GO RACING TEAM GOES HARD FOR DERBY DAY



Gr. 1 BMW New Zealand Derby candidate *What's The Story* will lead the charge for Albert Bosma's Go Racing syndicated horses at Ellerslie on Saturday

It's all go for Go Racing owners with six runners on Derby day on Saturday, including five runners in Group features, among them leading Gr.1 BMW New Zealand Derby hopeful **What's The Story (NZ)** (Savabeel).

"It's extremely exciting. We've got horses going to the races on Saturday at the top of their game and have genuine chances of winning four Group races," said Go Racing manager Albert Bosma.

"If we can pull off one of them, we'd be stoked but we reckon we've got a chance of getting even more than that. That should make for a fun day for our 60 to 70 owners, 33 of

whom will be on track."

As well as *What's The Story* showcasing the Go Racing colours in the blue riband New Zealand Derby (2400m), Go Racing owners will chase success in the Gr.3 Darley Plate (1200m) with **Passing Shot (NZ)** (Swiss Ace), the Gr.3 Stella Artois Mr Tiz Trophy (1200m) through **No More Tears (NZ)** (Darci Brahma) and **Ruud Not Too (NZ)** (Bernardini) and the Gr.3 McKee Family Sunline Vase (2100m) with **Poetic Affair (NZ)** (Thewayouare).

The Stephen McKee and Eddie Chippendale-trained *What's The Story* produced a remarkable performance to

overcome what seemed like a terminal check in winning at Ellerslie last start to secure a start in the Derby.

"It was an enormous run to get up and win," Bosma said.

"He copped interference which really affected him. It was a super run and a great Derby trial. He's a genuine winning chance this weekend.

"He's bred to win a Derby and he's been trained specifically to win a Derby. He'll be peaking on the day and he's hard-fit. We just want the track to come back as much as possible because he's a horse who really pings off good ground.

"It's just exciting going into the race with a horse who is a genuine chance."

Genuine winning chance is the phrase Bosma uses to describe the McKee-Chippendale-trained Passing Shot, who won the Mr Tiz Trophy on the same day last year and goes into the Darley Plate off the back of a last start open sprint win at New Plymouth.

"He's a very sharp horse and he's come through that last win well," he said. "He's another horse that needs good ground. He's a fast horse and he bounces off hard tracks."

Bosma said there was little between the Stephen Marsh-trained pair of No More Tears and Ruud Not Too ahead of the Mr Tiz Trophy, though favoured No More Tears should the track remain closer to slow than good.

The McKee-Chippendale-trained maiden filly Poetic Affair tackles the Sunline Vase and is a better chance than her non-winner status suggests, according to Bosma.

"We know she's a maiden but she can stay and 2100m will suit her," Bosma said.

Other Go Racing runners at Ellerslie are **What A Diva (NZ)** (Pentire), who is on trial for a start in the NZ St Leger when she tackles the 2100m Rating 65 event, while **Prince Mambo (NZ)** (Thewayyouare) is likely to need the run in the Rating 85 1400m race, Bosma says.

CALLOW BRINGS MUCH EXPERIENCE TO DERBY

Globetrotting jockey Noel Callow intends on crowning his trip to Ellerslie this weekend with success in the Gr.1 BMW New Zealand Derby.

The 41-year-old Melbourne jockey, ubiquitously known as 'King' Callow, heads to Ellerslie to ride the Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young-trained **Tavago (NZ)** (Tavistock) in the 2400m three-year-old classic.

Tavistock gelding Tavago assumed New Zealand Derby favouritism after a fast-finishing and luckless third behind Raghu (NZ) (Showcasing) in the Karaka 3YO Mile at Ellerslie in late January, but he blotted his copybook when he finished last in the Gr.2 Waikato Guineas (2000m) at Te Rapa last month.

However, Busuttin and Young have elected to press ahead with Derby plans for Tavago, who had beaten home current favourite Rangipo (Stryker) when winning the Gr.3 Wellington Stakes (1600m) at Otaki in November and chose Callow as a suitable partner for the bay gelding.

"He was unlucky when he ran third at Ellerslie that day when Blake Shinn rode him and apparently he jarred up last

time when he ran well below his best," Callow said.

"If he runs up to his previous form, he looks like a winning hope. He's a three-year-old who possesses genuine speed."

Callow, who has ridden in Singapore, Macau, Hong Kong, Mauritius and Malaysia, is making his third trip to New Zealand, having previously ridden Danbird (Danehill)

into fourth place in the Gr.1 Bayer Classic at Otaki in 2003 and finished eighth on Dragon Lair (NZ) (Iffraaj) in the 2014 Karaka Million at Ellerslie, winning aboard the Richard Collett and Gareth McRae-trained Simbaah (NZ) (Pentire) on the undercard that evening.

"I'm really looking forward to getting back there and riding. Tavago looks a good chance in the Derby and I've picked up some nice rides for the rest of the programme," Callow said.

Callow's other rides in Saturday's Group races are aboard the Roger James-trained Cool Tart (NZ) (Zabeel) in the Gr.3 McKee Family Sunline Vase (2100m), Whosyourmaster (NZ) (Captain Rio) for Matamata trainers Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scott in the Gr.3 Darley Plate (1200m) and the Graeme and Debbie Rogerson-trained Esbeedee (NZ) (Swiss Ace) in the Gr.3 Stella Artois Mr Tiz Trophy (1200m).

He also rides the Andrew Campbell-trained last-start winner Francome (NZ) (Savabeel) in the 1600m special conditions maiden and the Patsy Riley-trained Knight Court (NZ) (Align) in the Rating 65 1400m event.

XTRAVAGANT FLEXIBLE FOR GUINEAS TILT

Trainer Stephen Autridge said **Xtravagant (NZ)** (Pentire) is flexible enough to take a sit in Saturday's Group 1 Australian Guineas (1600m) if required.

While the star Pentire colt's preparation in getting to Australia has been less than ideal with cancelled and delayed flights, Autridge - who trains in partnership with Jamie Richards - said a slow start out of the barriers at Flemington wouldn't be enough to derail the two-time Group 1 winner.

The three-year-old finally boarded a plane for Melbourne on Thursday, bound for headquarters where he will stay with Leon and Troy Corstens at Malua Racing.

Xtravagant was just behind the leaders before bolting to win the Waikato Sprint by eight lengths, while his other G1 success saw him lead all the way to claim the 2000 Guineas by 8.5 lengths.

"[Mahuta] usually leads. This horse, we've ridden him in behind twice and he's gone just as good," Autridge told Racing.com's Racing Ahead on RSN 927.

"We don't have to be worry about leading, but barrier three is ideal anyway.

"The way he races, if they're running slow, he could be in front, but if they're running fast, he'll take a trail.

"With any luck, it doesn't matter as long as it's a fairly run race."

Autridge said Te Akau Stud principal David Ellis has had a few suitors looking to buy into the prospective stallion.

The leading NZ trainer added Xtravagant's last-start eight-length win at Te Rapa was just the warm-up for Saturday's grand final, and also did not rule out potentially backing up in the Australian Cup a week later.

"We'd gone a little bit easy on him going into that race," Autridge said of his Waikato Sprint win.

"That race was just to top him off beautifully for this Saturday.

"His weight is perfect. Everything sort of says he's come through it good, and should've improved.

"The Aussies have been keen on him for a while.

"The day that he won the 2000 Guineas by eight lengths and ran a race record ... he took the record off Turn Me Loose, who was over in Australia winning a Group 1 race [Emirates Stakes] that day.

"He's that sort of horse. He's big, he's strong, he leads or races right there [on the speed], and he keeps going."

Elvis (NZ) (Road To Rock)

Elvis is back in the building

New Plymouth galloper **Elvis (NZ)** (Road To Rock) resumes at Awapuni today, in what will be just his second start in a year.

The four-year-old had his promising career halted by bone chips in his two front knees.

"I've had a nightmare time with him," owner-trainer Warren Bolton said. "We had to remove chips in both knees and he has also had a foot problem."

The knee issues were diagnosed after Elvis was unplaced in the Gr.2 Great Northern Guineas at Ellerslie on January 1, 2015.

The Road To Rock gelding started favourite when he resumed on his home track in September, but raced below expectations and was given another break.

"I thought he was nearly right, but he was still feeling his knees," Bolton said.

He's An Ace (NZ) (Swiss Ace)

Ritchie taking blinkered approach

A gear addition might be the trump card **He's An Ace (NZ)** (Swiss Ace) needs to return to winning ways at Ellerslie on Saturday.

The talented three-year-old was beaten for the first time at his most recent appearance, resulting in a new look for the gelding when he runs in the Gr.3 Stella Artois Mr Tiz Trophy.

"We're going to apply the blinkers and they will sharpen him up that bit more,"

trainer Shaune Ritchie said. "He was overthinking things a bit at his last start."

He's An Ace won his first two starts at Ellerslie, accounting for his stakes-performed stablemate Way In (NZ) (Thewayouare) in December after beating the highly-regarded His Majesty (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) on debut.

The Swiss Ace gelding lost his perfect record last month when he finished third in a special conditions event.

"He's freshened up really nicely," Ritchie said. "A dead track would suit him, he likes a bit of give in the ground and that would make him super competitive."

Blueblood scores on debut

The James Cummings-trained **Rock And Swing** (Fastnet Rock) broke maiden ranks at first time of asking when successful at Warwick Farm on Wednesday.

Patiently handled by Hugh Bowman, Rock And Swing came from last to narrowly defeat Sparkle (More Than Ready) in the 1200m juvenile contest.

The impeccably bred son of Fastnet Rock was sold as a yearling at Karaka by Waikato Stud on behalf of breeders Brendan and Jo Lindsay for \$600,000 to the bid of Duncan Ramage.

Raced by prominent owners which include Tunku Ahmad Yahaya and Think Big Stud, Rock And Swing is out of a sister to champion stallion High Chaparral.

Cummings has a big opinion of Rock And Swing and expects the colt to step up to stakes grade at his next run. [Full story here.](#)

Marsh filly lays down an Oaks marker

Rival trainers are going to have to pull a rabbit out of the hat to halt the winning run of **Sofia Rosa (NZ)** (Makfi) in the Gr.1 Wellfield New Zealand Oaks.

That was the clear message sent out by the Stephen Marsh-prepared filly at Hastings on Wednesday when she returned from a lengthy break to demolish her

opposition in the Gr.3 Little Avondale Stud Lowland Stakes.

"She will improve as she was a bit light going into this, she was probably 90 percent today," the Cambridge horseman said.

"She's very good and she's going to be bang on for the Oaks."

Unraced by design since she won the Gr.2 Royal Stakes at Ellerslie on New Year's Day, Sofia Rosa settled midfield and one off the fence before rider Danielle Johnson urged the daughter of Makfi around runners 600 metres from home.

"It was a 10 out of 10 ride - everything went to plan when we were three back and one out," Marsh said. [Full story here.](#)

Derby dream alive with lightly-trying 3YO

Humidor's (NZ) (Teofilo) connections aren't about to let a chance go by with a crack at Saturday's Gr.1 BMW New Zealand Derby too good an opportunity to pass up.

He has impressed in a brief career and there is stable confidence in the stoutly-bred three-year-old.

"You only get one chance to run in a Derby in New Zealand," said Johnno Benner, who prepares Humidor with his partner Holly Wynyard.

By Galileo's Group One-winning son Teofilo out of a Zabeel mare, Humidor won his maiden over a mile in January and in one subsequent start he finished runner-up.

Hayes confident Criterion can fire fresh

Hall of Fame trainer David Hayes is confident that star galloper **Criterion (NZ)** (Sebring) is primed to run a big race when he resumes in Saturday's Group 1 Canterbury Stakes (1300m) in Sydney.

The multiple Group 1 winner hasn't raced since he finished unplaced in the Hong Kong Cup in December and is on a path towards the \$4 million Queen Elizabeth Stakes (2000m) which he won last year

Using the son of Sebring's fast-finishing third in last year's Canterbury Stakes as a guide, Hayes said the versatile stallion was more than capable of winning first-up.

"I think he's going better this time than last year when he nearly won it," Hayes said.

"It would be terrific to have a Melbourne Cup placegetter win a Group 1 sprint first-up, we did that years ago with Jeune and I think this horse is capable.

"For his stallion value we would love him to win a sprint. He could be advertised as a hamburger with the lot, he can do everything this horse."

Flemington to suit Kiwi filly better

Let Her Rip (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle) will remain in Melbourne following her luckless run at Caulfield with a switch in venue a key to turning her Australian fortunes around.

The Cambridge filly was unplaced in last Saturday's Gr.2 Angus Armanasco Stakes under Opie Bosson, with the pair frustrated for clear room in the straight.

"He said she felt explosive and was really ready to charge at them," trainer Shaune Ritchie said.

"She got galloped on and not surprisingly as she was in tight quarters, but things are looking okay and there's a race for her at Flemington on the 12th."

The next assignment on Let Her Rip's programme is the Gr.2 Kewney Stakes over 1400 metres.

"She is best ridden back so the big track will suit her much better than Caulfield," Ritchie said.

"She has got an atrocious record second-up, but you could treat the run the other day as a barrier trial."



Capella (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle)

Late Derby switch for leading filly

A rousing gallop this week and the availability of a leading jockey have resulted in a late change of Group One plans for **Capella (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle).

The top filly will now run in Saturday's BMW New Zealand Derby with another twist resulting in Leith Innes taking the ride.

"Originally we were going for the Derby and then we changed tack to go to the Sunline Vase instead and on to the Oaks, but after Capella's work on Tuesday morning we decided to run in the big one," trainer Danica Guy said.

"It's all come about very quickly, but I'm happy I've got her as fit as I can and we'll see if she can run the trip."

The winner of the Gr.2 Eight Carat Classic, Capella missed the Gr.2 Royal Stakes due to unsuitable track conditions before an elevated temperature forced her out of the Gr.1 Levin Classic.

She was back in action at Te Rapa last month and, in a slowly run affair, came home well for third in the Gr.2 Sir Tristram Fillies' Classic under her regular rider Mark Du Plessis.

"She badly needed that run as she hadn't been out for seven weeks and she has improved a lot," Guy said.

"It's unfortunate Mark can't ride her – he had already committed to another horse (Humidor) and we're lucky to have got Leith," Guy said.

The injury-forced withdrawal of Provocative (NZ) (Zabeel) allowed Innes to take the mount.

Latta not short of young talent

Lisa Latta has lost one of her leading juveniles, but she is still in the hunt for both of the country's Group One two-year-old prizes.

The Awapuni trainer produced **Showmeyamoneyhoney (NZ)** (Showcasing) to place in her first three starts before she finished runner-up to the unbeaten Xiong Feng (NZ) (Iffraaj) in the Listed Karaka Million, after which a major Australian player secured the daughter of Showcasing.

"She's a good filly whose been sold and she's gone to Perth," Latta said.

Showmeyamoneyhoney has been purchased by West Australia's biggest owner Bob Peters, whose most recent Group One stars include the now retired Delicacy (Al Maher) and Perfect Reflection (More Than Ready), who has joined Darren Weir's stable following her success in the Kingston Town Classic last December. Ideal scene set for Riskue

David Hayes believes Flemington will be the perfect stage for his New Zealand-bred Group One contender **Risque (NZ)** (Darci Brahma).

He is expecting the big track and the step up to 1600 metres in Saturday's Gr.1 Australian Guineas to be ideal for the last-start Gr.3 Kevin Hayes Stakes winner.

Hayes, who trains with Tom Dabernig, also welcomed the presence of the in-form Mahuta (Flying Spur) in this weekend's event.

"That's what I wanted," he said. "He will provide a bit of speed with the New Zealand horse Xtravagant."

Stakes target for young stayer

A rejuvenated **Bordeaux (NZ)** (High Chaparral) will have at least one more outing before a break.

"He's been up for a while and has won five from seven this season," said Jamie Richards, who prepares the blueblood with Stephen Autridge.

"He'll go to Trentham for the St Leger and he may have one more run in the Hawke's Bay Cup before he goes out."

Bordeaux is a half-brother to this year's Frankel's \$1.3 million Karaka sale-topper.

Bordeaux completed a hat-trick of wins on Saturday with a typically tenacious effort at Otaki after stalking the leader.

"He gets on the speed and he doesn't like anything getting passed him," Richards said.
