TILEY TAKES AIM AT TWO GROUP ONE RACES



Midnight Gossip provides Pukekohe trainer Nigel Tiley with a strong hand in tomorrow's Gr. 1 Sistema Diamond Stakes.

Pukekohe trainer Nigel Tiley knows he is presenting **Girl Of My Dreams (NZ)** (Gold Centre) and **Midnight Gossip (NZ)** (Showcasing) with formidable Group One challenges at Ellerslie on Saturday, but he believes both are capable of success.

Dual Group Three winner Girl Of My Dreams tackles the weight-for-age Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes (2000m), stepping up from a last-start Gr.3 Taranaki Cup (1800m) win under handicap conditions to facing proven Group One performers such as Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock), Stolen Dance (NZ) (Alamosa), Authentic Paddy (NZ) (Howbaddouwantit) and Savaria (NZ) (Savabeel).

"There's no doubt it's a big step up from what she won last start, but she's a mare in form. She's won her last two and

Group One black type is important for her as a broodmare prospect moving forward," Tiley said.

"It was a huge run at New Plymouth and she's improved a lot with it as I thought she would. She's drawn well in barrier two and should get a good run from there. I'm looking forward to the race."

Tiley has opted to retain Stratford apprentice Dylan Turner, who has been aboard for Girl Of My Dream's last two wins, despite it being just his second ride in a Group One race.

"Dylan has ridden her well for us and it made sense now he knows her well and gets on well with her that we keep him on," Tiley said.

"We know it's not going to be easy. Volkstok'n'barrell is probably a step up above them as far as class goes, but she's a tough mare and she'll acquit herself well. When you have a mare in form like her then she deserves her shot at a Group One.

"After this one, we'll freshen her up and have a shot at the [New Zealand Thoroughbred] Breeders' Stakes at Te Aroha and then go to the Travis Stakes at Te Rapa, which will be right up her alley."

Midnight Gossip earned her shot at Group One glory after a rousing 3 1/2-length debut win at Te Aroha last month.

"She's definitely improved. She was a little bit tardily away at Te Aroha and I've got no false illusions that this isn't a big

step up from a midweek maiden because it is," Tiley said.

"But I've got a lot of time for this filly and she's shown me any amount of ability. Leith Innes was keen to stick with her too, which was encouraging. On her work this morning, she's going to be right in the deep end of it.

"She's nominated for the Manawatu Sires' [Produce Stakes] too, but we'll just take one step at a time with her."

Having multiple Group One runners on a day is nothing new to Tiley, who produced four runners in the 1998 Ellerslie Sires' Produce Stakes, but he admits he still gets excited about the big occasion.

"These are the races you love to win most of all and my two runners are both in good form," he said.

PIKE HOPING TO CAP BANNER WEEK WITH CUP WIN

It's already been an Auckland Cup carnival to savour for Cambridge trainer Tony Pike and with Gr.1 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup favourite **Sacred Master (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman) yet to come, the week might be about to get even better.

However, the horse commanding most of Pike's attention in trackwork on Wednesday hailed from a rival stable - and is not even running in the Auckland Cup.

Pike's focus was on the Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young-trained two-year-old **Caorunn (NZ)** (Showcasing), who tackles the Gr.1 Sistema Diamond Stakes (1200m) and as a son of Haunui Farm stallion Showcasing could snare a \$100,000 bonus offered by the Auckland studfarm if he wins - \$30,000 of which goes to the breeder - in his case Pike and his parents Wayne and Vicki.

There was plenty of good-hearted banter between Pike and Busuttin after

the gallop too.

"I just said to Trent I hope my horse is right and everything is all on track for the weekend. I just watched his final gallop to make sure it all went well and I'm looking forward to the \$30,000 pay cheque if he can get up for us," Pike quipped.

Pike has plenty to be upbeat about.

Last weekend he produced **Rangipo** (Stryker) to win the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m), with

stablemate **Raghu (NZ)** (Showcasing) running a gallant third, while his dual Group One winner **Sacred Star** (Flying Spur) bounced back to top form with a clinical win in the Gr.3 Darley Plate (1200m).

And Sacred Master will start a warm favourite for the Auckland Cup after a stellar performance to claim the main leadup race, the Gr.2 Avondale Cup (2400m) a fortnight ago, to give Pike a great chance to claim two of the four Group One prizes on offer for the week.

"Here's hoping. It's been a fantastic carnival for us so far and we're going into Saturday pretty confident he's going to run a big race.

"I can't fault his condition. He galloped brilliantly here on Tuesday morning. He's just heading the right way. He's obviously very progressive."

Pike produced **Rock Diva** (NZ) (Lucky Unicorn) to win last year's Auckland Cup for similar connections carrying the 52kg minimum, though that race was run under handicap conditions and this year the race has changed to set-weights and penalties that sees Sacred Master carrying 55kg.

"The change in the weight scale is against him. He's got to carry 55 and there's a big turnaround against horses like Benzini [who Sacred Master meets

6.5kg worse off].

"But he's a good horse. He's come through the grades very well and it's probably not the strongest Auckland Cup we've ever seen. And he's peaking at the right time. Rock Diva's best [leadup] run was the Avondale Cup and arguably that's his best run as well.

"He's a very laid-back horse. He switches off nicely in the run and he's got a very good turn of foot as well and he proved that in the Avondale Cup. It's been a big ask of him. He was a maiden at the start of the season and now he's the Auckland Cup favourite. I'd expect him to go close but whether it's a year too soon, we'll find out on Saturday."

Family closing in on maiden success

A newly-formed Ashburton training partnership has high hopes of opening their account today.

Ashley McKay has recently joined forces with her father Russell and they are expecting the former North Island mare **Ashwini (NZ)** (Iffraaj) to go close to crediting them with their first winner in the NZB Insurance Pearl Series Race.

"We've changed a bit of gear on her and we'll take the ear covers off and put the hood on her," Ashley McKay said.

"She's working really well and she just needs to finish off her races a touch better. The hood should put that finishing edge on her and I can't really see why she can't win."

Heptagon Choux good

Heptagon (NZ) (Jimmy Choux) showed a clean pair of heels to win the Easy Waste 2YO Maiden Plate (1100m) at Ballarat on Wednesday, giving leading trainer Mick Price yet another scalp in a juvenile race.

Ridden by Craig Newitt, Heptagon settled back in the run and showed a ready turn of foot to pick up his rivals.

"I've trialled him a couple of times and he's shown he's above average," Newitt said post-race.

Heptagon was the first winner in Victoria for Rich Hill Stud stallion Jimmy Choux, who has already sired Group Three winner Manolo Blahniq.

Bred by Nearco Stud, Heptagon is out of the stakes-winning O'Reilly mare Seven Schillings. He sold for \$150,000 at the 2015 Premier Sale at Karaka, the highest-priced yearling from Jimmy Choux's first crop, when offered by Casey and Michelle Dando's Bradbury Park.

No Joy for Beer with wide draw in Kewney

Jacqui's Joy (NZ) (Real Saga) faces a steep class rise as she attempts to keep her unbeaten Australian record intact at Flemington.

The former New Zealand filly won her Australian debut at Kilmore before graduating to successive wins at Caulfield over summer.

She now steps up to Group Two level in the Kewney Stakes (1400m) on Saturday.

Co-trainer Mitchell Beer had his hopes dented somewhat when Jacqui's Joy drew barrier 15 in the 16 horse field.

"Saturday's probably going to be the hardest run for her this time in," Beer said.

"She's got barrier 15 and she's kicking off in the deep end against some quality opposition, but we've got some pretty nice plans for her."

However if the filly shows she won't get over a distance, Beer said she could be freshened for a Brisbane trip over winter.

And he said wet ground in Brisbane could be in her favour as she has raced well in heavy conditions in New Zealand.

Azkadellia out to atone in Gr.1 Coolmore

She was the right horse in the wrong place when rated desperately unlucky in the only Group One appearance of her career.

But if it is some consolation to trainer Ciaran Maher, **Azkadellia's (NZ)** (Shinko King) Myer Classic defeat when a high-profile victim of a track bias stands a good chance of working in her favour in the Gr.1 Coolmore Classic at Rosehill.

"She has shown she is up to that (Group One level) and on the weight scale she gets in really well," Maher said.

Azkadellia goes into the Coolmore as a last-start winner of the Mannerism Stakes at Caulfield.

Allowed to complete the serious part of her trackwork before leaving, Azkadellia arrived in Sydney at the weekend and has settled into her new surroundings with a minimum of fuss.

"She travelled up well and had a maintenance gallop on Tuesday morning," Maher said.

Azkadellia has drawn inside her obvious Coolmore dangers and she will jump from barrier four.

Azkadellia commenced her career in New Zealand where she was a winner at Avondale at her only start for New Plymouth trainer Ilone Kelly before her sale to Australia.

Noble hoping for a special cup ending

Lance Noble is on the verge of a new training venture, but for the moment his focus is on achieving a Group One result for a band of special owners.

The Matamata horseman, who will shortly take up the role as private trainer at Brendan and Jo Lindsay's Karaka operation, is putting the finishing touches on his Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup hope **Rose Of Virginia (NZ)** (Thorn Park).

"It's going to be quite sentimental," Noble said. "Alan and Colleen Jackson and Alan and Rob Burnet really helped to get me going early on and they've continued to support me," Noble said. [Full story here.](#)

Waller's Kiwis leading cup hopes

A pair of Chris Waller-trained New Zealanders currently share favouritism for the \$A1 million Gr.1 Sydney Cup at Randwick on April 9.

Zabeel's son **Preferment (NZ)** and **Who Shot Thebarman (NZ)**, by Yamanin Vital, are at \$8.

A dual Group One winner, Preferment was an eye-catching fourth when recently resuming in the Gr.1 Chipping Norton Stakes while Who Shot Thebarman, runner-up in last year's cup, was unplaced in the Randwick mile.

Bosson lands Slipper mount

Crack Kiwi jockey Opie Bosson can't wait for his first ride in the world's richest two-year-old race after this week landing the ride on **French Fern** (Lope de Vega) in Saturday week's \$A3.5 million Golden Slipper.

Bosson, who has won three Group One races in Australia in the past 12 months, was thrilled to secure the ride on the David Payne-trained French Fern, who sealed automatic entry into the Golden Slipper (1200m) at Rosehill with her win in last

Crowning glory just a step away

Only one box awaits a tick from **Stolen Dance (NZ)** (Alamosa) to complete a dream season.

"We sat down at the start of the campaign and talked about a few goals and we didn't really think she would win a Group Two and a Group Three so quickly and now she's been runner-up in three Group Ones as well," trainer David Greene said.

Queensland carnival beckons Tavago

Australian options are being considered for the talented Cambridge three-year-old **Tavago (NZ)** (Tavistock).

The Gr.3 Wellington Stakes winner earned Gr.1 New Zealand Derby favouritism with his unlucky third in the Listed Karaka Mile before he went cold in the market following

his next performance.

Tavago jarred up when he tailed the field home in the Gr.2 Waikato Guineas and with a month between outings he turned in an eye-catching effort for sixth, and was less than two lengths from the winner, in the Derby.

"It was a super run – he missed the jump a bit and got too far back," said Natalie Young, who prepares Tavago with her partner Trent Busuttin.

"It was a big turnaround, but he had too much ground to make up.

"We've tipped him out for a week and we'll reassess him after that – we've had the AJC Derby in the back of our minds, but the Queensland Derby might be more likely."



Addictive Habit (NZ) (Colombia)

Doncaster the dream goal

A trip to the Sydney autumn carnival is the preferred option for the Group One winner **Addictive Habit (NZ)** (Colombia).

The connections of the six-year-old have made the second payment for the \$A3 million Gr.1 Doncaster Handicap at Randwick on April 2 and the gelding also holds a nomination for the \$A4 million Gr.1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes a week later.

"Sometimes they get rain there and as we all know Addictive Habit is a very good miler," trainer Lee Somervell said.

"It would obviously depend on whether he could get a start in the Doncaster, but if it looked like he would then that would be the ultimate plan.

"The other big plus is the weight – he's got 52kg and that would be wonderful for him."

Plan B with Addictive Habit is to target the Gr.1 Manco Easter Handicap at Ellerslie ahead of a return visit to the Queensland winter carnival where the son of Colombia was a Listed race winner last year.

Addictive Habit hasn't raced since he found the Trentham track too hard when unplaced in the Gr.1 Thorndon Mile, but showed he had bounced back with an easy trial win at Rotorua on Tuesday.

"There were only four in it over 1200 metres and he sat back, pulled out and won with plenty in hand," Somervell said.

Valley Girl to Sydney

The Donna Logan and Chris Gibbs-trained filly **Valley Girl (NZ)** (Mastercraftsman)

pleased connections with her fast-finishing fifth in Saturday's Gr.1 BMW New Zealand Derby and now has further Group One assignments in Sydney.

"The wide draw was quite costly in the end but we were very pleased with the run and she hit the line well," Gibbs said.

"We've got three weeks to the Vinery Stud Stakes and then on to the Australian Oaks. It's a path Donna has followed before with Rising Romance and Habibi with good success."



Xiong Feng (NZ) (Iffraaj)

Group One assignment for unbeaten juvenile

Karaka Million winner **Xiong Feng (NZ)** (Iffraaj) will be back in action on Saturday at Ellerslie when he tackles the Gr.1 Diamond Stakes (1200m).

Xiong Feng is unbeaten in three career starts and co-trainer Stephen McKee, who prepares the son of Iffraaj with Eddie Chippendale, is confident the smart two-year-old will be hard to topple despite seven weeks between runs.

"He's had a fair gap between races but that hasn't worried him in the past," McKee said.

"I think he's ready to run well again.

"Obviously there's a whole lot of newcomers coming through at this time of the year and it looks like the field has a lot of depth on Saturday."

Lucia Valentina ready to roll

Dual Group One winner **Lucia Valentina (NZ)** (Savabeel) is ready for a first-up assault on Saturday's Gr.1 Coolmore Classic (1500m) at Rosehill Gardens, according to trainer Kris Lees.

The New Zealand-owned mare, who has banked more than \$1.6 million for her connections, boasts one of the best fresh records in our middle-distance ranks.

The daughter of Savabeel won the 2014 Gr.2 Tramway Stakes (1400m) first-up as well as her debut in New Zealand, while also placing at her first Australian run in the Gr.2 Surround Stakes.

"She's a very good fresh horse, especially given her versatility over the longer trips," Lees said of the mare that has placed in an ATC Oaks and Caulfield Cup. [Full story here.](#)
