



SUPPORT CONTINUES FOR TURN ME LOOSE IN ORR



Turn Me Loose starts a new campaign in Group One company at Caulfield tomorrow

Early money has continued to flow for New Zealand galloper **Turn Me Loose (NZ)** (Iffraaj) ahead of his first-up run in the CF Orr Stakes.

Since the barrier draw for the Group One race at Caulfield on Saturday, Turn Me Loose has shortened from \$6 into \$4.80 and is challenging Lucky Hussler (Husson) for favouritism.

Turn Me Loose hasn't raced since winning the Emirates Stakes at Flemington last November but is in top order according to his regular rider Opie Bosson.

"He's grown up a bit and I can feel that riding him," Bosson said.

"He showed in his trial that he's starting to relax a little bit now and seems to be going the right way."

Turn Me Loose has won six of 11 starts with a further four placings.

His only unplaced performance came first-up in the Makfi Challenge Stakes at Hastings last August and he's yet to win fresh.

"I can't fault him this time in but you have to be mindful of his fresh-up record that he needs a run or so to come right," Bosson said.

"But his work has been good, his trial was good and really I couldn't be any happier with him."

Bosson enjoyed a profitable Melbourne spring, winning the Caulfield Cup on Turn Me Loose's stablemate Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor) before a suspension kept him out of the Emirates Stakes meeting.

Turn Me Loose led throughout when successful in his three wins in Melbourne last campaign, but trainer Murray Baker said the four-year-old didn't have to lead in his races.

He said Turn Me Loose had gate speed and that puts him straight up on the pace.

What Baker didn't count on is the Orr having a capacity field of 18 runners with 13 individual Group One winners.

"We miscalculated a bit there," he said.

"It's an extraordinary field but we wouldn't be lining up if

we didn't think he was ready."

Baker intends to head to Sydney with Turn Me Loose following the Futurity Stakes on February 27 where he holds nominations for the Doncaster Mile and Queen Elizabeth Stakes during The Championships.

HOWELL PRAYING FOR LUCK FOR SORIANO SWANSONG

Denise Howell has one final wish for **Soriano's (NZ)** (Savabeel) swansong race - a little luck.

Howell bred and races the dual Group One-winning Savabeel mare, who shoots for back-to-back wins in the Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes (2000m) at Te Rapa tomorrow, her final race before her mandatory retirement through reaching 120 days of her pregnancy.

In foal to Waikato Stud stallion Pins, Soriano goes into the weight-for-age feature off the back of a string of luckless performances, most recently when bumped and pocketed on the turn in the Gr.1 Thorndon Mile before she was held up in the straight in finishing fifth behind Herbie Dyke rivals

Kawi (NZ) (Savabeel) and **Stolen Dance (NZ)** (Alamosa).

"All she needs is some luck. I'm thinking about going to church sometime before the race just to help the cause," Howell said.

"She's never been better and it's a shame really she has to finish up because she's still racing as well as ever. I'd hate to think she gets bad luck in the last race of her career."

Trained by Hamilton's Graeme and Debbie Rogerson, Soriano has won nine of her 51 starts, winning on debut as a two-year-old before finishing fourth in the Gr.1 Diamond Stakes at Ellerslie at just her second start.

In all, she won seven stakes races and was 16 times stakes-placed, her first Group One win in the 2014 Zabeel Classic at Ellerslie, aptly in the hands of stable apprentice Rory Hutchings.

Two starts later, she added the Herbie Dyke Stakes and this season she has claimed a Gr.2 double with the Tauranga Stakes followed by the Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes at Avondale.

"It would be lovely to go out on a high note, especially because if she wins she will bring up \$1 million in earnings," Howell said.

"Rory winning [the Zabeel Classic] at Ellerslie was one of the biggest buzzes I've had in racing and then the Herbie Dyke last year because I was there. But there's been some disappointments along the way too. We've lost a few through bad rides.

"But she's going to have a great life as a broodmare. She's done us proud."

Howell reserved special praise for the training partnership of Graeme and Debbie Rogerson, for whom she is also stable manager, for their job in guiding Soriano's career.

"To keep her up so long in this calibre of company is a true testament to their training and the facilities here. She doesn't want for anything, which is Graeme's philosophy for every horse. It's fantastic that she's retiring 100 per cent sound," Howell said.

VESPA READY TO DRAG OFF SPRINT RIVALS

Vespa (NZ) (Elusive City) is set to scoot in Saturday's Gr.1 NRM Sprint (1400m) at Te Rapa.

The Elusive City four-year-old entire is one of seven Group One winners in the field for the Waikato Racing Club sprint feature and goes into the weight-for-age event in superb order, according to Otaki trainer Johno Benner.

Of the seven runners in the Gr.1 Telegraph (1200m) at Trentham sent out at \$11 or less, fifth-placed Vespa was the only one to finish in the first 10, a fact Benner has taken much encouragement from.

"We were absolutely rapt with his first-up run," said Benner, who trains in partnership with Holly Wynyard.

"He'd had a long time off and the track came up a bit tricky with the rain

but of the big guns, he's gone the best. He really attacked the line. The plan was always to start off in the Telegraph and then go on to Waikato and he's trained on really well."

TAB bookmakers have installed Vespa as a \$10 equal fourth favourite in a market headed by Gr.1 2000 Guineas winner Xtravagant (NZ) (Pentire) at \$2.70.

"We're expecting a strong tempo and while he's drawn out a bit [in barrier 11], we're hopeful he can slot in one-off better than midfield and from there be attacking the line again," Benner said.

"We think he's a genuine Group One horse and we are heading to Te Rapa hoping we can get there and get the job done."

Safely through tomorrow's race,

Benner and Wynyard will consider Vespa for the Gr.1 Haunui Farm WFA Classic (1600m) at Otaki on February 27 before assessing options in Australia.

Vespa won the Karaka Million and Gr.1 Diamond Stakes at Ellerslie as a two-year-old and won the Gr.2 Wellington Guineas before splitting Group One winners Pondarosa Miss (NZ) (High Chaparral) and Kawi (NZ) (Savabeel) when second in last year's Gr.1 Easter Handicap (1600m) at Ellerslie.

Meanwhile, Benner and Wynyard will also aim to get a green light for their New Zealand Derby plans for Humidor (NZ) (Teofilo) when he tackles the Bupa Care Services 2100 at Te Rapa.

Sensationally backed from \$21 to \$7.50 for last Saturday's Gr.2 Waikato Guineas at Te Rapa, Humidor was scratched on the morning of the race after he knocked a leg.

"It just puffed up overnight and we had to do the right thing by the horse," Benner said.

"He got home and has worked fine. Actually he's worked very well this week. To get into the Derby we need to get his stakes earnings up so we'll go to Te Rapa and run for \$30,000 to give him his chance."

Tavago to miss key Derby lead-up

The final dress rehearsal for the Gr.1 BMW New Zealand Derby will be missing one player of note.

Tavago (NZ) (Tavistock) held sway in the Blue Riband betting market before his last-start failure and he has been ruled out of Saturday week's Gr.2 Auckland Eye Avondale Guineas.

The Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young-trained son of Tavistock was the favourite going into the Gr.2 Waikato Guineas, but he tailed the field home and his Derby hopes are now in the balance.

"He was jarred up after the race," Busuttin said. "He had his first-up run after eight weeks over a mile and on a two week back-up the firm track really found him out. [Full story here.](#)

Sydney carnival on radar for Azkadellia

Ciaran Maher will be without two of his stable's big guns during the autumn, but the trainer still has enough horsepower to make an impact.

Group One winners Set Square (Reset) and Srikandi (Dubawi) will be missing from autumn action but on Saturday at Caulfield exciting mare **Azkadellia (NZ)** (Shinko King) resumes in the Bellmaine Stakes.

Azkadellia was unlucky in the Group One Myer Classic last spring when flashing home for third and Maher has Doncaster Mile hopes for the mare.

"She's still a bit soft going into Saturday but she's had a couple of soft trials and she's ticking over well," he said.

"I'm sort of hoping her class can carry her a long way."

Allpress' Derby chance progressing well

A day trip to Avondale this week has Lisa Allpress confident her New Zealand Derby hope **Dukedom (NZ)** (Bachelor Duke) is on target for another Group One challenge.

The Wanganui-based jockey, who returns to riding at Te Rapa on Saturday after a 10-day suspension, flew north on Wednesday to partner the Steven Cole-trained three-year-old in an exhibition gallop.

"He had a good blow out over 1000 metres and he was nice and relaxed, we're all happy with him," Allpress said.

Dukedom will run in Saturday week's Gr.2 Auckland Eye Avondale Guineas to complete his preparation for the Gr.1 BMW NZ Derby, in which he is a \$14 chance. [Full story here.](#)

Filly to let rip in Australia

Shaune Ritchie is again hoping to see **Let Her Rip (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle) make an early impression when she kicks off a new campaign.

"I'm mindful that she's got an impeccable record fresh-up and we may look at either Sydney or Melbourne," the Cambridge trainer said.

"There are 1400 metre races in a couple of weeks' time so we'll put in nominations for both and take it from there."

Unbeaten in two previous first-up assignments, Let Her Rip hasn't raced since she finished fifth in the Gr.1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas at Riccarton in November.

Derby winner kicks off in Autumn Stakes

Mick Price is taking a big-picture approach in starting the autumn campaign of **Tarzino (NZ)** (Tavistock) against the Victoria Derby winner's own age. Tarzino is nominated for Saturday's Group One CF Orr Stakes at Caulfield but Price said the colt would make his return in the Group Two Autumn Stakes over the same distance. "I thought that this year's running of the Orr presents as a really good race. A really tough race," Price said.

"I probably don't need Tarzino to have an absolute gut buster against the good horses.

"It's not so much where we start with Tarzino, it's more that he goes into the Australian Derby at his best." Tarzino is scheduled to run in the Group One Australian Guineas second-up at Flemington before heading to Sydney for the Rosehill Guineas and ATC Australian Derby.

Star stayer returns with bold trial

The focus was on New Zealand's reigning Horse of the Year **Mongolian Khan** (Holy Roman Emperor) at Tuesday's Matamata trials and the Gr.1 Caulfield Cup winner revelled in the spotlight.

The four-year-old continued his impressive comeback from the severe colic attack that ended his spring campaign and a shot at the Gr.1 Melbourne Cup with a bold showing in his 1200 metre heat.

Mongolian Khan hit the line strongly for seventh and towed rider Opie Bosson for some distance after the finish – "I couldn't pull him up. He was strong the last bit and he's pretty well," he said.

Mongolian Khan will cross the Tasman later this month, although his exact destination has yet to be confirmed. [Full story here.](#)
