



KIWI EXPECTATIONS HIGH AT CAULFIELD



Turn Me Loose is looking to extend his imposing second-up record at Caulfield tomorrow

A near impeccable second-up record points to **Turn Me Loose (NZ)** (Iffraaj) going close to adding another Group One title to his record at Caulfield on Saturday.

And buoyed by his fourth placing when resuming in the Gr.1 C.F. Orr Stakes on the course earlier this month, regular rider Opie Bosson is also quietly confident the form book can run true again.

"Turn Me Loose will be a lot better on Saturday," he said. "He was a bit fresh and we had to work hard early to get across to lead in the Orr and then he was quite keen.

"That's the best he's gone first-up and he will improve stacks

with the run."

In three second-up appearances, Turn Me Loose has only been beaten once and on that occasion he finished runner-up in the Listed Paris Lane Stakes at Flemington before winning the Listed Seymour Cup, the Gr.2 Crystal Mile and the Gr.1 Emirates Stakes.

The four-year-old was then spelled and a trial win preceded his effort behind Suavito (NZ) (Thorn Park), Lucky Hussler (Husson) and Hucklebuck (Elvstroem) in the Orr Stakes.

Bosson, who has picked up the Group One mount on Hey Doc (Duporth) for trainer Tony McEvoy in the Blue Diamond

Stakes, will also ride the Shaune Ritchie-prepared filly Let Her Rip (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) for the connections of Turn Me Loose in the Gr.2 Angus Armanasco Stakes.

Meanwhile in Sydney, Kerrin McEvoy will deputise for Bosson aboard Mongolian Khan (Holy Roman Emperor) when he resumes in the Gr.1 Chipping Norton Stakes at Randwick.

McEvoy was impressed with the Gr.1 Caulfield Cup winner when he rode him in work at Warwick Farm during the week.

"He looks great in condition," he said. "I had a good look at him before I got on him. He's got nice improvement to come out of his first-up run as you would expect, but he felt well in himself and his action was good."

PADDY POISED FOR ANOTHER TOP EFFORT

Surprise Group One performer **Authentic Paddy (NZ)** (Howbaddouwantit) is in excellent order for his latest challenge at the top level.

The six-year-old has thrived during a recent break and he is ready to pick up where he left off before Christmas with a bold showing in Saturday's Gr.1 Haunui Farm WFA Classic.

"He has really come up well and he had a good hit-out at the trials, which has really tightened him up," trainer Lisa Latta said. "He looks fantastic."

Authentic Paddy raced well during his winter campaign and continued his form on better surfaces through the spring to win open handicaps at

Hastings and Awapuni.

"Early on we thought he was just a wet tracker, but as he has got older he's handled the better tracks and just kept going good races," Latta said.

He ran fifth in both the Gr.1 Livamol Classic and the Gr.1 Windsor Park Plate before he finished second in the Gr.1 Captain Cook Stakes and a break followed his third placing in the Gr.1 Zabeel Classic.

"We'll get through Saturday and then we may head back to Ellerslie," Latta said.

The race on Authentic Paddy's programme is the Gr.1 Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes on March 12.

He will be ridden this weekend by

Robert Hannam, who will also partner Platinum Express (NZ) (Showcasing) and Shirley's Secret (NZ) (No Excuse Needed) for the stable at Otaki.

Runner-up in last season's Listed Wellesley Stakes, Platinum Express was checked in the straight when unplaced at Trentham last time out but with only four rivals in the Vets on Riverbank 3YO she should get every chance to bounce back to top form.

Shirley's Secret is a half-sister to Maritimo (NZ) (Pins), who beat Platinum Express in the Wellesley, but she has yet to show a hint of the family ability and would need to improve sharply to threaten in the Mills Reef Winery Maiden.

MONGOLIANS PLANNING A GROUP ONE INVASION



Mongolian Falcon takes on a small but select line-up at Matamata on Saturday

The Mongolians are waging war Down Under this weekend.

Lin Lang's Inner Mongolia Rider Horse Industry will chase feature races on both sides of the Tasman, with **Mongolian Khan** (Holy Roman Emperor) making his comeback from a colitis-enforced stint on the sidelines since winning the Gr.1 Caulfield Cup in October when he tackles the Gr.1 Chipping Norton Stakes (1600m) in Sydney on Saturday, while **Mongolian Falcon** (Fastnet Rock) is set to make his mark in the Listed Reid & Harrison Slipper (1200m) at Matamata the same day.

Murray Baker, who trains Mongolian Khan in partnership with Andrew Forsman, has warned punters that the New Zealand Horse of the Year would find the 1600m too sharp in his fresh-up run, but the Northland training partnership of Donna Logan and Chris Gibbs is far more confident with Mongolian Falcon at Matamata.

Mongolian Falcon finished third to the Baker-Forsman-

trained Gasoline (Pluck) on debut after he was caught wide at Ellerslie but easily won at his only subsequent appearance at Matamata last month.

"He's improved since then. He's done very, very well," Gibbs said.

"His work has been very good and I couldn't be any happier with him. Leith said he was only in second gear when he won at Matamata last time and it would be nice to see him go an even better race again this weekend."

Just five two-year-olds accepted for the Slipper, which is restricted to colts and geldings on the undercard of the Gr.2 J Swap Contracting Matamata Breeders' Stakes for two-year-old fillies.

Gasoline and impressive debut winner Heroic Valour (Fastnet Rock) look the main opposition for Mongolian Falcon in a race which looms as a key leadup to the Gr.1 Sistema Diamond Stakes (1200m) at Ellerslie on March 12.

Fastfoot (NZ) (Iffraaj)

Tyler chasing first two-timer

Steve Tyler has high hopes at Omakau on Friday of training his first winning double.

He has an in-form team engaged at the Central Otago meeting headed by the consistent **Fastfoot (NZ)** (Iffraaj) in the Rating 85 Wholesale Seeds/PGG Wrightson/Craigs Investments Handicap.

"Some good horses have beaten him lately and he'll be getting three kilos off and he's back in his proper grade now," Tyler said.

To be ridden by apprentice Krishna Mudhoo, Fastfoot has most recently placed in open company behind the Group winner Miss Alice (NZ) (Pins) and three runs ago he was also third to the talented, but ill-fated, Querer (NZ) (Captain Rio).

Popp 'N Lindauer (NZ) (Shinko King) (race two) is due a change of fortune and she is expected to go well, as is **Baranoo (NZ)** (King of Roses) who was a bold second on debut. [Full story here.](#)

Overseas targets beckon for Suavito

An international campaign could be on the agenda for **Suavito (NZ)** (Thorn Park) after she runs in the Australian Cup.

Trainer Nigel Blackiston confirmed he had fielded queries from Hong Kong and Royal Ascot representatives about taking the mare overseas.

But first Suavito has to get through the Futurity Stakes at Caulfield on Saturday and the Australian Cup at Flemington on March 12.

Blackiston says Suavito has improved off her first-up CF Orr Stakes win and he isn't concerned about her extending from the 1400m of Saturday's Futurity to 2000m in the Australian Cup two weeks later.

"She had 10 months off going into her first-up run so there's a lot of room for improvement," Blackiston said.

"She's ticking over nicely going forward to Saturday and then on to the Australian Cup afterwards." [Full story here.](#)



Habibi (NZ) (Ekraar)

Group One winner Habibi retired

Glamour mare **Habibi (NZ)** (Ekraar) has been retired and is set for a date with Dubai World Cup winner Animal Kingdom.

The winner of the 2013 New Zealand Derby, Habibi has raced in the United States since that season.

Her best performance since traversing hemispheres was her second in the Gr.1 Northern Dancer Turf Stakes (2000m) at Woodbine, in Canada, in September last year.

American owner George Strawbridge opted to retire the Ekraar mare after she finished third in the Gr.3 Suwanee River (1800m) at Gulfstream Park a fortnight ago.

It was a bittersweet end for the part-owners Peter and Heather Crofskey and Gavin Crofskey who retained an interest in Habibi through her American career.

"We were there to see her last race and it was a pleasure to be there for it," Heather Crofskey said.

"She should have won a Group One over there. She lost by a whisker and might not have if the jockey had pulled the whip. She had a chequered career in the US which was a shame."

"Her trainer over there, Mark Frostad, said she was a world-class mare and she'll get the best possible chance to start her broodmare career with a visit to Animal Kingdom." Crofskey said.

Royal Ascot Plans For Xtravagant

The connections of New Zealand superstar **Xtravagant (NZ)** (Pentire) are set to pass up the Sydney autumn carnival in favour of an historic assault on Royal Ascot in June.

Australia's loss will be a huge gain for UK racing as the extraordinary three-year-old would be the first New Zealand-trained star to race at Royal Ascot since the famous carnival started attracting horses from the southern hemisphere over a decade ago.

Managing owner David Ellis and trainer Steve Autridge have made their UK intentions clear, stating that Xtravagant will be set to take on the world's best at Royal Ascot should he continue his impressive winning form in the \$750,000 Australian Guineas on March 5.

"The thinking is he may go to Royal Ascot if he won the Australian Guineas, and if that decision was confirmed then he wouldn't race in Sydney," Autridge said.

Quick turnaround preferred option for Pentathlon

John Wheeler is happy to be swimming against the tide with his Gr.1 Auckland Cup contender **Pentathlon (NZ)** (Pentire).

Pentathlon was the only leading contender for the Barfoot & Thompson-sponsored cup who did not race last weekend.

Seven horses are at \$10 or shorter for the Ellerslie feature and the other six all ran in the Gr.2 Avondale Cup (2400m).

Pentathlon has not raced since his narrow defeat in the Gr.2 Wellington Cup, with Wheeler happy to wait till the Nathans Memorial (2200m), on the opening day of the Ellerslie carnival.

"That has always been the plan," Wheeler said. "I thought it was a softer option than the Avondale Cup. And when I have a horse running over two miles, I like to give them a race a week or 10 days before. It also gives him a look at Ellerslie." [Full story here.](#)

Youngsters in fine fettle

Unbeaten juveniles **Sassy 'N' Smart** (Smart Missile) and **Heroic Valour** (Fastnet Rock) have received glowing reports ahead of their respective engagements at Matamata on Saturday.

"They've both galloped well and are right where we want them to be," co-trainer Stephen Autridge said following their work on Tuesday.

Sassy 'N' Smart, who runs in the Gr.2 J Swap Contractors Matamata Breeders' Stakes, missed a lead-up run after an incident at the gates at Matamata last month but she has since trialled without incident.

Listed Reid & Harrison Slipper contender Heroic Valour won on debut at Trentham and Autridge said he had improved with the experience.



Midnight Gossip (NZ) (Showcasing)

Stable shooting for the top

Nigel Tiley has Group One aspirations for two of the younger members of his Pukekohe stable.

Impressive debutante **Midnight Gossip (NZ)** (Showcasing) and **Brighton (NZ)** (Buffalo Man) have Ellerslie features on their immediate programmes and the former could also venture south in search of another major two-year-old prize.

Midnight Gossip was untested first time out when she ran 57.41 to break the 1000 metre track record at Te Aroha.

"She's good, don't worry about that," Tiley said. "When Leith (Innes) asked her to go she really let down and it's the first time she's been off the bridle."

"We hadn't done a lot with her and even when she trialled she was hard held."

"She'll go to the Diamond Stakes next. I know it's a big step up for her from a midweek maiden, but I believe she'll be competitive and as long as she goes well we would seriously look at the Sires' Produce at Awapuni."

As a daughter of Showcasing, Midnight Gossip will be eligible for the \$100,000 bonus on offer for any offspring of Haunui Farm's stallions to win the Sistema Diamond Stakes on March 12. [Full story here.](#)



Rising Romance (NZ) (Ekraar)

Kiwi mare making the right moves

The connections of the New Zealand mare **Rising Romance (NZ)** (Ekraar) were far from disheartened with the Group One winner's unplaced performance when she recently resumed at Caulfield.

The Australian Oaks winner and Caulfield Cup runner-up beat only two runners home in the Gr.1 C.F. Orr Stakes, but that effort didn't accurately reflect the Ekraar five-year-old's effort.

"It was a really good run – she drew an outside gate in a big field and she had to go back to near last," said Tom Dabernig, who prepares Rising Romance with David Hayes. "She ran the quickest last furlong of the race when she flew home late. It was just a shame she didn't draw a decent barrier."

Rising Romance finished just over three lengths from the winner **Suavito (NZ)** (Thorn Park) and has come through the outing without incident.

"She'll run next on the 27th in the Peter Young Stakes at Caulfield over 1800 metres, which will take her nicely into the Australian Cup," Dabernig said.

The Group Two event was formerly known as the St George Stakes and will be contested a fortnight before the \$A1.5 million Gr.1 Australian Cup at Flemington.

"She's on the right track and we're still very hopeful we can bag another big one with her," Dabernig said.

Group One on Hasselhoof's radar

Hasselhoof (NZ) (Tavistock) will return home on Tuesday with a likely Group One start on his immediate programme.

Connections are keen on a run in the Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes at Ellerslie on March 22 for their son of Tavistock.

Hasselhoof ended his two start Sydney campaign on Saturday with a third placing in the Listed Parramatta Cup at Rosehill.

"He's done really well and it will hold him in good stead for his future," said Chris Gibbs, who trains the four-year-old with Donna Logan.

Marsh keen on Australian options

Stephen Marsh has Australian targets in mind for three of his leading fillies.

The Cambridge trainer's domestic stakes winners **Sofia Rosa (NZ)** (Makfi), **No More Tears (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) and **Serious Satire** (More Than Ready) are all in line for trips across the Tasman before the end of the season.

Sofia Rosa will have Group One business to attend to at home in the meantime with the Gr.1 Wellfield New Zealand Oaks at Trentham on March 19 her goal.

"She's coming along well and will run in the Lowland Stakes and then she'll be cherry ripe for the Oaks," Marsh said.

"She's nominated for the Oaks in Sydney and, if she was to win at Trentham and come through the run well, we would fly her over for a one hit mission." [Full story here.](#)
