



WINNING RETURN FOR SPALATO



Star galloper **Spalato (NZ)** (Elusive City) did not let his legion of fans down at his much-awaited racing comeback when he flew the last 200m to claim a stylish win in the \$125,000 Kranji Stakes A race (1000m) on Sunday.

Unseen since his brave second in the Group 2 EW Barker Trophy (1400m) last November, the Elusive City six-year-old was facing only five rivals that were largely considered beatable by his standards, but first-up over a trip he has not ventured over since his whopping 9 ¾-length debut win in 2014 is always a cause for not falling into the trap of complacency.

Not to mention a last-minute change of jockey after Michael Rodd, himself a new partner freshly picked for the

steering job, was hurt in a barrier trial on Tuesday and had to be replaced by Corey Brown, though in this case, getting able hands of that calibre is more of an asset.

That reassurance was even clearer when the experienced hoop eased Spalato back to last as Southern Boss (Bletchley Park) led the race at a decent clip. Plotting a wide path for most of the way, Spalato was kept out of trouble at the back before he rapidly moved into a striking position as he was angled to the outside at the point of turn.

Southern Boss did make a race of it when he showed plenty of ticker as he drew clear halfway up the straight, but class was to prevail in the end despite the 7.5 kilo difference between the two horses. Spalato took a while to unwind, but

once he did, he made light of his back-breaking weight of 59.5 kilos as he came swooping down with an electric turn of foot inside the last 200m.

Delighted his stable star had come back a winner, trainer John O'Hara is already looking ahead to the Group 2 Merlion Trophy (1200m), the first Leg of the Singapore Sprint series, as the next target.

"I didn't give any instructions to Corey. I left it all up to him," said O'Hara.

"Corey seldom rides for me and I don't think he's ever ridden a winner for me before, but such top-class riders don't need to be tied down to any instructions.

"He did the right thing by staying at the back and launching him at the right time. My horse took a while to unwind but that was because of his weight.

"The Merlion Trophy is his next target and then we'll see whether he gets an invitation to Dubai."

The Graham Mackie-owned galloper has been nominated for the US\$6 million Group 1 Dubai Golden Shaheen (1200m) to be run at Meydan on March 26. The former Singapore Derby winner travelled to Hong Kong in 2014, but did not run to expectations in his lead-up race and the Group 1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint (1200m), beset by a hip issue.

CAMERON TAKES NASTY SPILL AT MATAMATA

Just 24 hours after securing a brilliant Group One victory aboard outstanding three-year-old Xtravagant (NZ) (Pentire), regular pilot Matt Cameron could now be in doubt for the ride on the glamour colt in the prestigious Australian Guineas after taking a nasty tumble at Matamata.

Cameron was riding Pentire Babe (NZ) (Pentire) in the first race on Sunday when the mare appeared to shy approaching the crossing out of the straight the first time, jinking right and dislodging Cameron who made heavy contact with the ground before finishing prone under the running rail.

Cameron was reportedly knocked unconscious in the fall with medical personnel following in the ambulance quickly on hand to tend to the stricken rider. Cameron was fitted with a neck brace and placed on a stretcher but was conscious and moving both his arms and legs as he was placed in the ambulance before being transferred to hospital for observation.

Details of Cameron's condition remain unknown however the New Zealand Racing Integrity Unit's Co-chief Stipendiary Steward, Ross Neal, confirmed that should Cameron have sustained a concussion in the incident he would have to pass a standard concussion test before being allowed to ride again.

"Our protocols are very similar to a number of major sporting codes now with all of our jockeys having taken and passed a standard concussion test with those results held by New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing as a baseline for each individual," he explained.

"Should a rider suffer a concussion they must firstly be cleared by their regular doctor to undertake a further test which is then administered by NZTR's medical personnel and compared with their baseline result to determine if a clearance to ride can be provided."

Neal indicated that until Cameron's condition was confirmed any need for the test was pure speculation.

The Gr. 1 Australian Guineas will be run at Flemington on Saturday the 5th of March.

WILLIAMS HOPING LUCK HOLDS FOR PROMISING MARE

Progressive galloper **Emily Monk (NZ)** (O'Reilly) returned to the racetrack with a vengeance on the weekend as she downed a handy line-up over 1400 metres in her first race back since suffering a bleeding attack during a victory at Avondale last November.

The lightly raced five-year-old O'Reilly mare was scoring her fourth career victory from just nine starts when she powered home in the middle of the Te Rapa track to down Watch This Space (NZ) (Elusive City) and race favourite Iwannadancelikehim (NZ) (Russian Hero) in the rating 75 contest.

Co-trainer Dawn Williams, who prepares Emily Monk with husband Peter and Paul Richards from their Byerley Park base, was full of praise for the effort on return from a mandatory ninety day stand-down period.

"She's a mare with untapped ability but has had quite a few things go wrong including a bleed at Avondale at

her last start," she said.

"She's also been quite crook in the hocks and lost a lot of weight when she was in season even though she still won a race at that time.

"She's just one of those horses that you hold your breath every time she goes out onto the track."

While regarding the mare as a somewhat day-to-day proposition Williams is keen to see her get her opportunity for higher honours in this campaign.

"We will see how she pulls up but we have the Auckland Cup carnival coming up where there might be a nice race for her," she noted.

"We might pick one of those fillies and mares races for her to see if she can get a bit of black type as I think she is certainly up to that level."

TANNER HAS BIG PLANS FOR IMPRESSIVE TE RAPA WINNER

A tilt at the riches on offer during the Hawkes Bay Spring Carnival next season await Saturday's impressive Te Rapa winner **Heavens Keep (NZ)** (Savabeel).

The strapping five-year-old Savabeel gelding has come of age in this preparation for Awapuni trainer Lucy Tanner who believes her charge has the ability to compete at the highest level now he has finally clicked as to what the racing game is all about.

A heady ride from Johnathan Parkes saw him emulate the deeds of Matt Cameron on Xtravagant (NZ) (Pentire) in the previous race as he hugged the rail throughout to lead his rivals a merry chase over the 1600 metres of the final race on the card. The

comprehensive front-running victory was the gelding's third from his last four runs with Tanner confident he hasn't finished his winning roll just yet.

"He's a very exciting horse to have, who's very easy to do anything with," she explained.

"He travelled up beautifully the day before the race, settled well and ate up everything which was great to see.

"He's a typical Savabeel in that he can be a bit tough with some things but he's a true professional now that he's got the hang of the game."

Tanner admitted her confidence increased during the day after witnessing Mime (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) win the Gr. 2 Sir Tristram Fillies Classic earlier on the card. Heavens Keep had comfortably held out the filly when winning at Trentham at his last start which suggested another winning run was on the cards.

"When Mime came out and won that big race it just put the icing on the cake for me as I know how good this bloke is," she

admitted.

"He's taken a while to polish up his ringcraft but I'm very very happy with him now.

"We'll go home and give him a couple of days off to see how he pulls up but Cup class is not far off for him now.

"Longer term we're going to give him a good break over the winter and then set him for the Hawkes Bay series in the spring.

"He's looking after us so we're going to look after him!"

HEADSTRONG MARE CARRIES ON HER WINNING WAY

She may be a difficult customer off the track but that fierce determination to do things her way saw speedy mare **Red Dirt Girl (NZ)** (Align) salute the judge once again at Riccarton on the weekend.

Successful in her first two starts for northern trainer Kristine Stead the now six year-old mare was transferred to the southern base of Riccarton based Mike McCann after failing to add to those initial victories in her remaining six starts in the north. Since joining McCann the mare has taken on a new lease of life which has seen her register a further seven wins and five placings from just twenty appearances from the stable.

While delighted with the mare's progress McCann is happy taking it one day at a time with his charge.

"She can be a real handful at the best of times and she certainly wants to show you who the boss is," he chuckled when questioned about her.

"It can take up to half an hour to get her on to the track in the morning as she just stops and stands every few metres. She always wants to do things her way and at her pace so I guess I would describe her as difficult if I was being polite.

"However, when she does get down to business she is a pretty determined character with a fair bit of ability."

Although pleased with Saturday's effort McCann was more enthusiastic about the racing manners displayed by the mare as he looks to the future with her.

"The biggest problem we have faced is the way she used to over-race all the time," he said.

"We have spent months and months trying to get her to settle in her races and in her last few starts it looks like she may have finally clicked. She was far more relaxed on Saturday and finished the race off strongly which is good to see if we want to step her up further in the future.

"I have tried to space her races as the only time I backed her up quickly she went terribly. I haven't thought too much about where we will go next but there is a nice race at Wingatui on the 5th of March so that might be the option for her."

order of entry for the Gr. 1 BMW New Zealand Derby at the start of the day's racing, Shocking gelding **The Hassler (NZ)** climbed twenty placings on the rankings ladder when he took out the rating 65 Bupa Care Services sponsored event at the expense of fellow Derby contender Humidor (NZ) (Teofilo).

The lightly raced gelding had appealed as a staying type when he broke his maiden status over the same distance at Tauranga two starts ago. A pre-race interview with trainer Roger James indicated he felt the gelding was a strong chance to gain his second victory provided he could race handy to the pace. Jockey Vinnie Colgan following those instructions to the letter as he positioned his charge in the first four throughout the contest.

Taken to the front early in the run home by Colgan, The Hassler maintained a powerful gallop to the line to comfortably hold out his rivals although runner-up Humidor also caught the eye with his erratic but sustained finishing burst.

Part-owner Roger Hassall was a happy man after the contest as the gelding, who features the family moniker in his name, returned to the winner's enclosure.

"Roger said he was going to try and have him ridden handier to the pace and see if they could catch him and they couldn't so it was a great win," he said.

"We will leave any decisions about where he goes next to Roger but I do think he is looking higher with a possible Derby start if it all goes well."

After her win in the Gr. 1 Herbie Dyke Stakes on the weekend Valley Girl (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) now heads the TAB pre-post Derby market at \$7 along with Waikato Guineas placegetter Get That Jive (Street Sense). The Hassler is currently rated a \$41 chance for the blue riband event which will be run at Ellerslie on the 5th of March.

TAN AND WOODWORTH ON AN AWESOME RUN

Trainer Tan Hor Khoon and jockey Benny Woodworth continued their current sparkling form with yet another winner in the aptly-named **Awesome (NZ)** (Showcasing) on Sunday.

While the Showcasing three-year-old was at his first run in the \$65,000 Initiation race over 1200m, the pair go back a long way. All of Tan's four winners this year were ridden by the Malaysian rider to cement a fruitful relationship they have enjoyed since Tan began training in 2001 and even during their days in Macau where Tan was assistant-trainer to Charles

Leck.

"Benny is a good jockey and I've known him for a long time. It's good to see him ride winners for us, especially for these new owners," said Tan.

"They have been very patient with this one (Awesome). He's been with us for a long time but could not race because of shin soreness, but luckily, we got the result today.

"He's shown in his work and his barrier trial (won on February 2) he had some potential. How far he can go is a question mark.

"He's by Showcasing and I think he will be more of a sprinter. I also think he is probably more of a Polytrack horse."

Woodworth said he was never worried Awesome punched the breeze throughout when he took up a handy spot outside leader Southern Chief (Shaft) as he was always travelling with plenty up his sleeve.

"He travelled easy throughout. I was just waiting for

the home straight to let him go," said Woodworth who was bringing up win No 8, only five short of his 2015 tally of 13 wins.

"I rode him in trackwork and he's always given me the impression he was a nice, straightforward horse and that's exactly how he raced today.

"He will be even better over more ground – 100%."

The Malaysian rider, who only transferred his indentures to trainer Stephen Gray this year, scored his first Kranji win aboard Taramea on January 22, at only his third Singapore ride. Nine more rides have since followed, mainly for his master, without success, before Taramea resurfaced again to give him that winning feeling again in the \$60,000 Class 4 race over 1600m.

Gray, who had saddled a first winner in Billy Britain (NZ) (One Cool Cat) two races earlier, for one thought the St George Stable, who also races Taramea, and himself had just missed a winning double by a whisker.

After a few nervous seconds waiting for the judge's numbers, Gray was happy to be proven wrong by the photo print. Breathing a huge sigh of relief as he headed down to lead in the winners, the Kiwi handler immediately lauded his apprentice jockey for his exemplary work ethic.

"He's a very promising lad. He comes from a good family (father Ismadi Ismail is a former jockey and now a trainer in Ipoh and uncle Azhar Ismail is a champion jockey)," said Gray.

"It wasn't easy for him to come here as he is a bit of a mummy's boy but he has settled in well in the end. He works very hard and he's never put in a bad ride.

"I told him to ride the fence throughout and sneak up there to get a break on them as this horse can stay. The second horse is probably a better horse going forward but

we got the breaks on him today."

Taramea was at his third win from nine starts for prizemoney in excess of \$90,000 for Paul Hickman of St George Stable.
