TARZINO ON FRONT FOOT **FOR MAKYBE DIVA**



Classy performer Tarzino is ready for his next Group One challenge this weekend

Tarzino (NZ) (Tavistock) has not put a foot wrong in the lead-up to Saturday's Makybe Diva Stakes despite a raceday vet's report he was lame after his last start.

Trainer Mick Price remains puzzled by the vet's assessment the four-year-old was lame in his off hind leg after the New Zealand Bloodstock Memsie Stakes.

The dual Group One winner finished eighth in his first-up run in the Memsie at Caulfield on August 27.

Price said Tarzino appeared fine in the hours after the race and he had no concerns when he inspected the four-year-old the following morning.

He said Tarzino had continued his preparation for Saturday's Makybe Diva Stakes without any hint of a problem.

"We couldn't find anything," Price said. "You can have two vets look at the same horse and not necessarily have the same opinion and especially with hind quarter lameness.

"The hind quarter is a big area and they only have to put in the odd abnormal stride and you can come up with that diagnosis, which I can understand.

"We looked at him at 5.30 and again at six o'clock that

night and again at 8 o'clock the next morning and he was all fine.

"He hasn't missed a beat since. I haven't got a query on him."

Michael Dee rode Tarzino in a 1200m-gallop at Caulfield on Saturday morning and Price said the horse would have another hit-out at Caulfield on Tuesday morning.

And Price is happy to see Tarzino back at Flemington on Saturday.

"He loves Flemington and I think you'll see him run well," Price said.

"So long as he's hitting the line, like he did at Caulfield, I'll be happy."

Tarzino won last year's Victoria Derby at Flemington and returned in the autumn to run a close second in the Australian Guineas at the same track when second-up from a spell.

He took the Rosehill Guineas in Sydney before his fourth to Tavago (NZ) (Tavistock) in the ATC Australian Derby.

With 54kg in the Caulfield Cup, Tarzino currently heads the betting for that race in October at \$13 and shares the second line at \$21 for the Melbourne Cup.

GUST OF WIND **RETIRED**



Australian Oaks winner *Gust Of Wind* has been retired

A heart fibrillation suffered during Saturday's Gr. 2 Tramway Stakes at Randwick has seen top racemare **Gust Of Wind (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) retired from racing.

The five-year-old Darci Brahma mare, who finished 4th in last year's Caulfield Cup behind Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor), was having the first run in a new preparation for trainer John Sargent with the Melbourne Cup in November as her

main aim. Those plans have now been put aside as she prepares for a visit to her owner, Sir Owen Glenn's stallion Criterion (NZ) (Sebring) in the next 10 days.

"We knew something was wrong straight after the race and had her checked out immediately," advised Sargent.

"She fibrillated badly so Sir Owen decided to retire her and she will now make a visit to Criterion to commence a breeding career.

"She was already booked to visit Criterion next week with the plan to then race her up until the Melbourne Cup so instead of returning to the stable she will head to the broodmare paddock instead."

Gust Of Wind won three races during her career including the 2015 Gr. 1 Australian Oaks where she inflicted a defeat on super mare Winx (Street Cry) who has remained unbeaten since.

DEBT COLLECTOR RETURNS A WINNER IN JUMBO JET THRILLER

Exciting galloper **Debt Collector (NZ)** (Thorn Park) returned to racing with the same panache he showed as a three-year-old when he landed a nail-biter in the \$200,000 SGP Gr.3 Jumbo Jet Trophy (1400m) on Sunday.

The son of Thorn Park went for a well-earned break after his three-year-old exploits when he landed the last two Legs of the Singapore Three-Year-Old Challenge, including the Group 1 Singapore Guineas (1600m) in May, with what has now become his trademark electric turn of foot.

His work and barrier trials had been good, but trainer Cliff Brown had cautioned he may face a big ask first-up against seasoned gallopers at weight-for-age level.

But horses don't listen to humans, but he sure responded to regular partner Michael Rodd's hard riding from the top of the straight to just blouse out Nova Strike (NZ) (Red Giant) right on the line.

Brown again looked bemused by that fifth win recorded by a horse he has now put in the same top bracket as his champion sprinter, the just-retired dual Lion City Cup winner Zac Spirit (Flying Spur).

The day had actually not begun on the best note for the Australian conditioner when his two fancied runners killed each other's chances by "playing pinball machine" at the start in an earlier race, but his other former smart three-year-old Fitzroy's win one race earlier followed by Debt Collector's game win when he thought he would need the run more than made up for the disappointment.

"It didn't start very well today, but things have certainly improved since," he said in his usual understated manner.

"Credit must go to the stable staff, (assistant-trainer) Tim Fitzsimmons and all the boys who ride him and look after him.

"It was an incredible win. He also defied the way the track has been playing when he came out wide. This horse can certainly do things other horses cannot.

"Zac Spirit was a great horse, but this one has to be up there with the best."

Debt Collector has now amassed more than \$640,000 in prizemoney for his owner, the Victorian-based Barree Stable.

SALAMANCA FINDS HIS WINNING GROOVE AT WANGANUI

A return trip to the New Zealand Cup Carnival in November is the long term aim for consistent sprinter **Salamanca (NZ)** (Alamosa) after the six-year-old returned to winning form at Wanganui on the weekend.

In a gritty display the Alamosa gelding displayed all his fighting qualities to hold out his rivals in a blanket finish to the Coro Angel Syndicate sponsored open 1200 metre contest and register his eighth win from just 27 starts.

The victory came off the back of a disappointing run in the Listed Opunake Cup back in July however trainer Mike Breslin was prepared to forgive the effort that day after the gelding pulled up with a muscle issue.

"The run at New Plymouth was totally out character for him as he is such an honest horse who tries his best every time he steps out," he explained.

"When he pulled up that day he was a little sore on cooling down so we thought he might have slipped when he jumped out of the barrier and tweaked a muscle or two. We gave him a couple of weeks off with plenty of work on the massage machine and he seemed to come right after that."

A pleasing performance during a jumpout last week had Breslin confident of a good performance on the weekend.

"He went nicely in a jumpout so I thought I had him somewhere near his best for Saturday," he said.

"The weight relief he got with Danielle (Hirini) riding him also played its part as he had to work pretty hard to cross them early on however she rated him nicely after that and he fought strongly to the line."

Breslin is now eyeing up a \$40,000 sprint at Ellerslie in three weeks as the geldings next target with a tilt at the Gr. 3 Lindauer Stewards Stakes on the middle day of Riccarton's New Zealand Cup Carnival a distinct possibility.

"There are several options for him coming up but I think the race at Ellerslie is where we will go next," he noted.

"Longer term I'd like to take him south for a crack at the Stewards provided the tracks retain some

moisture in them.

"He went a beauty on the first day last year on a track that was a little too firm for him but didn't back up well in the Stewards after that. This time I think we would go into the race fresh as long as we can get the weather to play in our favour."

PITMAN PRODUCES ANOTHER ACE WITH FIRST SERVE



First Serve sizzles home for an impressive first-up win at Riccarton

By all appearances the winning performance of burgeoning South Island sprint star **First Serve (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) on her home track on Saturday looked pretty much like a stroll in the park.

The classy Swiss Ace mare was having the first start in her four-year-old campaign and while co-trainer Michael Pitman expected a good showing he wasn't expecting to hear the phenomenal last sectional his charge recorded as she loped past her four rivals to score comfortably in her open class debut.

The winning time for Riccarton's New Zealand Bloodstock sponsored open 1000 metre sprint was a tidy 57.87 seconds however the final 600 metres was cut out in a sizzling 32.79, one of the fastest recorded in recent years.

"We were pleased with her heading into the race but thought she would take plenty of benefit from the run as she

hadn't had a trial," Pitman explained. "She settled nicely and only really extended over the last couple of hundred metres which was how we wanted to see it all unfold. It wasn't until afterwards that I got told what the sectionals were and she did it from a couple of lengths off them so it was some run."

While Pitman was delighted with the performance he was also thrilled for the large group of owners who make up the Pearl Fillies syndicate who race the mare.

"Jim Bruford bought her for me at Karaka for \$6,000 and we decided to syndicate her along with two other fillies, Queen Serene and Fade To Grey, to have a go at some of those Pearl Series bonus races," he said.

"We have around 20 people in the syndicate and they are spread from Auckland to Riverton. Each of the horses has won a race but this one looks like she could be extra special so it's

a great thing for the owners and for racing.”

Pitman, who prepares First Serve with son Matthew, has played a waiting game with the mare who is unbeaten at Riccarton in four starts and who has only tasted defeat once when beaten in Group Three company at Te Rapa last season behind New Zealand Champion three-year-old Xtravagant (NZ) (Pentire).

“She was very immature as a two-year-old so we had to keep backing off her,” he said. “Once she started to strengthen up we had planned an early three-year-old run but she had a wee problem that set her back so she didn’t start racing until March.

“I think she is going to be at her best as a five-year-old so missing that early racing will stand her in good stead as she gets to the top grade. Her female side is quite a slow

maturing one that has plenty of form over a middle distance so while she is sprinting now I think later on she will get to at least a mile without any trouble.”

Pitman will now set the mare for another home track effort in October before tackling the major sprint races during the New Zealand Cup Carnival in November.

Quiet Reflection wins second Group One

Haunui Farm based shuttle stallion **Showcasing** (Oasis Dream) enjoyed further Northern Hemisphere success over the weekend when his three-year-old daughter Quiet Reflection won her second Group One of the season in the Sprint Cup at Haydock.

The Karl Burke-trained three-year-old won the Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot and had been aimed at Haydock since her third in the July Cup won by Limato (Tagula).

Sent out as the race favourite, Quiet Reflection handled the tough conditions that prevailed to beat The Tin Man (Equiano) by 1-3/4 lengths. She will now head to Royal Ascot for the Qipco British Champions Sprint on October 15.

Jockey Dougie Costello was in awe of the performance as he spoke after the race: “I’ve never ridden anything like it and I probably never will again. For a filly to be press-button go it’s impressive.

“She’s the real deal. She makes everything look like it’s going two gears slower than she’s going.”

Showcasing has enjoyed a successful start to his New Zealand stud career, producing the winner of New Zealand’s richest race, the 2015 Listed Karaka Million, in Hardline (NZ) along with Group Two winner Showboy (NZ) and New Zealand Derby placegetter Raghu (NZ).

Showcasing will stand at a fee of \$15,000 + GST at Haunui Farm during this breeding season.

DANIELLE JOHNSON CONFIRMED FOR SOFIA ROSA RIDE

New Zealand jockey Danielle Johnson will get another chance to win a Group One race on **Sofia Rosa (NZ)** (Makfi) when she replaces the suspended Michael Walker in the Makybe Diva Stakes.

Johnson was denied the New Zealand Oaks when Mark Hills on Fanatic (NZ) (Shocking) successfully protested against her with the margin a nose.

Hugh Bowman rode the Stephen Marsh-trained mare to win the Australian Oaks in Sydney in April.

The Makybe Diva Stakes (1600m) at Flemington on Saturday will be Sofia Rosa's second start in Australia since her Oaks win with the mare 10th in the New Zealand Bloodstock

Memsie Stakes after playing up in the barrier and being checked in the first half of the race.

With the exception of the NZ Oaks, Johnson has a perfect record on Sofia Rosa with three wins from three rides including two at Group level.

As an apprentice, Johnson spent time in Sydney as the winner of the Chris Waller Scholarship which the trainer sponsors in conjunction with the Auckland Racing Club.

She also rode in the jockeys' Origin series in Brisbane last summer.

Walker was outed for careless riding at Moonee Valley on Saturday.

WHEN THE GOING GOT TOUGH REKA GOT GOING

Ellerslie specialist **Reka (NZ)** (Storm Creek) once again demonstrated his affinity for New Zealand's premier racetrack when he gave his rivals another galloping lesson at headquarters on Saturday.

The rugged eight-year-old gelding registered his tenth career win and 5th at Ellerslie when he took out the Hyland Race Colours 2200 in fine fashion, courtesy of a heady ride from pilot Danielle Johnson.

Trainer Richard Sherwin was delighted with the effort of

both horse and rider as his pre-race plan was executed to perfection.

"He is just so tough and loves a fight so I wanted Danielle to make them chase her by putting the pressure on from the 800 metre mark," he said.

"We knew Katie McKeen would lead but I told Danielle that as soon as she tried to take a breather to hunt my guy into it and she followed those instructions to the letter."

Sherwin admitted he had been in two minds as to whether to continue the gelding's campaign after he finished a long last in the Listed Taumarunui Gold Cup back in July.

"He never fired a shot that day and after the race he had an elevated heart rate," he explained.

"We gave him a jump-out a week later and it was still up quite a bit so I thought about pulling the pin. I took it easy with him for a few days and he slowly came right although he is a hard horse to get a line on at home as he just loves to work so you never quite know if there is an issue or not."

A spirited trackwork gallop on Tuesday had Sherwin

convinced his charge was back to full health and he duly obliged on the weekend.

"He's just a real warhorse and as long as he's okay over the next few days we will be back at Ellerslie later in the month," he advised.

"He's now won ten races and over \$200,000 but I still think he has a few more in him while the tracks have some cut in them."

FITZROY COMES UP **TRUMPS AGAIN**

The \$75,000 King And King 2007 Stakes Graduation race over 1200m was dubbed as a match-race between **Fitzroy (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) and Queen Roulette (Ruwi) in the build-up, but as it often happens in horse racing, the script did not quite work out that way with Fitzroy clearly

the better horse than Leslie Khoo's mare on the day, albeit in a much harder fashion than expected.

Queen Roulette, who was sent out as the second favourite led from barrier rise with Fitzroy immediately in her slipstream in an one-out one-back position and Chopin's Nocturne (NZ) (Pins) settling in the box-seat.

As it turned out, the race would indeed be decided between those three protagonists, but not quite in the pattern most had foreseen.

Queen Roulette, who won her last race by coming from behind, did hold sway for about 100m in the home straight before caving in when Chopin's Nocturne drew upsides while Fitzroy was stalking one-and-a-half

length away.

The talented son of Swiss Ace sprouted wings when it mattered to finally get the better of Chopin's Nocturne by half-a-length on the line. Queen Roulette ran third another 1 ¼ lengths away. The winning time was 1 min 11.1secs for the 1200m on the Short Course.

Winning trainer Cliff Brown was a relieved man his ward finally went through his gears at a time when it looked a lost cause for a while.

"If that horse had gone straight, he should have won more easily. He kept looking at the other horse who was shifting out and didn't seem to know what to do," said the Australian trainer.

"But he put it away when he had to and that is all that matters."

Fitzroy has now brought his record to three wins and one second from seven starts for stakes earnings close to the \$150,000 mark for the Fitzroy Stable.

AWATERE SCORES FIRST KRANJI WIN FOR NEW ZEALAND OWNER

Trainer Mark Walker was extremely pleased for New Zealand owner Craig Forsyth after he was able to taste his first success in Singapore on Sunday.

A part-owner under David Ellis's Te Akau Stable banner since 2005, Forsyth decided it was high time to venture out on his own in Singapore and quite logically sent his first runner **Awatere** (Charge Forward) to Ellis's exclusive trainer at Kranji.

After only three outings, the Charge Forward three-year-old already had the foot on the till, producing late in an Initiation event over 1200m three weeks ago to finish only 1 ¼ lengths off stablemate Mighty Conqueror (NZ) (Patapan).

Walker stepped him up in distance in Sunday's \$75,000 Flax 2014 Stakes, a Restricted Maiden race over 1400m, and with champion jockey Manoel Nunes back from suspension, hungrier than ever, Forsyth could record his first Singapore winner.

"It's the first winner for the Forsyth family. David Ellis bought this horse for NZ\$50,000 out of Karaka," said Walker.

"He was physically weak when he first came but he is going to be a nice horse with more time. He just ground away to a nice solid win today."

Walker, who saddled Friday's last winner thanks to Mighty Conqueror, said that second September winner was a sign the tide was turning after enduring a quiet time during his stables renovation.

"It's been two weeks since we went back to our stables, and we can feel the difference already. It was a

nightmare being in the other barn," said Walker, who currently sits third on the premiership on 49 winners, five short of Alwin Tan.
