest to take advantage of the automatic qualifying spot it provided into the Group Two feature during New Zealand Cup Week and were rewarded with an emphatic performance from their charge.

Rider Samantha Wynne had the flashy five-year-old travelling beautifully behind the speed after securing a handy position through a deft piece of riding from a wide barrier. Wynne bided her time before angling wider on the home corner to issue a challenge that saw Son Of Maher dash to the front with 200 metres to run and ease away to a length victory at the line.

"We've had the Coupland's Mile in mind for him right from the start of this campaign so it's nice to get him in

the field after that win," noted Michael Pitman.

"We had thought about running him at Ashburton last week, but we knew a win here would get the automatic spot so that's where we decided to go with him.

"He will get in now with a pretty competitive weight and while he is still on the way up we think he can put in a good showing."

Pitman was also feeling a touch of relief to have the horse back in

winning form after the decision was made to geld him following a disappointing four-year-old campaign.

"You are always taking a risk when you geld them as a late four-year-old, but I do think it has been the making of him," he explained.

"He was just going through the motions towards the end of his last campaign, but he has been a different horse this time in and I think we will see the best of him in this campaign.

"That was only his second run back so there is plenty of improvement in him. The decision we have now

is whether to give him another run before the Couplands or to go straight into the race from here.

"There is a suitable race at Wingatui on Melbourne Cup Day so if the track is okay he may go there but we won't make up our minds about that until we see what the weather is going to do."

The win took Son Of Maher's career record to five wins from 22 career starts along with seven minor placings that include a runner-up finish in the 2016 Gr. 1 Levin Classic as a three-year-old.

THREE TIMES A CHARM FOR TE AKAU RACING

The powerful Te Akau Racing operation was well in winning mode on the weekend as they notched a successful treble including stakes success for promising mare **Grazia (NZ)** (Savabeel) in the Listed Christchurch Casino Spring Classic at Riccarton.

Given a beautiful run in transit, Grazia dashed clear for an impressive victory in a race that team Te Akau had targeted at the end of her previous campaign where she had won three of her last five starts.

Beaten a nose on the same course earlier in October, after resuming there with a close fifth to stable-mate Imperium (NZ) (Encosta De Lago) in September, both times over a mile, the step up in distance and carrying

minimum weight (53kgs) were key components in the success.

"We thought she would have won a race by now, down here, but she's been held up by wet tracks and other bits and pieces," co-trainer Jamie Richards said.

"We sent her down for this stakes race and it's worked out really well. I thought Sam Weatherley made the right decision about the mile to slide forward on her, it was very important. He got her into a lovely rhythm and she quickened up super."

Given a beautiful ride by apprentice Sam Weatherley, Grazia travelled sweetly in fourth, ranged ominously outside the leaders inside the 600m and ran away to win by three and a half lengths.

It was Weatherley's second victory for team Te Akau after notching his inaugural success aboard flying two-year-old filly **Avantage** (Fastnet Rock) earlier in the day.

An impressive debut winner on the course earlier in the month, Avantage had no problem making it two from two in the NZB Insurance Pearl Series 2YO 800 metre event. Catching the start well to lead, Avantage travelled best throughout and distanced her rivals to win untouched by six lengths.

"I was absolutely thrilled because the owners of Avantage turned down \$750,000 for her, after she won her first race," said Te Akau principal David Ellis, who purchased the filly in January this year for \$210,000 at the NZB Premier Yearling Sale, from the Oaks Stud draft.

"To turn down that sort of money showed what good sports they are. She was a foal share with Coolmore Stud and Southlander Willy Calder, and when Opie (Bosson) rode her at the trials he told us she was the real deal. She's a Fastnet Rock filly out of a Zabeel mare and they just keep getting better."

The flying filly will now take aim at the Listed Welcome Stakes on 18 November, a race that the stable has compiled a powerful record in with a roll of honour that includes Sassy 'N' Smart (Smart Missile), Bespoke (NZ) (Pins), Encosta Diablo (NZ) (Encosta De Lago) and Maroofity (NZ) (Maroof).

Smart three-year-old **Embellish (NZ)** (Savabeel) closed out Te Akau's day when he delivered an emphatic performance against the older horses at Trentham to establish himself as the outright favourite for the Gr. 1 Al Basti Equiworld Two Thousand Guineas at Riccarton next month.

The brother to noted Group One performer Diademe (NZ) needed a win to cement a start in the Guineas and couldn't have been more impressive as he dashed away in the run home to win comfortably in the hands of leading rider Opie Bosson.

"Wasn't that a beautiful Opie Bosson ride?" commented Ellis. "He's a pretty exciting colt and will now travel on down to Riccarton on Sunday and

join the team there.

"We bought this horse to hopefully stand at stud one day and he needs to win a classic race like the 2000 Guineas to pull it off."

TAB bookmakers reacted to the win

by shortening the Savabeel colt into outright favourite at \$4 on the fixed odds market for the 2000 Guineas, ahead of stable-mate Te Akau Shark (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) at \$7.

MEESKA MOOSKA CRACKS FIRST WIN FOR NEW CAMBRIDGE PARTNERSHIP

Underrated stayer **Meeska Mooska (NZ)** (El Hermano) upset predictions at Ellerslie on Saturday as he registered the first victory for the newly minted training partnership of Graham Thomas and former top jumps rider Matthew Gillies.

The seven-year-old gelding was unwanted by punters despite boasting an impressive record on the prevailing slow track conditions and having won first-up to kick-off his last campaign.

Settled in a handy position on the outer in the six-horse field, rider Alysha Collett brought the son of El Hermano into the race on the point of the home turn before issuing a solid challenge halfway down the Ellerslie home straight. After a brief battle with race favourite Ronchi (NZ) (Stravinsky), who had dictated the pace at the head of affairs throughout, Meeska Mooska drove clear to record his seventh career victory.

Co-trainer Matthew Gillies was delighted to register the first official win for the Cambridge combination.

"We've had a few winners over the past few months, but it has taken a while for the licence to come through," he noted.

"It's good today as it has now come through and it's also good for the horse as he is a talented galloper who we have a lot to look forward with in

his coming races."

Gillies admitted to some confidence in the camp despite the fact the horse was fresh-up from a five-month break and kicking off at an unsuitable distance.

"I thought he was a chance as he had been working well but Graham had said he hadn't really gone well over 1400 metres," he said.

"While the stats were against him I thought he could win and he has delivered for us."

Gillies is no stranger to racing success having ridden 85 winners during his career in the saddle including victories aboard Tallyho Twinkletoe (NZ) (St Reims) in the 2015 Grand National Hurdles while

he also claimed the Great Northern Hurdle and Steeplechase double in 2011 aboard Southern Countess (NZ) (Stark South) and Ima Heroine (NZ) (Heroicity) respectively.

VIKTOR REWARDS STABLE CONFIDENCE AT ELLERSLIE



Viktor Vegas has a bright future ahead on the evidence produced during his fresh-up victory at Ellerslie

The Cambridge training duo of Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman returned to a familiar position at the head of the National Trainer's Premiership on Saturday after completing a winning double with **Viktor Vegas (NZ)** (Tavistock) and **Crafty Jess (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) at Ellerslie.

Last season's premiership winners levelled up to previous leader Kevin Myers when Crafty Jess was successful in a rating 85 1600 metre contest before nudging ahead through impressive rating 65 1400 metre winner Viktor Vegas. It was the four-year-old Tavistock gelding's second win at just his third start and marked him as a horse to watch over the coming months.

"We think a fair bit of him and we were pretty confident he would go well on Saturday," noted co-trainer Murray Baker.

"His work has been very good and he was ready to run a race first up. He doesn't mind a bit of cut in the ground, so I thought he would be able to handle the conditions okay.

"There's plenty of development left in him so we will take him along slowly and try to get him through the grades before we think about a specific target for him."

Baker was also impressed with the win of Crafty Jess who has proved a model of consistency throughout an extended campaign.

“She’s a tough little thing who has kept improving and did the job well for us,” he said.

“I don’t think there is any doubt she was helped by the claim as getting down to 51 kilograms was a big assist.”

Ridden by Cambridge apprentice Hairi Marzuki, Crafty Jess bided her time at the rear of the field before unleashing a powerful finishing burst out wide to claim her fourth career victory at just her 14th start.

Baker has also confirmed that last season’s Australian Derby winner Jon Snow (NZ) (Iffraaj) will take his place in the Gr. 1 Emirates Melbourne Cup on 7 November.

“He has pulled up well from his Caulfield Cup run and we

will press on to the Melbourne Cup with him,” he said.

“He got knocked over in the run home at Caulfield and we think he deserves his place at Flemington. He is a big horse and having his momentum taken away cost him as he couldn’t pick himself up and sprint.

“The roomy track at Flemington will suit as would some rain if we could get it.”

Baker also confirmed star mare Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi) would be returning home from Melbourne this week for a brief spell before being aimed at the Sydney Autumn Carnival.

EXCEED EXPRESS BACK ON THE FAST LANE TO SUCCESS

New Zealand jockey Craig Grylls was all smiles as he brought home his first Singapore double on Sunday.

Two races after he had to battle the elements – rain and mud - and land the spoils on roughie Heracles (Fast Company), Grylls was able to enjoy a smoother ride on bold frontrunner **Exceed Express (NZ)** (Exceed And Excel) in the \$60,000 Class 4 scamper over 1000m.

The son of Exceed And Excel has not greeted the judge since November 2014 when victorious for Corey Brown and his former handler Laurie Laxon in a Kranji Stakes C race over 1200m.

At the time, the speedy three-year-old was one of Laxon's up-and-comers, ringing up his fourth win in only seven runs, with a whole vista of opportunities at his doorstep.

But his next 16 starts – interspersed by many breaks - have all come to nought until Sunday, which was at his first start for Lee Freedman and Grylls.

Taking full advantage of his inside draw (two), Exceed Express pinged the gate to take the lead rather effortlessly. Once in front, Grylls was able to give him a breather before stoking him up for the last dash to the line.

Exceed Express actually bounded away inside the last 250m to put a big space of four lengths between him and the next best, Faithfully (Hidden Dragon) who won the battle for the minors.

The winning time was a slick 58.25 seconds for the 1000m on Polytrack, only 0.07 second outside the Class record.

Grylls, who was at his eighth success in Singapore and recently had his licence renewed until the end of the year, was surprised how the Lai Voon Wai-owned galloper was so dominant on Sunday.

"I rode him in trackwork once and he pulled a lot. He pulled so hard again today," said Grylls.

"Though he was fresh-up, he still had a kick left in him at the top of the straight. This is my first double here, may there be more winners."

Freedman said the key to Exceed Express was to keep his runs well spaced out.

"He hasn't won for three years, so you can say his wins have been well spaced out!" he joked.

"He has a few issues, but I told (assistant-trainer) Shane (Ellis) he is still going so well. He feels no pain right now.

"He's been trialling very well. He leads at all his jumpouts and he did that so well today."
